

aloof In an aloof manner.

COY

Stood apart with **aloof** dignity.

**bashful** Disposed to avoid notice blate is a Scottish term for bashful.

I never laughed being **bashful** lowering my head I looked at the wall.

Characterized by great caution and wariness.

A cagey avoidance of a definite answer.

Showing marked and often playful or irritating evasiveness or

reluctance to make a definite or committing statement.

*She treated him to a coy smile of invitation.* 

**demure** Affectedly modest or shy especially in a playful or provocative way.

Antonia was pensive and demure.

diffident Showing modest reserve.

A diffident youth.



**eschew** Deliberately avoid using; abstain from.

He appealed to the crowd to **eschew** violence.

**fainthearted** Lacking conviction or boldness or courage.

introspective Given to examining own sensory and perceptual experiences.

He grew withdrawn and **introspective**.

**introversion**The quality of being shy and reticent.

The tongue tied **introversion** of the self conscious artist.

A person who tends to shrink from social contacts and to become

**introvert** preoccupied with their own thoughts.

He **introvert**ed his feelings.

introverted (of a community, company, or other group) concerned principally with

its own affairs; inward-looking or parochial.

The quality of being relatively moderate, limited, or small in amount,

**modesty** rate, or level.

**Modesty** forbade her to undress in front of so many people.

A passive form of a verb.

The ball was thrown by the boy uses the **passive** voice.

Acceptance of what happens, without active response or resistance.

The perceived **passivity** of the populace is deceptive.

Withdrawn from society; seeking solitude.

reclusive

Lived an unsocial reclusive life.

restrained Prudent.

His **restrained** gentlemanly voice.

reticent Cool and formal in manner.

She was extremely **reticent** about her personal affairs.

retiring Shy and fond of being on one's own.

A shy **retiring** girl.

**shy** Having a dislike of or aversion to a specified thing.

He gave the ball a **shy** to the first baseman.

silent Saying or recording nothing on a particular subject.

*I m the strong silent type.* 

tacitum (of a person) reserved or uncommunicative in speech; saying little.

After such gatherings she would be **taciturn** and morose.

timid Showing fear and lack of confidence.

I was too **timid** to ask for what I wanted.

Showing or suffering from nervousness or a lack of confidence.

**Timorous** little mouse.



(of a person) not having or showing a confident and forceful

**unassertive** personality.

His bland and **unassertive** personal style.

**uncommunicative** Unwilling to talk or impart information.

He had always been quiet and **uncommunicative** having few friends.

unfriendly Not friendly.

She shot him an **unfriendly** glance.

**upstage**Move upstage forcing the other actors to turn away from the audience.

When the descentaged the stage he unstaged the actress.

When the dog entered the stage he **upstage**d the actress.

withdrawn Withdrawn from society seeking solitude.

When her husband died she became very withdrawn.

within Inside; indoors.

Beauty coming from **within**.
