
### **Resistant as an Adjective**

#### Definitions of "Resistant" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "resistant" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Disposed to or engaged in defiance of established authority.
- Able to tolerate environmental conditions or physiological stress.
- Incapable of absorbing or mixing with.
- Offering resistance to something or someone.
- Impervious to being affected.
- Relating to or conferring immunity (to disease or infection.
- Denoting starch that is not easily broken down by enzymes within the body and is therefore minimally absorbed during digestion.

<u>anti</u>	Opposed. <i>The local councils are <b>anti</b>.</i>
averse to	Strongly opposed.
disinclined to accept	Unwilling because of mild dislike or disapproval.
hostile to	Very unfavorable to life or growth.
<u>immune</u>	Relating to immune resistance. <i>Immune</i> to persuasion.
impervious to	Not admitting of passage or capable of being affected.
inimical to	Not friendly.
insubordinate	Defiant of authority; disobedient to orders. An <b>insubordinate</b> attitude.
opposed to	Being in opposition or having an opponent.
proof against	Able to withstand.
reluctant to accept	Not eager.
repellent	Causing disgust or distaste. A water <b>repellent</b> fabric.
repellent of	Serving or tending to repel.
resistive	Exhibiting or relating to electrical resistance.
<u>tolerant</u>	Tolerant and forgiving under provocation. The plant is <b>tolerant</b> of saltwater.
unaffected by	Emotionally unmoved.
unenthusiastic about	On the move.
unwilling to accept	In spite of contrary volition.

- Some of the old Churches are resistant to change.
- A water-resistant adhesive.
- Resistant to the effects of heat.
- Plastic highly resistant to steam and water.
- Resistant to persuasion.
- Cooked rice, like bread, contains a useful amount of resistant starch, which acts like fibre in the digestive system.

contumacy	Willful refusal to appear before a court or comply with a court order; can result in a finding of contempt of court.
<u>defiance</u>	A hostile challenge. The demonstration was held in <b>defiance</b> of official warnings.
defiant	Showing defiance. A <b>defiant</b> attitude.
<u>disobedient</u>	Unwilling to submit to authority. Larry was stern with <b>disobedient</b> employees.
fireproof	Make something fireproof. Nearby museum buildings will be <b>fireproof</b> ed.
<u>forgiving</u>	Ready and willing to forgive. A <b>forgiving</b> embrace to the naughty child.
<u>harden</u>	Harden by reheating and cooling in oil. Suspicion <b>harden</b> ed into certainty.
<u>immune</u>	A person who is immune to a particular infection. They were naturally <b>immune</b> to hepatitis B.
incombustible	(especially of a building material or component) consisting or made of material that does not burn if exposed to fire. <i>An <b>incombustible</b> floor construction.</i>
insubordinate	Disposed to or engaged in defiance of established authority. An <b>insubordinate</b> attitude.
<u>lenient</u>	Tolerant or lenient. <b>Lenient</b> magistrates.
magnanimous	Generous or forgiving, especially towards a rival or less powerful person. <i>Magnanimous</i> toward his enemies.
mutinous	Consisting of or characterized by or inciting to mutiny. <i>Mutinous</i> soldiers occupied the radio station.
nonflammable	Impossible to ignite.
obstreperous	Noisy and difficult to control. The boy is cocky and <b>obstreperous</b> .
ohm	German physicist who formulated Ohm's law (1787-1854.
permissive	Allowing a biological or biochemical process to occur. Using <b>permissive</b> footpaths you can visit meadows on both the banks of the river.



<u>rambunctious</u>	Noisy and lacking in restraint or discipline. A <b>rambunctious</b> tyke.
<u>rebellious</u>	(of a thing) not easily controlled or kept in place. I became very <b>rebellious</b> and opted out.
recalcitrant	Stubbornly resistant to authority or control. A stiff necked <b>recalcitrant</b> and troublemaker.
reluctantly	In an unwilling and hesitant way. He <b>reluctantly</b> agrees to do his duty.
resistive	Of or concerning electrical resistance.
strength	Physical energy or intensity. They were taking no chances with the <b>strength</b> of the retaining wall.
strong	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. Despite his <b>strong</b> constitution constant worry and exposure to the elements had worn him down.
stubborn	Tenaciously unwilling or marked by tenacious unwillingness to yield. <i>The removal of stubborn screws.</i>
<u>tolerant</u>	Tolerant and forgiving under provocation. Fault <b>tolerant</b> computer systems.
toughen	Make tough or tougher. A falcon has scaly skin on its legs that <b>toughen</b> s up very quickly.
<u>uncontrollable</u>	Impossible to repress or control. <b>Uncontrollable</b> pain.
ungovernable	Of persons. An <b>ungovernable</b> impulse to run away.
unruly	Of persons. Kate tried to control her <b>unruly</b> emotions.
