- *Serving to bring to mind.*
- *(of a room, musical instrument, or hollow body) tending to reinforce or prolong sounds, especially by synchronous vibration.*
- *Having the ability to evoke enduring images, memories, or emotions.*
- *(of a colour) enhancing or enriching another colour or colours by contrast.*

deep	Relatively deep or strong affecting one deeply. <i>Deep disappointment.</i>
echoing	(of sounds) repeating by reflection. <i>The sound of echoing footsteps slowed to a stop.</i>
evocative	Serving to bring to mind- Wilder Hobson. <i>Powerfully evocative lyrics.</i>
expressive	Effectively conveying thought or feeling. <i>The spires are expressive of religious aspiration.</i>
filled	Of purchase orders that have been filled. <i>Fog filled air.</i>
full	Constituting the full quantity or extent complete. <i>A full skirt.</i>

full-bodied	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor.
haunting	Continually recurring to the mind. <i>The cathedral organ and the distant voices have a haunting beauty.</i>
low	Subdued or brought low in condition or status. <i>The sun was low in the sky.</i>
moving	Arousing or capable of arousing deep emotion- N. Hawthorne. <i>Her ambition was to be in moving pictures or the movies.</i>
orotund	(of a person's voice) resonant and imposing. Orotund tones.
poignant	Sharp or pungent in taste or smell. <i>The poignant scent of her powder.</i>
redolent	Having a strong pleasant odor. <i>Cannot forbear to close on this redolent literary note.</i>
remindful	Acting as a reminder. <i>His humour is remindful of that of Max.</i>
reminiscent	Suggesting something by resemblance. <i>The sights were reminiscent of my childhood.</i>
resonating	Characterized by resonance.
resounding	Characterized by resonance. <i>The evening was a resounding success.</i>
reverberating	Characterized by resonance.
reverberative	Characterized by resonance.
rich	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>The city is surrounded by rich agricultural land.</i>
ringing	Having or emitting a clear resonant sound. <i>A ringing voice.</i>
sonorous	(of a speech or style) using imposing language. <i>The alloy is sonorous and useful in making bells.</i>
suggestive	Pointing out or revealing clearly. Suggestive poses.
vibrant	(of colour) bright and striking. <i>A huge room decorated in vibrant blues and greens.</i>

- *The sound is produced by striking resonant little metal bars.*

<u>aromatic</u>	An aromatic compound. <i>A massage with aromatic oils.</i>
crump	Explode heavily or with a loud dull noise. <i>We heard the cannon crumping.</i>
deep	Far down or in deeply. <i>A deep resonant voice.</i>
<u>echo</u>	Ring or echo with sound. <i>The house echoed with shouts.</i>
<u>evocative</u>	Serving to bring to mind- Wilder Hobson. <i>The building's cramped interiors are highly evocative of past centuries.</i>
fragrant	Having a pleasant or sweet smell. <i>She gathered the fragrant blooms.</i>

groan	Make a deep inarticulate sound conveying pain, despair, pleasure, etc. <i>Oh no I groaned.</i>
growl	The sound of growling as made by animals. <i>Keep out of this he growled.</i>
loud	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music loud with force. <i>A group of loud children.</i>
noisy	Full of or characterized by loud and nonmusical sounds. <i>A noisy cafeteria.</i>
odoriferous	Having or giving off a smell, especially an unpleasant one. <i>An odoriferous pile of fish.</i>
redolent	Serving to bring to mind. <i>A campaign redolent of machine politics.</i>
reminiscent	Tending to remind one of something. <i>The sights were reminiscent of my childhood.</i>
resonate	Produce or be filled with a deep, full, reverberating sound. <i>The sound of the siren resonated across the harbour.</i>
resounding	Characterized by resonance. <i>A resounding smack across the face.</i>
ringing	The sound of a bell ringing. <i>The Russian leader received a ringing declaration of support.</i>
roar	(of a crowd) encourage (someone) to do something by loud shouts or cheering. <i>We heard a lion roar.</i>
rumble	Take part in a street fight between gangs or large groups. <i>Stones grumbled down the cliff.</i>
shake	Shake a body part to communicate a greeting feeling or cognitive state. <i>I couldn't shake the car that was following me.</i>
shaking	A shaky motion. <i>The shaking of his fingers as he lit his pipe.</i>
shriek	A high-pitched noise resembling a human cry. <i>The audience shrieked with laughter.</i>
sound	Cause to sound. <i>We were always within sound of the train whistles.</i>
suggestive	Tending to suggest or imply. <i>A suggestive nod.</i>
thud	Make a dull sound. <i>He hit the floor with a terrific thud.</i>

- thump** A heavy blow with the hand.
*I felt a **thump** on my back.*
- thundering** Extraordinarily big or impressive.
*The **thundering** herd.*
- vibe** Transmit or give out (a feeling or atmosphere).
*We've been picking up some bad **vibes** on that guy.*
- vibrancy** Striking brightness of colour.
*The colour is luxurious in its richness and **vibrancy**.*
- vibrate** Sound with resonance.
*His voice **vibrated** with terror.*
- whinny** Of a horse make a whinny.
The pony whinnied and tossed his head happily.
