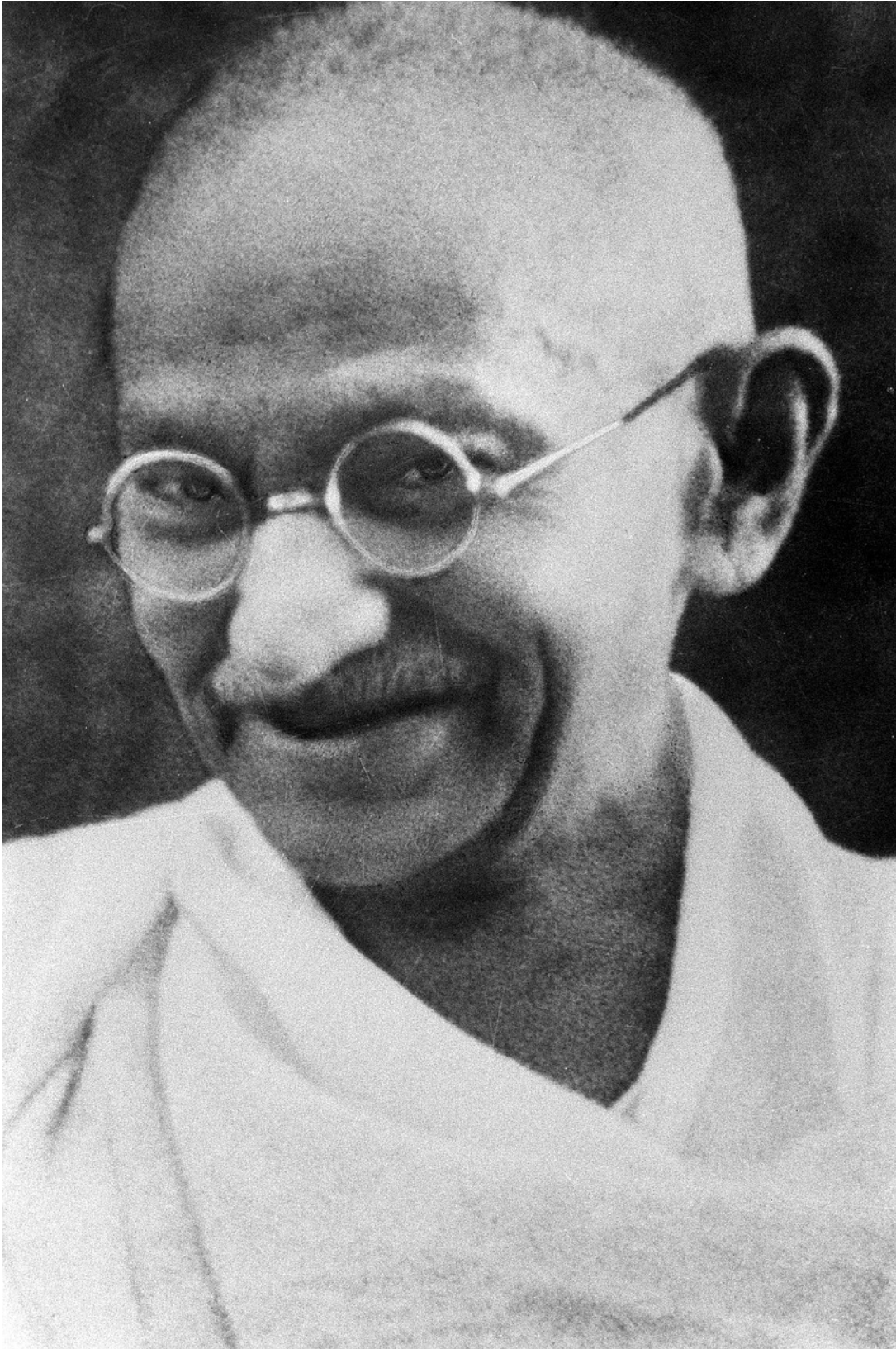

Resistant as an Adjective

Definitions of "Resistant" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “resistant” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Disposed to or engaged in defiance of established authority.*
- *Able to tolerate environmental conditions or physiological stress.*
- *Incapable of absorbing or mixing with.*
- *Offering resistance to something or someone.*
- *Impervious to being affected.*
- *Relating to or conferring immunity (to disease or infection).*
- *Denoting starch that is not easily broken down by enzymes within the body and is therefore minimally absorbed during digestion.*



Synonyms of "Resistant" as an adjective (18 Words)

anti	Opposed. <i>The local councils are anti.</i>
averse to	Strongly opposed.
disinclined to accept	Unwilling because of mild dislike or disapproval.
hostile to	Very unfavorable to life or growth.
immune	Relating to immune resistance. <i>Immune to persuasion.</i>
impervious to	Not admitting of passage or capable of being affected.
inimical to	Not friendly.
insubordinate	Defiant of authority; disobedient to orders. <i>An insubordinate attitude.</i>
opposed to	Being in opposition or having an opponent.
proof against	Able to withstand.
reluctant to accept	Not eager.
repellent	Causing disgust or distaste. <i>A water repellent fabric.</i>
repellent of	Serving or tending to repel.
resistive	Exhibiting or relating to electrical resistance.
tolerant	Tolerant and forgiving under provocation. <i>The plant is tolerant of saltwater.</i>
unaffected by	Emotionally unmoved.
unenthusiastic about	On the move.
unwilling to accept	In spite of contrary volition.



Usage Examples of "Resistant" as an adjective

- *The new hybrid is more resistant to drought.*
- *Some of the old Churches are resistant to change.*
- *A water-resistant adhesive.*
- *Resistant to the effects of heat.*
- *Plastic highly resistant to steam and water.*
- *Resistant to persuasion.*
- *Cooked rice, like bread, contains a useful amount of resistant starch, which acts like fibre in the digestive system.*

Associations of "Resistant" (30 Words)

contumacy	Willful refusal to appear before a court or comply with a court order; can result in a finding of contempt of court.
<u>defiance</u>	A hostile challenge. <i>The demonstration was held in defiance of official warnings.</i>
defiant	Showing defiance. <i>A defiant attitude.</i>
<u>disobedient</u>	Unwilling to submit to authority. <i>Larry was stern with disobedient employees.</i>
fireproof	Make something fireproof. <i>Nearby museum buildings will be fireproofed.</i>
<u>forgiving</u>	Ready and willing to forgive. <i>A forgiving embrace to the naughty child.</i>
<u>harden</u>	Harden by reheating and cooling in oil. <i>Suspicion hardened into certainty.</i>
<u>immune</u>	A person who is immune to a particular infection. <i>They were naturally immune to hepatitis B.</i>
incombustible	(especially of a building material or component) consisting or made of material that does not burn if exposed to fire. <i>An incombustible floor construction.</i>
insubordinate	Disposed to or engaged in defiance of established authority. <i>An insubordinate attitude.</i>
<u>lenient</u>	Tolerant or lenient. <i>Lenient magistrates.</i>
magnanimous	Generous or forgiving, especially towards a rival or less powerful person. <i>Magnanimous toward his enemies.</i>
mutinous	Consisting of or characterized by or inciting to mutiny. <i>Mutinous soldiers occupied the radio station.</i>
nonflammable	Impossible to ignite.
obstreperous	Noisy and difficult to control. <i>The boy is cocky and obstreperous.</i>
ohm	German physicist who formulated Ohm's law (1787-1854).
permissive	Allowing a biological or biochemical process to occur. <i>Using permissive footpaths you can visit meadows on both the banks of the river.</i>

<u>rambunctious</u>	Noisy and lacking in restraint or discipline. <i>A rambunctious tyke.</i>
<u>rebellious</u>	(of a thing) not easily controlled or kept in place. <i>I became very rebellious and opted out.</i>
recalcitrant	Stubbornly resistant to authority or control. <i>A stiff necked recalcitrant and troublemaker.</i>
reluctantly	In an unwilling and hesitant way. <i>He reluctantly agrees to do his duty.</i>
resistive	Of or concerning electrical resistance.
strength	Physical energy or intensity. <i>They were taking no chances with the strength of the retaining wall.</i>
strong	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. <i>Despite his strong constitution constant worry and exposure to the elements had worn him down.</i>
stubborn	Tenaciously unwilling or marked by tenacious unwillingness to yield. <i>The removal of stubborn screws.</i>
<u>tolerant</u>	Tolerant and forgiving under provocation. <i>Fault tolerant computer systems.</i>
toughen	Make tough or tougher. <i>A falcon has scaly skin on its legs that toughens up very quickly.</i>
<u>uncontrollable</u>	Impossible to repress or control. <i>Uncontrollable pain.</i>
ungovernable	Of persons. <i>An ungovernable impulse to run away.</i>
unruly	Of persons. <i>Kate tried to control her unruly emotions.</i>
