- Receiving deferential regard.



Grant or assign (a contract or commission) to (a person or organization.

**compliment** A polite expression of praise or admiration. *He* **compliment**ed her on her last physics paper.

(of a performance, effort, or action) deserving public acknowledgement and

**creditable** praise but not necessarily outstanding or successful.

High office or rank or station.

He respected the **dignity** of the emissaries.

**emeritus** the additional title emeritus as in professor emeritus.

Emeritus professor of microbiology.

eminence High status importance owing to marked superiority.

An **eminence** commanding the River Emme.

The condition of being honored esteemed or respected or well regarded.

estimable Worthy of great respect.

She was shown into that **estimable** woman s presence.

**excellent** Very good; of the highest quality.

Their results are excellent.
