Resilient as an Adjective

Definitions of "Resilient" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "resilient" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Recovering readily from adversity, depression, or the like.
- *Elastic; rebounds readily.*
- (of a substance or object) able to recoil or spring back into shape after bending, stretching, or being compressed.
- (of a person or animal) able to withstand or recover quickly from difficult conditions.





Synonyms of "Resilient" as an adjective (14 Words)

<u>bouncy</u>	(of a person) confident and lively. <i>Bouncy</i> tunes.
elastic	Capable of resuming original shape after stretching or compression; springy. <i>An elastic clause in a contract</i> .
<u>flexible</u>	Capable of being changed. Small businesses which are dependent on flexible working hours.
hardy	Having rugged physical strength; inured to fatigue or hardships. <i>Camels are tough and hardy creatures.</i>
live	Actually being performed at the time of hearing or viewing. A live ly tennis ball.
lively	(of a boat) rising lightly to the waves. A lively and uninhibited girl.
<u>plastic</u>	Made of plastic. The writer is drawn to words as a plastic medium.



<u>pliable</u>	Susceptible to being led or directed. <i>Quality leather is pliable and will not crack.</i>
pliant	Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out. A pliant nature.
rubbery	Having a tough elastic texture, like that of rubber. His rubbery legs and arms splayed almost out of control.
springy	(of movements) light and confident. He walked away with a springy step.
strong	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. <i>Strong lager.</i>
<u>supple</u>	(used of persons' bodies) capable of moving or bending freely. <i>My mind is becoming more</i> supple .
<u>tough</u>	Physically toughened. We have six tough matches in a row.






Usage Examples of "Resilient" as an adjective

- As resilient as seasoned hickory.
- Babies are generally far more resilient than new parents realize.





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Associations of "Resilient" (30 Words)

adaptable	Able to adjust to new conditions. <i>Rats are highly adaptable to change.</i>
<u>adjustable</u>	Capable of being changed so as to match or fit. <i>Adjustable seat belts.</i>
bouncy	Bouncing or causing things to bounce. Bouncy 1960s tunes.
bumper	A horizontal bar fixed across the front or back of a motor vehicle to reduce damage in a collision. <i>A bumper crop.</i>
distensible	Capable of being distended; able to stretch and expand. <i>The stomach is a distensible organ.</i>
distension	Swelling, especially in part of the body, caused by pressure from inside. She complained of abdominal distension after meals.
ductile	(of a metal) able to be drawn out into a thin wire. <i>Ductile</i> copper.
ductility	The malleability of something that can be drawn into threads or wires or hammered into thin sheets.
elastic	A fabric made of yarns containing an elastic material. An elastic band.
elasticity	The ability of an object or material to resume its normal shape after being stretched or compressed; stretchiness. <i>Aging can decrease the elasticity of your skin.</i>
flexibility	The quality of bending easily without breaking. I enjoyed the flexibility of the schedule.
<u>flexible</u>	Making or willing to make concessions. <i>Flexible</i> schedules.
limber	Attach the limber. A limber imagination.
lively	Full of life and energy; active and outgoing. A lively tennis ball.
malleability	The property of being physically malleable; the property of something that can be worked or hammered or shaped without breaking.
<u>malleable</u>	Easily influenced. A malleable metal can be beaten into a sheet.



<u>mobility</u>	The ability to move or be moved freely and easily. <i>This exercise helps retain</i> mobility <i>in the damaged joints.</i>
momentum	The impetus and driving force gained by the development of a process or course of events. The car s momentum carried it off the road.
<u>plastic</u>	Credit cards or other types of plastic card that can be used as money. <i>Do you take plastic.</i>
plastically	In a plastic manner.
plasticity	The adaptability of an organism to changes in its environment or differences between its various habitats. Fine clay at the right degree of plasticity is more useful.
<u>pliable</u>	Susceptible to being led or directed. They soaked the leather to made it pliable .
pliant	Capable of being influenced or formed. <i>Pliant</i> willow stems.
rubber	Coat or impregnate with rubber. A pencil with a rubber at the end.
spermaceti	A white waxy substance from oil of the sperm whale.
<u>spirited</u>	Made lively or spirited. A spirited dance.
stretch	Extend or stretch out to a greater or the full length. The park stretch ed beneath the train line.
stretched	Extended or spread over a wide area or distance. Well stretched muscles are less susceptible to injury.
stretching	Exercise designed to extend the limbs and muscles to their full extent.
waxy	Having the paleness of wax. <i>Waxy potatoes.</i>
