According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “resonant” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

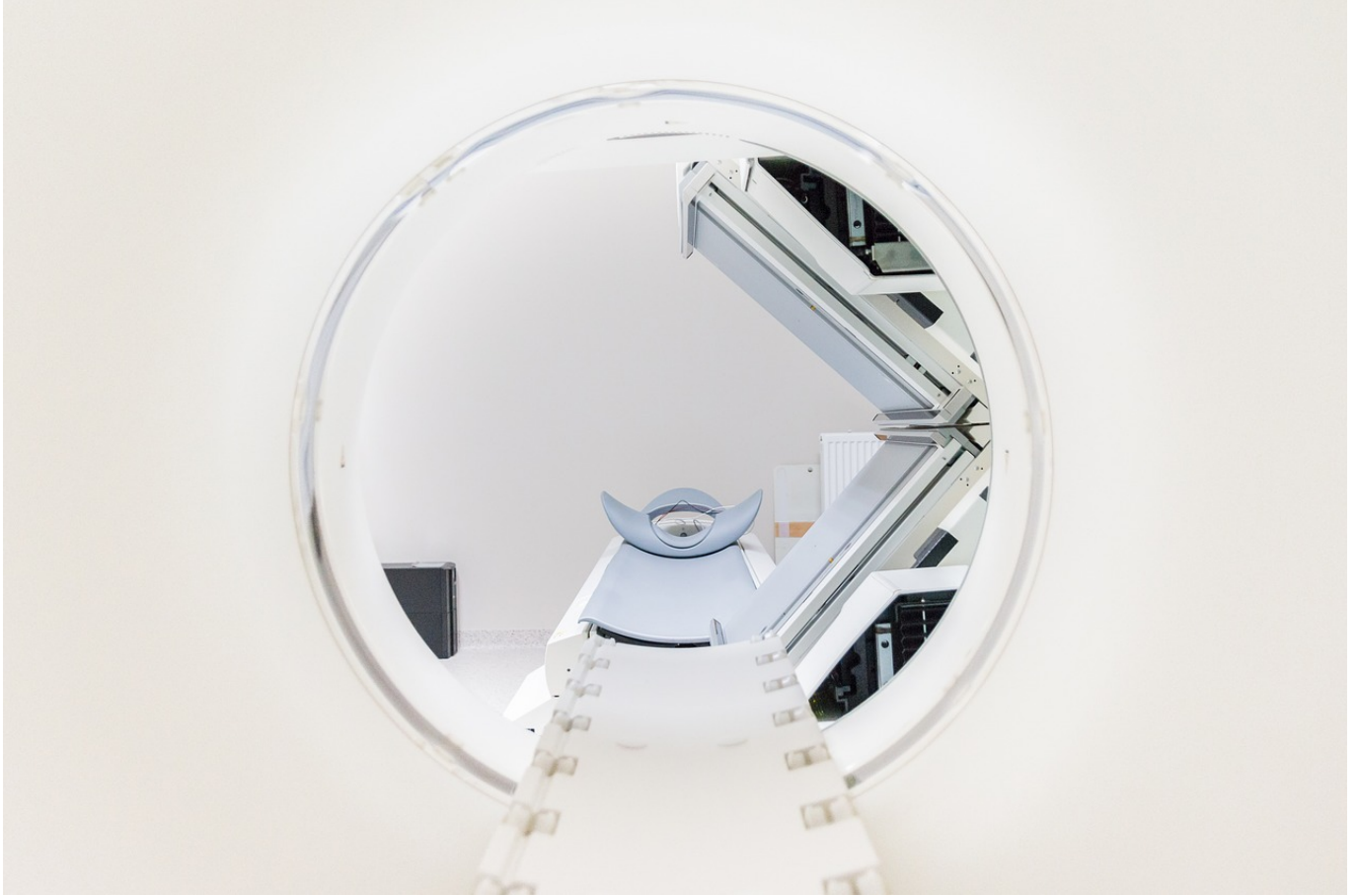
- *(of a place) filled or resounding with (a sound).*
- *Relating to or bringing about resonance in a circuit, atom, or other object.*
- *Characterized by resonance.*
- *(of sound) deep, clear, and continuing to sound or reverberate.*
- *Serving to bring to mind- Wilder Hobson.*
- *Serving to bring to mind.*
- *(of a room, musical instrument, or hollow body) tending to reinforce or prolong sounds, especially by synchronous vibration.*
- *Having the ability to evoke enduring images, memories, or emotions.*
- *(of a colour) enhancing or enriching another colour or colours by contrast.*

<b>deep</b>	Relatively deep or strong affecting one deeply. <i><b>Deep</b> disappointment.</i>
<b>echoing</b>	(of sounds) repeating by reflection. <i>The sound of <b>echoing</b> footsteps slowed to a stop.</i>
<b>evocative</b>	Serving to bring to mind- Wilder Hobson. <i>Powerfully <b>evocative</b> lyrics.</i>
<b>expressive</b>	Effectively conveying thought or feeling. <i>The spires are <b>expressive</b> of religious aspiration.</i>
<b>filled</b>	Of purchase orders that have been filled. <i>Fog <b>filled</b> air.</i>
<b>full</b>	Constituting the full quantity or extent complete. <i>A <b>full</b> skirt.</i>

<b>full-bodied</b>	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor.
<b>haunting</b>	Continually recurring to the mind. <i>The cathedral organ and the distant voices have a <b>haunting</b> beauty.</i>
<b>low</b>	Subdued or brought low in condition or status. <i>The sun was <b>low</b> in the sky.</i>
<b>moving</b>	Arousing or capable of arousing deep emotion- N. Hawthorne. <i>Her ambition was to be in <b>moving</b> pictures or the movies.</i>
<b>orotund</b>	(of a person's voice) resonant and imposing. <b>Orotund</b> tones.
<b>poignant</b>	Sharp or pungent in taste or smell. <i>The <b>poignant</b> scent of her powder.</i>
<b>redolent</b>	Having a strong pleasant odor. <i>Cannot forbear to close on this <b>redolent</b> literary note.</i>
<b>remindful</b>	Acting as a reminder. <i>His humour is <b>remindful</b> of that of Max.</i>
<b>reminiscent</b>	Suggesting something by resemblance. <i>The sights were <b>reminiscent</b> of my childhood.</i>
<b>resonating</b>	Characterized by resonance.
<b>resounding</b>	Characterized by resonance. <i>The evening was a <b>resounding</b> success.</i>
<b>reverberating</b>	Characterized by resonance.
<b>reverberative</b>	Characterized by resonance.
<b>rich</b>	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>The city is surrounded by <b>rich</b> agricultural land.</i>
<b>ringing</b>	Having or emitting a clear resonant sound. <i>A <b>ringing</b> voice.</i>
<b>sonorous</b>	(of a speech or style) using imposing language. <i>The alloy is <b>sonorous</b> and useful in making bells.</i>
<b>suggestive</b>	Pointing out or revealing clearly. <b>Suggestive</b> poses.
<b>vibrant</b>	(of colour) bright and striking. <i>A huge room decorated in <b>vibrant</b> blues and greens.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Resonant" as an adjective

- *The sound of these instruments, played in a resonant room, is unforgettable.*
- *The prints are resonant with traditions of Russian folk art and story.*
- *The resonant reds, greens, and browns typical of Ribera's palette.*
- *Alpine valleys resonant with the sound of church bells.*
- *A full-throated and resonant guffaw.*
- *A resonant voice.*
- *The sound is produced by striking resonant little metal bars.*

<b><u>aromatic</u></b>	An aromatic compound. <i>A massage with <b>aromatic</b> oils.</i>
<b>crump</b>	Explode heavily or with a loud dull noise. <i>We heard the cannon <b>crumping</b>.</i>
<b>deep</b>	Far down or in deeply. <i>A <b>deep</b> resonant voice.</i>
<b><u>echo</u></b>	Ring or echo with sound. <i>The house <b>echoed</b> with shouts.</i>
<b><u>evocative</u></b>	Serving to bring to mind- Wilder Hobson. <i>The building's cramped interiors are highly <b>evocative</b> of past centuries.</i>
<b>fragrant</b>	Having a pleasant or sweet smell. <i>She gathered the <b>fragrant</b> blooms.</i>

<b>groan</b>	Make a deep inarticulate sound conveying pain, despair, pleasure, etc. <i>Oh no I <b>groaned</b>.</i>
<b>growl</b>	The sound of growling as made by animals. <i>Keep out of this he <b>growled</b>.</i>
<b>loud</b>	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music loud with force. <i>A group of <b>loud</b> children.</i>
<b>noisy</b>	Full of or characterized by loud and nonmusical sounds. <i>A <b>noisy</b> cafeteria.</i>
<b>odoriferous</b>	Having or giving off a smell, especially an unpleasant one. <i>An <b>odoriferous</b> pile of fish.</i>
<b>redolent</b>	Serving to bring to mind. <i>A campaign <b>redolent</b> of machine politics.</i>
<b>reminiscent</b>	Tending to remind one of something. <i>The sights were <b>reminiscent</b> of my childhood.</i>
<b>resonate</b>	Produce or be filled with a deep, full, reverberating sound. <i>The sound of the siren <b>resonated</b> across the harbour.</i>
<b>resounding</b>	Characterized by resonance. <i>A <b>resounding</b> smack across the face.</i>
<b>ringing</b>	The sound of a bell ringing. <i>The Russian leader received a <b>ringing</b> declaration of support.</i>
<b>roar</b>	(of a crowd) encourage (someone) to do something by loud shouts or cheering. <i>We heard a lion <b>roar</b>.</i>
<b>rumble</b>	Take part in a street fight between gangs or large groups. <i>Stones <b>grumbled</b> down the cliff.</i>
<b>shake</b>	Shake a body part to communicate a greeting feeling or cognitive state. <i>I couldn't <b>shake</b> the car that was following me.</i>
<b>shaking</b>	A shaky motion. <i>The <b>shaking</b> of his fingers as he lit his pipe.</i>
<b>shriek</b>	A high-pitched noise resembling a human cry. <i>The audience <b>shrieked</b> with laughter.</i>
<b>sound</b>	Cause to sound. <i>We were always within <b>sound</b> of the train whistles.</i>
<b>suggestive</b>	Tending to suggest or imply. <i>A <b>suggestive</b> nod.</i>
<b>thud</b>	Make a dull sound. <i>He hit the floor with a terrific <b>thud</b>.</i>

- thump** A heavy blow with the hand.  
*I felt a **thump** on my back.*
- thundering** Extraordinarily big or impressive.  
*The **thundering** herd.*
- vibe** Transmit or give out (a feeling or atmosphere).  
*We've been picking up some bad **vibes** on that guy.*
- vibrancy** Striking brightness of colour.  
*The colour is luxurious in its richness and **vibrancy**.*
- vibrate** Sound with resonance.  
*His voice **vibrated** with terror.*
- whinny** Of a horse make a whinny.  
*The pony whinnied and tossed his head happily.*
