## Associations of "Relate to" (30 Words)

<b>allied</b>	Related by common characteristics or ancestry. <i>The <b>allied</b> fleet.</i>
<b>appertain</b>	Be appropriate or applicable. <i>The answers generally <b>appertain</b> to improvements in standard of service.</i>
<b>appropriate</b>	Take possession of by force, as after an invasion. <i>This isn't the <b>appropriate</b> time or place.</i>
<b>associate</b>	A person who joins with others in some activity or endeavor. <i>A close <b>associate</b> of the Minister.</i>
<a href="#">bearing</a>	Characteristic way of bearing one's body. <i>She has the <b>bearing</b> of a First Lady.</i>
<b>combine</b>	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>A new product which <b>combines</b> the benefits of a hairspray and a gel.</i>
<b>congruity</b>	The quality of agreeing; being suitable and appropriate.
<b>conjoin</b>	Join; combine. <i>An approach which <b>conjoins</b> theory and method.</i>
<b>connect</b>	Connect fasten or put together two or more pieces. <i>He can't <b>connect</b> with anyone any more.</i>
<b>connection</b>	The action of linking one thing with another. <i>He had <b>connections</b> in the music industry.</i>
<a href="#">correlate</a>	Each of two or more related or complementary things. <i>Do these facts <b>correlate</b>.</i>
<b>correlation</b>	A statistic representing how closely two variables co-vary it can vary from 1 perfect negative correlation through 0 no correlation to 1 perfect positive correlation. <i>There was no <b>correlation</b> between the number of visits to the clinic and the treatment outcome.</i>

<b>correlative</b>	A word or concept that has a mutual relationship with another word or concept. <b>Correlative</b> conjunctions.
<b>factually</b>	As a fact or based on fact. <i>His assertion is <b>factually</b> incorrect.</i>
<b>friendship</b>	The state of being friends (or friendly). <i>Because of the <b>friendship</b> between our countries we had a very frank exchange.</i>
<b>germane</b>	Relevant to a subject under consideration. <i>He asks questions that are <b>germane</b> and central to the issue.</i>
<b>included</b>	Enclosed in the same envelope or package. <i>Service tax <b>included</b>.</i>
<b>interrelationship</b>	Mutual or reciprocal relation or relatedness. <i>The <b>interrelationship</b> between the comprehension and production of early vocabulary.</i>
<b>link</b>	Link with or as with a yoke. <i>A high speed rail <b>link</b> to the Channel Tunnel.</i>
<b>linked</b>	Connected by a link, as railway cars or trailer trucks.
<b>pertain</b>	Be relevant to. <i>My remark <b>pertained</b> to your earlier comments.</i>
<b>pertinence</b>	Relevance by virtue of being applicable to the matter at hand.
<b>pertinent</b>	Having precise or logical relevance to the matter at hand. <i>Practitioners must consider all factors <b>pertinent</b> to a situation.</i>
<b>proper</b>	(of a person) good-looking. <i>He blotted his copybook good and <b>proper</b>.</i>
<b>referent</b>	The first term in a proposition; the term to which other terms relate. <i>The Morning Star and the Evening Star have the same <b>referent</b> the planet Venus.</i>
<b>related</b>	Associated with the specified item or process, especially causally. <i>Sleeping sickness and <b>related</b> diseases.</i>
<b>relation</b>	(usually plural) mutual dealings or connections among persons or groups. <i>Questions about the <b>relation</b> between writing and reality.</i>
<b>relevance</b>	The quality or state of being closely connected or appropriate. <i>The Web does allow us to produce more articles of <b>relevance</b> to our readers.</i>
<b>relevancy</b>	The relation of something to the matter at hand.
