be conferred on	Have life, be alive.
be entrusted to	Spend or use time.
be found	Have life, be alive.
be in the hands of	To remain unmolested, undisturbed, or uninterrupted — used only in infinitive form.
be inherent in	Be identical to; be someone or something.
be intrinsic to	Have an existence, be extant.
be located	Have life, be alive.
be placed	Spend or use time.
be present in	Have life, be alive.

be settled in	Work in a specific place, with a specific subject, or in a specific function.
be situated	Be priced at.
be vested in	Happen, occur, take place.
belong to	Be owned by; be in the possession of.
domicile	Make one's home in a particular place or community. <i>The tenant is domiciled in the United Kingdom.</i>
domiciliate	Make one's home in a particular place or community.
have established oneself in	Be confronted with.
have one's home in	Cause to do; cause to act in a specified manner.
have taken up residence in	Cause to move; cause to be in a certain position or condition.
<u>inhabit</u>	Inhabit or live in be an inhabitant of. <i>Strange notions inhabited her mind.</i>
lie	(of an action, charge, or claim) be admissible or sustainable. <i>Don't lie to your parents.</i>
live in	Inhabit or live in be an inhabitant of.
lodge in	Be a lodger; stay temporarily.
<u>occupy</u>	Fill or preoccupy the mind. <i>The young prince will soon occupy the throne.</i>
repose	Be situated or kept in a particular place. <i>The nation reposed its confidence in the King.</i>
<u>rest</u>	Not move be in a resting position. <i>I'm going to rest up before travelling to England.</i>
shack	Make one's home in a particular place or community. <i>They won't believe I've shacked up with someone so good looking.</i>



Usage Examples of "Reside" as a verb

- *My parents reside in Florida.*
- *Legislative powers reside with the Federal Assembly.*
- *The meaning of an utterance does not wholly reside in the semantic meaning.*
- *People who work in the city actually reside in neighbouring towns.*
- *She resides in Princeton.*
- *The paintings now reside on the walls of a restaurant.*

- abide** Accept or act in accordance with (a rule, decision, or recommendation).
*I said I would **abide** by their decision.*
- abode** A place of residence; a house or home.
*My humble **abode**.*
- bide** Remain or stay somewhere.
*How long must I **bide** here to wait for the answer.*
- citizen** A legally recognized subject or national of a state or commonwealth, either native or naturalized.
*The good **citizens** of Edinburgh.*
- county** Relating to or characteristic of aristocratic people with an ancestral home in a particular county.
*A **county** grande dame.*

denizen	A plant or animal naturalized in a region. <i>Denizens of field and forest.</i>
domicile	The residence where you have your permanent home or principal establishment and to where whenever you are absent you intend to return every person is compelled to have one and only one domicile at a time. <i>His wife has a domicile of origin in Germany.</i>
<u> dwell </u>	Come back to. <i>Groups of people still dwell in these caves.</i>
dweller	A person or animal that lives in or at a specified place. <i>The majority of urban dwellers live in small apartments.</i>
<u> dwelling </u>	Housing that someone is living in. <i>The proposed dwelling is out of keeping with those nearby.</i>
habitable	Suitable or good enough to live in. <i>The habitable world.</i>
habitant	An inhabitant. <i>The habitant farmhouses of old Quebec.</i>
<u> habitat </u>	The natural home or environment of an animal, plant, or other organism. <i>A marine habitat.</i>
habitation	Housing that someone is living in. <i>Signs of human habitation.</i>
home	Provide with or send to a home. <i>We need to stimulate demand within the UK home market.</i>
<u> inhabit </u>	Be an inhabitant of or reside in. <i>A bird that inhabits North America.</i>
inhabitant	A person who fulfils the residential or legal requirements for being a member of a state or parish.
<u> lifelong </u>	Lasting or remaining in a particular state throughout a person's life. <i>A lifelong Conservative.</i>
live	Have life be alive. <i>A live issue.</i>
<u> living </u>	The condition of living or the state of being alive. <i>Carved into the living stone.</i>
<u> mansion </u>	A terrace or mansion block. <i>Carlyle Mansions.</i>
municipal	Of or relating to the government of a municipality J L kuntz. <i>Municipal offices.</i>

neighborhood	The approximate amount of something (usually used prepositionally as in ` in the region of. <i>My neighborhood voted for Bush.</i>
occupy	Fill or preoccupy the mind. <i>The young prince will soon occupy the throne.</i>
populate	Form the population of (a place). <i>The film is an epic fantasy populated by grotesque weirdos.</i>
population	All the inhabitants of a particular place. <i>The island has a population of about 78 000.</i>
resident	A bird, butterfly, or other animal of a species that does not migrate. <i>It was a beautiful hamlet with just 100 residents.</i>
roommate	An associate who shares a room with you.
stay	Stay put in a certain place. <i>We are staying in Detroit we are not moving to Cincinnati.</i>
township	A small town or village forming part of a large parish. <i>Township theatre.</i>
