- Stay the same; remain in a certain state.
- Continue in a place, position, or situation.
- Stay behind.
- Be left over or outstanding after others or other parts have been completed, used, or dealt with.
- Continue to exist, especially after other similar people or things have ceased to do so.
- Be left; of persons, questions, problems, results, evidence, etc.
- Continue to possess a particular quality or fulfil a particular role.
- Stay in the place that one has been occupying.
