
### Reliance as a Noun

**dependency** A geographical area politically controlled by a distant country.

The country s **dependency** on the oil industry.

**faith in** A strong belief in a supernatural power or powers that control human

destiny.

They have been able to win the **trust** of the others.


**trust in** Complete confidence in a person or plan etc.

forbear Resist doing something.

**fortitude** Courage in pain or adversity.

She endured her illness with great **fortitude**.

**indomitable** Impossible to subdue or defeat. *A woman of indomitable spirit.* 

A woman oj **maomitable** Spirit.

**obstinacy** Resolute adherence to your own ideas or desires.

His reputation for **obstinacy**.

**obstinate** Stubbornly persistent in wrongdoing.

The **obstinate** problem of unemployment.

The capacity to accept or tolerate delay, problems, or suffering without

becoming annoyed or anxious.

**patience**You can find bargains if you have the **patience** to sift through the

rubbish.

**perseverance** Persistent determination.

His **perseverance** with the technique illustrates his single mindedness.

Continue in a course of action even in the face of difficulty or with little

**persevere** or no indication of success.

His family **persevere**d with his treatment.

persistence Persistent determination.

Cardiff s **persistence** was rewarded with a try.

**pertinacity** Persistent determination.

reliant Dependent on someone or something.

The company is heavily **reliant** on the baby market.

Have confidence or faith in.

resourcefulness The ability to deal resourcefully with unusual problems.

The quality or fact of continuing to exist; persistence. **tenacity**
