Definitions of "Resonating" as an adjective

- *Characterized by resonance.*



Synonyms of "Resonating" as an adjective (4 Words)

- resonant** (of a colour) enhancing or enriching another colour or colours by contrast.
*A full throated and **resonant** guffaw.*
- resounding** Unmistakable; emphatic.
*A **resounding** smack across the face.*
- reverberating** Characterized by resonance.
- reverberative** Characterized by resonance.



Associations of "Resonating" (30 Words)

deviate

A person whose behavior deviates from what is acceptable especially in sexual behavior.

*The river was **deviated** to prevent flooding.*

digress

Lose clarity or turn aside especially from the main subject of attention or course of argument in writing, thinking, or speaking.

*I have **digressed** a little from my original plan.*

dislodge

Remove or force out from a position.

*The hoofs of their horses **dislodged** loose stones.*

ditto

The same thing again used in lists and accounts and often indicated by a ditto mark under the word or figure to be repeated.

*The next speaker **dittoed** her argument.*

earshot

The range or distance over which one can hear or be heard.

*She waited until he was out of **earshot** before continuing.*

echo	Ring or echo with sound. <i>His contention contains more than an echo of Rousseau.</i>
excursive	Tending to depart from the main point or cover a wide range of subjects. <i>His excursive remarks.</i>
growl	The sound of growling as made by animals. <i>With a growl of fury he tightened his grip.</i>
hearing	The act of hearing attentively. <i>The court may stay execution pending a hearing.</i>
iterate	Make repeated use of a mathematical or computational procedure, applying it each time to the result of the previous application; perform iteration. <i>The function iterates.</i>
mimic	Someone who mimics especially an actor or actress. <i>How did these insects evolve to become such perfect mimics.</i>
noise	Make a lot of noise. <i>Whatever it was he didn't like it and he was going to let them know by making as loud a noise as he could.</i>
noisy	Attracting attention by showiness or bright colors. <i>A noisy sweater.</i>
rambling	Of a path e.g. <i>A big old rambling house.</i>
reflect	Reflect deeply on a subject. <i>Charles reflected that maybe there was hope for the family after all.</i>
repeat	An event that repeats. <i>A repeat offender.</i>
resonance	A vibration of large amplitude produced by a relatively small vibration near the same frequency of vibration as the natural frequency of the resonating system. <i>The concepts lose their emotional resonance.</i>
resonant	(of a room, musical instrument, or hollow body) tending to reinforce or prolong sounds, especially by synchronous vibration. <i>A resonant voice.</i>
resound	Sing (the praises) of. <i>Whatever they do in the Nineties will not resound in the way that their earlier achievements did.</i>
resounding	(of a sound) loud enough to reverberate. <i>A resounding smack across the face.</i>
reverberate	(of a place) appear to vibrate because of a loud noise. <i>Reverberate ore.</i>

reverberation	A continuing effect; a repercussion. <i>The attack has had reverberations around the world.</i>
ringing	The sound of a bell ringing. <i>The tintinnabulation that so voluminously swells from the ringing and the dinging of the bells.</i>
roam	Move about aimlessly or without any destination, often in search of food or employment. <i>Gangs of youths roamed the streets unopposed.</i>
sidetrack	Divert (a well or borehole) to reach a productive deposit or to avoid an obstruction. <i>His monologue launches into too many rambling sidetracks.</i>
sonar	An apparatus used in sonar. <i>Sonar is an acronym for sound navigation ranging.</i>
sonority	The quality or fact of being sonorous. <i>Bee has greater sonority than pin.</i>
sound	Phonetics an individual sound unit of speech without concern as to whether or not it is a phoneme of some language. <i>Politicians have no sound grasp of technology issues.</i>
stray	A stray person or thing especially a domestic animal. <i>A stray dog.</i>
vibrancy	The state of being full of energy and life. <i>The vibrancy of the city centre.</i>
