Definitions of "Replica" as a noun

- *An exact copy or model of something, especially one on a smaller scale.*
- *A duplicate of an original artistic work.*
- *Copy that is not the original; something that has been copied.*



Synonyms of "Replica" as a noun (14 Words)

clone	An organism or cell, or group of organisms or cells, produced asexually from one ancestor or stock, to which they are genetically identical. <i>Guitarists who are labelled Hendrix clones.</i>
copy	A thing made to be similar or identical to another thing. <i>Copy for the next issue must be submitted by the beginning of the month.</i>
double	A double measure of spirits. <i>She had seen her husband s double.</i>
<u>duplicate</u>	A copy of an original. <i>He made a duplicate for the files.</i>
<u>image</u>	A standard or typical example. <i>Her work juxtaposed images from serious and popular art.</i>
living image	The experience of being alive; the course of human events and activities.

lookalike	A person or thing that closely resembles another, especially someone who looks very similar to a famous person. <i>An Elvis Presley lookalike.</i>
mirror image	Polished surface that forms images by reflecting light.
model	Representation of something (sometimes on a smaller scale). <i>The computer program was based on a model of the circulatory and respiratory systems.</i>
perfect likeness	A tense of verbs used in describing action that has been completed (sometimes regarded as perfective aspect).
picture	Illustrations used to decorate or explain a text. <i>He described his mental picture of his assailant.</i>
replication	A pleading made by a plaintiff in reply to the defendant's plea or answer. <i>On its own replication does not validate a theory derived from experimental results.</i>
<u>reproduction</u>	The production of offspring by a sexual or asexual process. <i>Gutenberg's reproduction of holy texts was far more efficient.</i>
<u>twin</u>	A twin engined aircraft. <i>The twins were approaching their third birthday.</i>



Usage Examples of "Replica" as a noun

- *It is a replica of an antique plaque.*
- *A replica of the Empire State Building.*



Associations of "Replica" (30 Words)

copy	Reproduce or make an exact copy of. <i>The problem is telling which is the original document and which the copy.</i>
<u>duplicate</u>	Make a duplicate or duplicates of. <i>Books may be disposed of if they are duplicates.</i>
<u>emulate</u>	Imitate the function of (another system), as by modifying the hardware or the software. <i>Hers is not a hairstyle I wish to emulate.</i>
emulation	Ambition to equal or excel. <i>Software emulation of complete systems.</i>
facsimile	Send something via a facsimile machine. <i>A facsimile of the manuscript.</i>
fax	Contact someone by fax. <i>The equipment consists of four word processors a fax and a photocopier.</i>
imitate	Appear like, as in behavior or appearance. <i>Life imitate art.</i>

<u>imitation</u>	The doctrine that representations of nature or human behavior should be accurate imitations. <i>A child learns to speak by imitation.</i>
imitator	Someone who (fraudulently) assumes the appearance of another. <i>The show's success has sparked off many imitators.</i>
likeness	Picture consisting of a graphic image of a person or thing. <i>Her likeness to him was astonishing.</i>
<u>microcosm</u>	A miniature model of something. <i>The city is a microcosm of modern Malaysia.</i>
mimesis	Imitative representation of the real world in art and literature. <i>Barth has always detached his use of plot from mimesis.</i>
mimetic	Exhibiting mimicry. <i>The mimetic tendency of infancy.</i>
<u>mimic</u>	An animal or plant that mimics another. <i>Tiger beetles are mimicked by grasshoppers.</i>
pastiche	An artistic work consisting of a medley of pieces imitating various sources. <i>Gauguin took himself to a Pacific island and pastiched the primitive art he found there.</i>
photocopy	Make a photocopy of. <i>You can photocopy the entry form.</i>
plagiarism	The act of plagiarizing; taking someone's words or ideas as if they were your own. <i>There were accusations of plagiarism.</i>
plagiarize	Take without referencing from someone else's writing or speech; of intellectual property. <i>The author claims she was plagiarized.</i>
pretender	A person who professes beliefs and opinions that he or she does not hold in order to conceal his or her real feelings or motives. <i>The pretender to the throne.</i>
pseudo	Not genuine; spurious or sham. <i>We are talking about real journalists and not the pseudo kind.</i>
<u>replicate</u>	(of genetic material or a living organism) reproduce or give rise to a copy of itself. <i>In order to replicate cells must make copies of their DNA.</i>
replication	(genetics) the process whereby DNA makes a copy of itself before cell division. <i>On its own replication does not validate a theory derived from experimental results.</i>

reproduce	Produce a copy of. <i>An individual needs to avoid being eaten until it has reproduced.</i>
reproducible	Able to be reproduced or copied. <i>The logo should be easily reproducible.</i>
resemble	Have a similar appearance to or qualities in common with (someone or something); look or seem like. <i>This paper resembles my own work.</i>
sample	Take a sample or samples of something for analysis. <i>A urine sample.</i>
simulate	Create a representation or model of. <i>Future population changes were simulated by computer.</i>
sized	Having the surface treated or coated with sizing. <i>A grapefruit sized lump.</i>
triplicate	Existing in three copies or examples. <i>Triplicate the letter for the committee.</i>
visualization	The formation of a mental image of something. <i>The story uses descriptive language to aid visualization.</i>
