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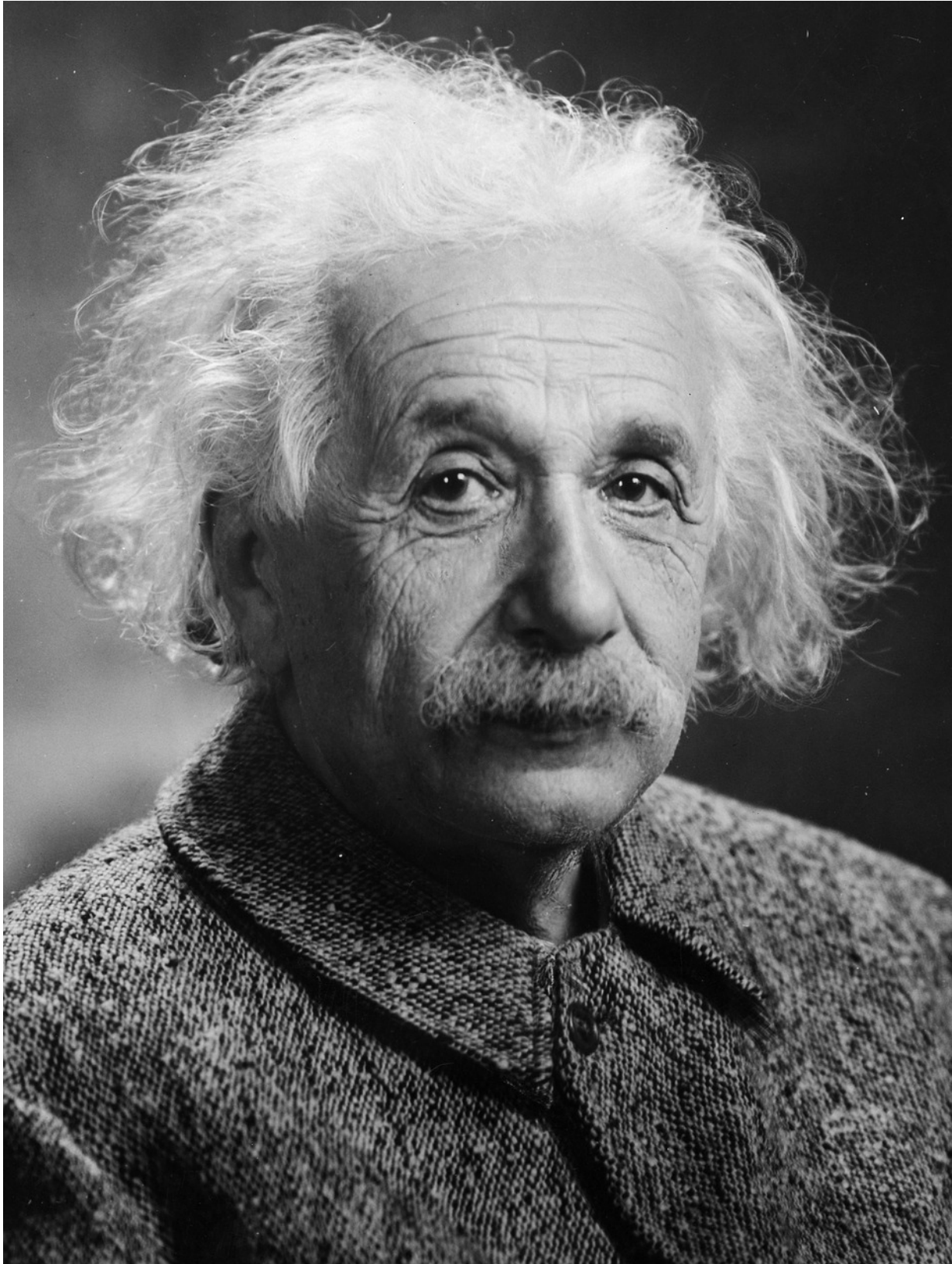

## Relatively as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Relatively" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “relatively” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In relation, comparison, or proportion to something else.*
- *In a relative manner; by comparison to something else.*
- *Regarded in comparison with something else rather than absolutely; quite.*



## Synonyms of "Relatively" as an adverb (14 Words)

<b>a little</b>	Not much.
<b>by comparison</b>	So as to pass a given point.
<b><u>comparatively</u></b>	To a moderate degree as compared to something else; relatively. <i>Inflation was <b>comparatively</b> low.</i>
<b><u>half</u></b>	Partially or to the extent of a half. <i>I am <b>half</b> inclined to believe you.</i>
<b>in comparison</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>in some measure</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b><u>moderately</u></b>	To a moderately sufficient extent or degree. <i>Both hotels are <b>moderately</b> priced.</i>
<b><u>partially</u></b>	In part; in some degree; not wholly. <i>The work <b>partially</b> fulfills the function of a historical memoir.</i>
<b>partly</b>	To some extent; in some degree; not wholly. <i>The result is <b>partly</b> a matter of skill and <b>partly</b> of chance.</i>
<b>proportionately</b>	To a proportionate degree. <i>Your salary will rise <b>proportionately</b> to your workload.</i>
<b><u>somewhat</u></b>	To a moderate extent or by a moderate amount; rather. <i>Matters have improved <b>somewhat</b> since then.</i>
<b>to some degree</b>	Imprecise but fairly close to correct.
<b>to some extent</b>	Imprecise but fairly close to correct.
<b>up to a point</b>	Spatially or metaphorically from a lower to a higher position.



## Usage Examples of "Relatively" as an adverb

- *The situation is relatively calm now.*
- *They were very poor, but, relatively speaking, they had been lucky.*
- *The site was cheap and relatively clean.*



## Associations of "Relatively" (30 Words)

### analogous

Comparable in certain respects, typically in a way which makes clearer the nature of the things compared.

*Salmon roe is marketed as **analogous** to caviar.*

<b>cling</b>	A clingstone peach. <i>You are <b>clinging</b> to him for security.</i>
<b>cohere</b>	(of an argument or theory) be logically consistent. <i>The principles by which societies <b>cohere</b>.</i>
<b>comparatively</b>	In a relative manner; by comparison to something else. <i>Inflation was <b>comparatively</b> low.</i>
<b>compare</b>	Estimate, measure, or note the similarity or dissimilarity between. <i>John <b>compared</b> his haircut to his friend s.</i>
<b>comparison</b>	The formation of the comparative and superlative forms of adjectives and adverbs. <i>They made a <b>comparison</b> of noise levels.</i>
<b>connection</b>	An arrangement or opportunity for catching a connecting train, bus, aircraft, etc. <i><b>Connection</b> to the internet.</i>
<b>contrarily</b>	Contrary to expectations.
<b>contrast</b>	A thing or person having qualities noticeably different from another. <i>The middle school teacher <b>contrasted</b> her best student s work with that of her weakest student.</i>
<b>contrastingly</b>	In a contrasting manner.
<b>corresponding</b>	Similar especially in position or purpose. <i>All rights carry with them <b>corresponding</b> responsibilities.</i>
<b>counterpoint</b>	Write in counterpoint. <i>The cream walls and maple floors are <b>counterpointed</b> by black accents.</i>
<b>differ</b>	Be of different opinions. <i>The second set of data <b>differed</b> from the first.</i>
<b>different</b>	Distinct or separate. <i>This new music is certainly <b>different</b> but I don t really like it.</i>
<b>differently</b>	In varied ways; diversely. <i>We work <b>differently</b> from other developers.</i>
<b>distinction</b>	Excellence that sets someone or something apart from others. <i>She gained a <b>distinction</b> in her diploma.</i>
<b>equate</b>	Make equal, uniform, corresponding, or matching. <i>That sum <b>equates</b> to half a million pounds today.</i>
<b>invidious</b>	(of an action or situation) likely to arouse or incur resentment or anger in others. <i><b>Invidious</b> comparisons.</i>

<b>liken</b>	Consider or describe as similar, equal, or analogous. <i>Racism is <b>likened</b> to a contagious disease.</i>
<b>likeness</b>	Similarity in appearance or character or nature between persons or things. <i>Her <b>likeness</b> to him was astonishing.</i>
<a href="#"><u>link</u></a>	Be or become joined or united or linked. <i>Sign language interpreters represent a vital <b>link</b> between the deaf and hearing communities.</i>
<b>linked</b>	Connected by a link, as railway cars or trailer trucks.
<b>related</b>	Associated with the specified item or process, especially causally. <i>Painting and the <b>related</b> arts.</i>
<b>relation</b>	The way in which two or more people or groups feel about and behave towards each other. <i>He has distant <b>relations</b> back in New Jersey.</i>
<a href="#"><u>relative</u></a>	A relative pronoun determiner or adverb. <i>The firms are <b>relative</b> newcomers to computers.</i>
<b>similar</b>	Resembling or similar having the same or some of the same characteristics often used in combination. <i>The principle of treatment by <b>similar</b>s.</i>
<b>similitude</b>	Similarity in appearance or character or nature between persons or things. <i>Conrad uses a range of constructions which express or imply <b>similitude</b>.</i>
<b>twofold</b>	Having more than one decidedly dissimilar aspects or qualities. <i>A <b>twofold</b> increase in the risk.</i>
<a href="#"><u>unfavorable</u></a>	Involving or creating circumstances detrimental to success or effectiveness. <i>Made an <b>unfavorable</b> impression.</i>
<a href="#"><u>unlike</u></a>	Not like; different from. <i>He was very <b>unlike</b> to any other man.</i>
