prearranged	Arranged or agreed upon in advance. Did she have a prearranged meeting.	
<u>private</u>	Concerning things deeply private and personal. Secret or private thoughts.	
quiet	(of a place, period of time, or situation) without much activity, disturbance, or excitement. All he wanted was a quiet drink.	
restrained	(of colour, decoration, etc.) not excessively showy or ornate; understated. <i>The drawings with their</i> restrained <i>colours give a feeling of peace and contemplation.</i>	
<u>reticent</u>	Cool and formal in manner. She was extremely reticent about her personal affairs.	
self-contained In full control of your faculties.

The child was taken ill.



Usage Examples of "Reserved" as an adjective

Associations of "Reserved" (30 Words)

aloof	In an aloof manner. Stood apart with aloof dignity.
bashful	Disposed to avoid notice blate is a Scottish term for bashful. I never laughed being bashful lowering my head I looked at the wall.
cagey	Characterized by great caution and wariness. A cagey avoidance of a definite answer.
<u>coy</u>	Showing marked and often playful or irritating evasiveness or reluctance to make a definite or committing statement. <i>She treated him to a coy smile of invitation.</i>
demure	Affectedly modest or shy especially in a playful or provocative way. Antonia was pensive and demure .
diffident	Showing modest reserve. A diffident youth.



eschew	Deliberately avoid using; abstain from. <i>He appealed to the crowd to eschew violence.</i>
fainthearted	Lacking conviction or boldness or courage.
<u>introspective</u>	Given to examining own sensory and perceptual experiences. <i>He grew withdrawn and introspective</i> .
introversion	The quality of being shy and reticent. The tongue tied introversion of the self conscious artist.
<u>introvert</u>	A person who tends to shrink from social contacts and to become preoccupied with their own thoughts. <i>He</i> introvert ed his feelings.
introverted	(of a community, company, or other group) concerned principally with its own affairs; inward-looking or parochial.
modesty	The quality of being relatively moderate, limited, or small in amount, rate, or level. Modesty forbade her to undress in front of so many people.
<u>passive</u>	A passive form of a verb. The ball was thrown by the boy uses the passive voice.
passivity	Acceptance of what happens, without active response or resistance. The perceived passivity of the populace is deceptive.
<u>reclusive</u>	Withdrawn from society; seeking solitude. <i>Lived an unsocial reclusive life.</i>
restrained	Prudent. His restrained gentlemanly voice.
<u>reticent</u>	Cool and formal in manner. She was extremely reticent about her personal affairs.
retiring	Shy and fond of being on one's own. A shy retiring girl.
shy	Having a dislike of or aversion to a specified thing. He gave the ball a shy to the first baseman.
<u>silent</u>	Saying or recording nothing on a particular subject. I m the strong silent type.
<u>taciturn</u>	(of a person) reserved or uncommunicative in speech; saying little. <i>After such gatherings she would be taciturn and morose.</i>
<u>timid</u>	Showing fear and lack of confidence. I was too timid to ask for what I wanted.
timorous	Showing or suffering from nervousness or a lack of confidence. <i>Timorous little mouse.</i>



unassertive	(of a person) not having or showing a confident and forceful personality. His bland and unassertive personal style.
uncommunicative	Unwilling to talk or impart information. <i>He had always been quiet and uncommunicative having few friends.</i>
<u>unfriendly</u>	Not friendly. She shot him an unfriendly glance.
upstage	Move upstage forcing the other actors to turn away from the audience. When the dog entered the stage he upstage d the actress.
withdrawn	Withdrawn from society seeking solitude. When her husband died she became very withdrawn .
within	Inside; indoors. Beauty coming from within .
