<b>domicile</b>	Make one's home in a particular place or community. <i>The tenant is <b>domiciled</b> in the United Kingdom.</i>
<b>domiciliate</b>	Make one's home in a particular place or community.
<b>have established oneself in</b>	Be confronted with.
<b>have one's home in</b>	Cause to do; cause to act in a specified manner.
<b>have taken up residence in</b>	Cause to move; cause to be in a certain position or condition.
<b><u>inhabit</u></b>	Inhabit or live in be an inhabitant of. <i>Strange notions <b>inhabited</b> her mind.</i>
<b>lie</b>	(of an action, charge, or claim) be admissible or sustainable. <i>Don't <b>lie</b> to your parents.</i>
<b>live in</b>	Inhabit or live in be an inhabitant of.
<b>lodge in</b>	Be a lodger; stay temporarily.
<b><u>occupy</u></b>	Fill or preoccupy the mind. <i>The young prince will soon <b>occupy</b> the throne.</i>
<b>repose</b>	Be situated or kept in a particular place. <i>The nation <b>reposed</b> its confidence in the King.</i>
<b><u>rest</u></b>	Not move be in a resting position. <i>I'm going to <b>rest</b> up before travelling to England.</i>
<b>shack</b>	Make one's home in a particular place or community. <i>They won't believe I've <b>shacked</b> up with someone so good looking.</i>

- citizen** A legally recognized subject or national of a state or commonwealth, either native or naturalized.  
*The good **citizens** of Edinburgh.*
- county** Relating to or characteristic of aristocratic people with an ancestral home in a particular county.

<b>domicile</b>	The residence where you have your permanent home or principal establishment and to where whenever you are absent you intend to return every person is compelled to have one and only one domicile at a time. <i>His wife has a <b>domicile</b> of origin in Germany.</i>
<u><b> dwell</b></u>	Come back to. <i>Groups of people still <b>dwell</b> in these caves.</i>
<b>dweller</b>	A person or animal that lives in or at a specified place. <i>The majority of urban <b>dwellers</b> live in small apartments.</i>
<u><b> dwelling</b></u>	Housing that someone is living in. <i>The proposed <b>dwelling</b> is out of keeping with those nearby.</i>
<b>habitable</b>	Suitable or good enough to live in. <i>The <b>habitable</b> world.</i>
<b>habitant</b>	An inhabitant. <i>The <b>habitant</b> farmhouses of old Quebec.</i>
<u><b> habitat</b></u>	The natural home or environment of an animal, plant, or other organism. <i>A marine <b>habitat</b>.</i>
<b>habitation</b>	Housing that someone is living in. <i>Signs of human <b>habitation</b>.</i>
<b>home</b>	Provide with or send to a home. <i>We need to stimulate demand within the UK <b>home</b> market.</i>
<u><b> inhabit</b></u>	Be an inhabitant of or reside in. <i>A bird that <b>inhabits</b> North America.</i>
<b>inhabitant</b>	A person who fulfils the residential or legal requirements for being a member of a state or parish.
<u><b> lifelong</b></u>	Lasting or remaining in a particular state throughout a person's life. <i>A <b>lifelong</b> Conservative.</i>
<b>live</b>	Have life be alive. <i>A <b>live</b> issue.</i>
<u><b> living</b></u>	The condition of living or the state of being alive. <i>Carved into the <b>living</b> stone.</i>
<u><b> mansion</b></u>	A terrace or mansion block. <i>Carlyle <b>Mansions</b>.</i>
<b>municipal</b>	Of or relating to the government of a municipality J L kuntz. <i><b>Municipal</b> offices.</i>
