<b><u>adamant</u></b>	Impervious to pleas, persuasion, requests, reason- W.Churchill. <i>He is <b>adamant</b> in his refusal to change his mind.</i>
<b>decided</b>	(of a legal case) having been resolved. <i>At a distinct or <b>decided</b> disadvantage.</i>
<b>determined</b>	Having been learned or found or determined especially by investigation. <i>A <b>determined</b> effort to reduce inflation.</i>
<b>firm</b>	Marked by firm determination or resolution not shakable. <i>No building can stand without <b>firm</b> foundations.</i>
<b>fixed</b>	Of a number having a fixed and unchanging value. <i>With eyes set in a <b>fixed</b> glassy stare.</i>
<b><u>insistent</u></b>	Insisting on or demanding something; not allowing refusal. <i>A telephone started ringing loud and <b>insistent</b>.</i>
<b>intent</b>	Determined to do (something). <i>Gill was <b>intent</b> on her gardening magazine.</i>

<b>purposeful</b>	Having meaning through having an aim. <i><b>Purposeful</b> activities.</i>
<b>purposive</b>	Having or done with a purpose. <i>Teaching is a <b>purposive</b> activity.</i>
<b>resolved</b>	Explained or answered. <i>She was firmly <b>resolved</b> to be a doctor.</i>
<b>set</b>	Set down according to a plan. <i>The moon is <b>set</b>.</i>
<b>single-minded</b>	Determined.
<b>undaunted</b>	Unshaken in purpose. <i><b>Undaunted</b> in the face of death.</i>
<b>unhesitating</b>	Without doubt or hesitation; immediate. <i>His reply was <b>unhesitating</b>.</i>
<b>unswerving</b>	Going directly ahead from one point to another without veering or turning aside. <i><b>Unswerving</b> allegiance.</i>
<b><u>unwavering</u></b>	Not wavering; steady or resolute. <i>She fixed him with an <b>unwavering</b> stare.</i>

### adamant

Very hard native crystalline carbon valued as a gem.  
*He is **adamant** that he is not going to resign.*

### **decided**

(of a legal case) having been resolved.  
*The sunshine is a **decided** improvement.*

### **determined**

Having been learned or found or determined especially by investigation.  
*Date and place are already **determined**.*

### dogged

Stubbornly unyielding.  
*Success required **dogged** determination.*

### **dour**

Relentlessly severe, stern, or gloomy in manner or appearance.  
*A **dour** self sacrificing life.*

### endurance

The power to withstand hardship or stress.  
*The marathon tests a runner's **endurance**.*

### **firm**

Marked by firm determination or resolution not shakable.  
*Parents should be **firm** with children and not give in to their demands.*

<b>hard</b>	Unfortunate or hard to bear. <i>They work <b>hard</b> at school.</i>
<b>hardheaded</b>	Unreasonably rigid in the face of argument or entreaty or attack. <i>A <b>hardheaded</b> appraisal of our position.</i>
<b>hidebound</b>	Unwilling or unable to change because of tradition or convention. <i>They are working to change <b>hidebound</b> corporate cultures.</i>
<b>inflexible</b>	Incapable of adapting or changing to meet circumstances. <i>A man of <b>inflexible</b> purpose.</i>
<b>intransigent</b>	An intransigent person. <i>Her father had tried persuasion but she was <b>intransigent</b>.</i>
<b>obduracy</b>	Resoluteness by virtue of being unyielding and inflexible.
<b>obdurate</b>	Showing unfeeling resistance to tender feelings. <i>I argued this point with him but he was <b>obdurate</b>.</i>
<b>obstinate</b>	Resistant to guidance or discipline. <i>Her <b>obstinate</b> determination to pursue a career in radio.</i>
<b>pertinacious</b>	Holding firmly to an opinion or a course of action. <i>He worked with a <b>pertinacious</b> resistance to interruptions.</i>
<b>rigid</b>	Designating an airship or dirigible having a form maintained by a stiff unyielding frame or structure. <i>A <b>rigid</b> disciplinarian.</i>
<b>solid</b>	Of good quality and condition solidly built. <i>A <b>solid</b> mass of flowers.</i>
<b>steadfast</b>	Firm and dependable especially in loyalty. <i><b>Steadfast</b> resolve.</i>
<b>stiff</b>	In a stiff manner. <i>A <b>stiff</b> neck.</i>
<b>stubborn</b>	Not responding to treatment. <i>A <b>stubborn</b> infection.</i>
<b>tenacious</b>	Tending to keep a firm hold of something; clinging or adhering closely. <i>Men <b>tenacious</b> of opinion.</i>
<b>unbending</b>	Incapable of adapting or changing to meet circumstances. <i>An <b>unbending</b> will to dominate.</i>
<b>uncompromising</b>	Harsh or relentless. <i><b>Uncompromising</b> honesty.</i>
<b>undaunted</b>	Resolutely courageous. <i>They were <b>undaunted</b> by the huge amount of work needed.</i>

- undeterred** Not deterred- Osbert Sitwell.  
*Pursued his own path **undeterred** by lack of popular appreciation and understanding.*
- undismayed** Not dismayed or discouraged by a setback.  
***Undismayed** my mother sent me to a first class crammer for two terms.*
- unshaken** Unshaken in purpose.  
*Their trust in him remained **unshaken**.*
- unwavering** Not showing abrupt variations- Louis Auchincloss.  
***Unwavering** loyalty.*
- unyielding** Stubbornly unyielding T S Eliot.  
*His **unyielding** faith.*
