
Republic as a Noun

Definitions of "Republic" as a noun

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "republic" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A group with a certain equality between its members.
- A political system in which the supreme power lies in a body of citizens who can elect people to represent them.
- A form of government whose head of state is not a monarch.
- A state in which supreme power is held by the people and their elected representatives, and which has an elected or nominated president rather than a monarch.
