- Make or do or perform again.

retroflex

Produce something very similar to (something else) in a different

medium or context.

reproduce Bacteria normally divide and **reproduce** themselves every twenty

minutes.

Articulate (a consonant) with the tongue curled back against the palate.

*Indian accents can be characterized by the fact that speakers* **retroflex** 

their consonants.
