canny	Pleasant; nice. <i>Canny investors will switch banks if they think they are getting a raw deal.</i>
clever	Skilled at doing or achieving something; talented. <i>He was very clever at getting what he wanted.</i>
creative	A person whose job involves creative work. <i>Creative work.</i>

creatively	In a creative manner. <i>This article inspires you to think creatively.</i>
creativeness	The ability to create.
creativity	The use of imagination or original ideas to create something; inventiveness. <i>Firms are keen to encourage creativity.</i>
dexterous	Showing or having skill, especially with the hands. <i>A dexterous keyboard player.</i>
dextrous	Skillful in physical movements; especially of the hands.
genius	Unusual mental ability. <i>He sees Adams as the man's evil genius.</i>
<u>groundbreaking</u>	The ceremonial breaking of the ground to formally begin a construction project. <i>Groundbreaking research into fertility problems.</i>
ingenious	(of a machine or idea) cleverly and originally devised and well suited to its purpose. <i>He was ingenious enough to overcome the limited budget.</i>
innovative	Being or producing something like nothing done or experienced or created before. <i>Innovative members of the artistic community.</i>
intelligent	Having the capacity for thought and reason especially to a high degree. <i>Is there intelligent life in the universe.</i>
<u>invention</u>	Creative ability. <i>His powers of invention were rather limited.</i>
<u>inventive</u>	(used of persons or artifacts) marked by independence and creativity in thought or action. <i>Had an inventive turn of mind.</i>
<u>masterful</u>	Having or revealing supreme mastery or skill. <i>Masterful technique.</i>
maven	Someone who is dazzlingly skilled in any field. <i>The maven of vintage furniture.</i>
<u>originality</u>	The quality of being novel or unusual. <i>He congratulated her on the originality of her costume.</i>
outwit	Beat through cleverness and wit. <i>Ray had outwitted many an opponent.</i>
prodigy	An impressive or wonderful example of a particular quality. <i>She is a chess prodigy.</i>

sagacity	The mental ability to understand and discriminate between relations. <i>A man of great political sagacity.</i>
shrewd	(especially of weather) piercingly cold. <i>She was shrewd enough to guess the motive behind his gesture.</i>
skilled	(of work) requiring special abilities or training. <i>A lab technician skilled in electronics.</i>
slyly	In a way that suggests some secret knowledge that may be harmful or embarrassing; knowingly. <i>He slyly manipulates votes.</i>
smart	Intelligence; acumen. <i>He gave the dog a smart blow.</i>
virtuoso	Having or revealing supreme mastery or skill. <i>Virtuoso guitar playing.</i>
wizardry	Great skill in a particular area of activity. <i>Plless s wizardry with a bat.</i>
