### Definitions of "Reproduction" as a noun

- *The production of offspring by a sexual or asexual process.*
- *Made to imitate the style of an earlier period or of a particular craftsman.*
- *The action or process of copying something.*
- *The process of generating offspring.*
- *Recall that is hypothesized to work by storing the original stimulus input and reproducing it during recall.*
- *The act of making copies.*
- *A copy of a work of art, especially a print or photograph of a painting.*
- *Copy that is not the original; something that has been copied.*
- *The quality of reproduced sound.*
- *The sexual activity of conceiving and bearing offspring.*



## Synonyms of "Reproduction" as a noun (18 Words)

<b>breeding</b>	The production of animals or plants by inbreeding or hybridization. <i>The flooding of the rivers is a trigger for <b>breeding</b> to start.</i>
<b>carbon copy</b>	A copy made with carbon paper.
<b>copy</b>	A thing made to be similar or identical to another. <i>Catastrophes make good <b>copy</b>.</i>
<b>copying</b>	An act of copying.
<b>duplicate</b>	A copy that corresponds to an original exactly. <i>He made a <b>duplicate</b> for the files.</i>
<b>duplicating</b>	A copy that corresponds to an original exactly.
<b>duplication</b>	A copy that corresponds to an original exactly. <i>This kind of <b>duplication</b> is wasteful.</i>
<b>facsimile</b>	An exact copy, especially of written or printed material. <i>A <b>facsimile</b> of the manuscript.</i>
<b>facts of life</b>	An event known to have happened or something known to have existed.

<b>print</b>	A picture or design printed from a block or plate or copied from a painting by photography. <i>Light summer <b>prints</b>.</i>
<b>procreation</b>	The sexual activity of conceiving and bearing offspring. <i>In general animals copulate purely for the purpose of <b>procreation</b>.</i>
<b>producing young</b>	Fresh fruits and vegetable grown for the market.
<b><u>proliferation</u></b>	A rapid increase in number (especially a rapid increase in the number of deadly weapons). <i>The <b>proliferation</b> of nuclear weapons.</i>
<b>propagation</b>	The breeding of specimens of a plant or animal by natural processes from the parent stock. <i>The <b>propagation</b> of plants by root cuttings.</i>
<b><u>replica</u></b>	A duplicate of an original artistic work. <i>It is a <b>replica</b> of an antique plaque.</i>
<b>replication</b>	The process by which genetic material or a living organism gives rise to a copy of itself. <i>A crucial step in cold virus <b>replications</b>.</i>
<b>reprint</b>	A publication such as a book that is reprinted without changes or editing and offered again for sale. <i>The publishers had nearly sold out of the initial run of copies and ordered a <b>reprint</b>.</i>
<b>spawning</b>	The mass of eggs deposited by fish or amphibians or molluscs.

<b>baby</b>	Treat someone as a baby pamper or be overprotective towards. <i>The <b>baby</b> of the Supreme Court.</i>
<b>breed</b>	Produce or lead to (something) over a period of time. <i>She <b>breeds</b> dogs.</i>
<b>breeding</b>	The production of animals or plants by inbreeding or hybridization. <i>The <b>breeding</b> population.</i>
<b>calve</b>	Release ice. <i>The whales <b>calve</b> at this time of year.</i>
<b>dairy</b>	A farm where dairy products are produced. <i>Local <b>dairy</b> foods.</i>
<b>existence</b>	A way of living. <i>A person may be reaping the consequences of evil deeds sown in previous <b>existences</b>.</i>

<b>feeding</b>	The act of consuming food.
<b>fetus</b>	An unborn or unhatched vertebrate in the later stages of development showing the main recognizable features of the mature animal.
<b>floral</b>	A fabric with a floral design. <i><b>Floral</b> tributes.</i>
<b>foster</b>	Bring up under fosterage of children. <i><b>Foster</b> home.</i>
<b>frond</b>	Compound leaf of a fern or palm or cycad. <i><b>Fron</b>s of bracken.</i>
<b>gentility</b>	Elegance by virtue of fineness of manner and expression. <i>Her grandmother s pretensions to <b>gentility</b>.</i>
<b>growth</b>	Vegetation that has grown. <i>The <b>growth</b> of culture.</i>
<b>housework</b>	The work of cleaning and running a house. <i>I was busy doing <b>housework</b> when the doorbell rang.</i>
<b>increasing</b>	Music increasing in tempo and or volume. <i>The <b>increasing</b> numbers of students.</i>
<b>infant</b>	A schoolchild between the ages of about four and eight. <i>Healthy <b>infants</b>.</i>
<b>lad</b>	A boy or young man (often as a form of address). <i>Tony was a bit of a <b>lad</b> always had an eye for the women.</i>
<b>nurture</b>	Care for and protect (someone or something) while they are growing. <i>They debated whether nature or <b>nurture</b> was more important.</i>
<b>raise</b>	Raise from a lower to a higher position. <i>The rabbit was only 250 yards from where he first <b>raised</b> it.</i>
<b>raising</b>	Increasing in quantity or value. <i>A <b>raising</b> of the land resulting from volcanic activity.</i>
<b>rearing</b>	Rearing on left hind leg with forelegs elevated and head usually in profile.
<b>reproductive</b>	Producing new life or offspring. <i>The <b>reproductive</b> or generative organs.</i>
<b>stunted</b>	Inferior in size or quality. <i>The trees exhibit a <b>stunted</b> appearance.</i>
<b>suckle</b>	Suck milk from the mother's breasts. <i>The infant s biological need to <b>suckle</b>.</i>
<b>survival</b>	Something that survives. <i>He was fighting for his political <b>survival</b>.</i>



- teen** Relating to teenagers.  
*They were both in their late **teens**.*
- teenager** A person aged between 13 and 19 years.
- upbringing** Helping someone grow up to be an accepted member of the community.  
*She had had a Christian **upbringing**.*
- vegetal** Relating to that pole of the ovum or embryo that contains the less active cytoplasm, and frequently most of the yolk, in the early stages of development.  
***Vegetal** cells.*
- vegetative** Composed of vegetation or plants.  
*Environmental factors trigger the switch from **vegetative** to floral development.*
