## Synonyms of "Relates" as a verb (15 Words)

<b>associate</b>	Keep company with; hang out with. <i>He began to <b>associate</b> with the Mafia.</i>
<b>bear on</b>	Support or hold in a certain manner.
<b>colligate</b>	Make a logical or causal connection. <i><b>Colligate</b> these facts.</i>
<b>come to</b>	Come to one's mind suggest itself.
<b>concern</b>	Have a specific connection with or responsibility for. <i>The roof of the barn <b>concerns</b> me because eventually it will fall in.</i>
<b>connect</b>	Connect fasten or put together two or more pieces. <i>The brick <b>connected</b> on her head knocking her out.</i>
<b>have to do with</b>	Receive willingly something given or offered.
<b>interrelate</b>	Relate or connect to one another. <i>I cannot <b>interrelate</b> these two events.</i>

<b>link</b>	Create a hyperlink between web pages or hypertext documents. <i>She <b>linked</b> up with an artistic group.</i>
<b>link up</b>	Link with or as with a yoke.
<b>pertain</b>	Be a part or attribute of. <i>Their economic circumstances are vastly different from those which <b>pertained</b> in their land of origin.</i>
<b>refer</b>	Make reference to. <i><b>Refer</b> a patient to a specialist.</i>
<b>tie in</b>	Form a knot or bow in.
<b>touch</b>	Consume or use (food, drink, money, etc). <i>The dog had one paw outstretched not quite <b>touching</b> the ground.</i>
<b>touch on</b>	Comprehend.

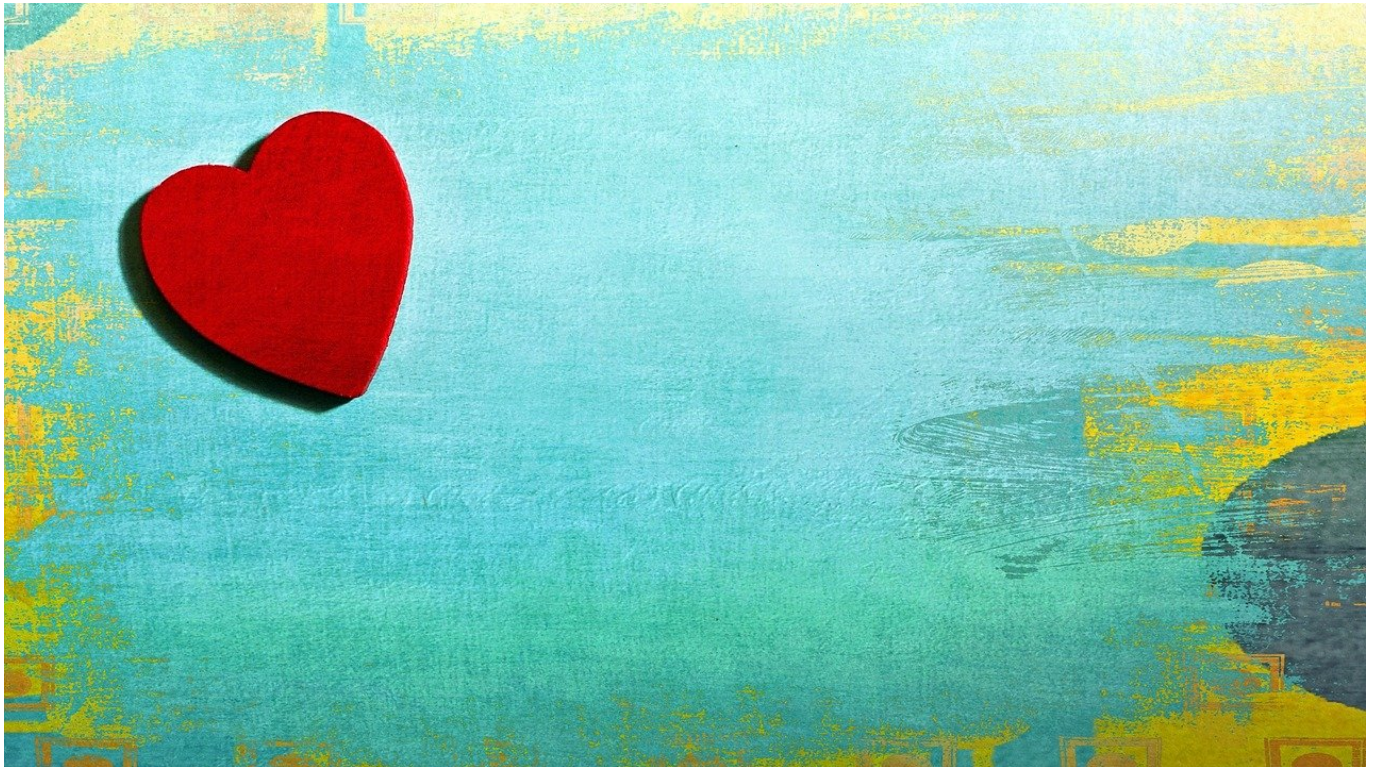


## Usage Examples of "Relates" as a verb

## Associations of "Relates" (30 Words)

**allied**

Related by common characteristics or ancestry.  
*Allied studies.*

**appertain**

Be a part or attribute of.  
*The institutional arrangements which **appertain** under the system.*

**appropriate**

Suitable for a particular person or place or condition etc.  
*It seems that an apology is **appropriate**.*

**associate**

A person who joins with others in some activity or endeavor.  
*A close **associate** of the Minister.*

**bearing**

Characteristic way of bearing one's body.  
*There were no steeples or bridges from which to take a **bearing**.*

**combine**

Combine so as to form a whole mix.  
*A new product which **combines** the benefits of a hairspray and a gel.*

**congruity**

The quality of agreeing; being suitable and appropriate.

<b>conjoin</b>	Join; combine. <i>An approach which <b>conjoins</b> theory and method.</i>
<b>connect</b>	Connect fasten or put together two or more pieces. <i>All the buildings are <b>connected</b> by underground passages.</i>
<b>connection</b>	A supplier (especially of narcotics). <i>The <b>connections</b> between social attitudes and productivity.</i>
<b><u>correlate</u></b>	Establish a mutual relationship or connection between. <i>Do these facts <b>correlate</b>.</i>
<b>correlation</b>	A statistic representing how closely two variables co vary it can vary from 1 perfect negative correlation through 0 no correlation to 1 perfect positive correlation. <i>What is the <b>correlation</b> between those two variables.</i>
<b>correlative</b>	Having a mutual relationship; corresponding. <i>The child s right to education is a <b>correlative</b> of the parent s duty to send the child to school.</i>
<b>factually</b>	With regard to what is actually the case; in relation to fact. <i>His assertion is <b>factually</b> incorrect.</i>
<b><u>friendship</u></b>	The state of being friends (or friendly). <i>This is an ideal group for finding support and <b>friendship</b>.</i>
<b>germane</b>	Relevant and appropriate. <i>He asks questions that are <b>germane</b> and central to the issue.</i>
<b>included</b>	Enclosed in the same envelope or package. <i>All of Europe Britain <b>included</b>.</i>
<b>interrelationship</b>	Mutual or reciprocal relation or relatedness. <i>The <b>interrelationship</b> between the comprehension and production of early vocabulary.</i>
<b><u>link</u></b>	Create a hyperlink between web pages or hypertext documents. <i>Sign language interpreters represent a vital <b>link</b> between the deaf and hearing communities.</i>
<b>linked</b>	Connected by a link, as railway cars or trailer trucks.
<b><u>pertain</u></b>	Be appropriate, related, or applicable to. <i>The shop premises and stock and all assets <b>pertaining</b> to the business.</i>
<b>pertinence</b>	Relevance by virtue of being applicable to the matter at hand.
<b>pertinent</b>	Relevant or applicable to a particular matter; apposite. <i>She asked me a lot of very <b>pertinent</b> questions.</i>

<b>proper</b>	Denoting something that is truly what it is said or regarded to be; genuine. <i>Her parents view of what was <b>proper</b> for a well bred girl.</i>
<b>referent</b>	Something that refers; a term that refers to another term. <i>The Morning Star and the Evening Star have the same <b>referent</b> the planet Venus.</i>
<b>related</b>	Associated with the specified item or process, especially causally. <i>Sleeping sickness and <b>related</b> diseases.</i>
<b>relation</b>	The action of telling a story. <i>He has distant <b>relations</b> back in New Jersey.</i>
<b><u>relevance</u></b>	The relation of something to the matter at hand. <i>This film has contemporary <b>relevance</b>.</i>
<b>relevancy</b>	The relation of something to the matter at hand.
<b>socialize</b>	Prepare for social life. <i>Newcomers are <b>socialized</b> into orthodox ways.</i>
