Associations of "Relevance" (30 Words)

acknowledgement	A letter confirming receipt of something. <i>There was no acknowledgement of the family's trauma.</i>
<u>affordable</u>	Inexpensive; reasonably priced. <i>Affordable homes.</i>
applicable	Capable of being applied; having relevance. <i>The same considerations are equally applicable to accident claims.</i>

<u>apposite</u>	Apt in the circumstances or in relation to something. <i>The observations are apposite to the discussion.</i>
appropriate	Take possession of by force, as after an invasion. <i>The accused had appropriated the property.</i>
<u>apropos</u>	Introducing a different topic. <i>Your letter arrived apropos.</i>
<u>apt</u>	Appropriate or suitable in the circumstances. <i>An apt pupil.</i>
<u>bearing</u>	Characteristic way of bearing one's body. <i>The Point is on a bearing of 015.</i>
befitting	Appropriate to. <i>Behavior befitting a father.</i>
blandness	The quality of being bland and gracious or ingratiating in manner. <i>The blandness of his confession enraged the judge.</i>
congruous	Suitable or appropriate together. <i>This explanation is congruous with earlier observations.</i>
connection	A connecting shape. <i>The plane was late and he missed his connection in Atlanta.</i>
correct	Make right or correct. <i>Correct behavior.</i>
<u>corrective</u>	A device for treating injury or disease. <i>Management were informed so that corrective action could be taken.</i>
dovetail	Fit together tightly as if by means of a dovetail. <i>Plan to enable parents to dovetail their career and family commitments.</i>
<u>equally</u>	In amounts or parts that are the same in size. <i>Follow up discussion is equally important.</i>
factually	As a fact or based on fact. <i>The evidence is legally and factually insufficient.</i>
felicitous	Well chosen or suited to the circumstances. <i>A felicitous speaker.</i>
germane	Relevant to a subject under consideration. <i>He asks questions that are germane and central to the issue.</i>
<u>opportune</u>	Done or occurring at a favourable time; well timed. <i>An opportune arrival.</i>
pertinence	Relevance by virtue of being applicable to the matter at hand.

pertinent	Having precise or logical relevance to the matter at hand. <i>Practitioners must consider all factors pertinent to a situation.</i>
proper	Appropriate for a condition or purpose or occasion or a person's character, needs. <i>After this event three countries will progress to the World Cup proper.</i>
<u>relate</u>	Be relevant to. <i>People who are distantly related.</i>
related	Associated with the specified item or process, especially causally. <i>Painting and the related arts.</i>
relevancy	The relation of something to the matter at hand.
<u>relevant</u>	Appropriate to the current time, period, or circumstances; of contemporary interest. <i>Her films are relevant for feminists today.</i>
seemly	Conforming to accepted notions of propriety or good taste; decorous. <i>I felt it was not seemly to observe too closely.</i>
suit	Slang a businessman dressed in a business suit. <i>What time would suit you.</i>
<u>suitable</u>	Meant or adapted for an occasion or use. <i>These toys are not suitable for children under five.</i>
