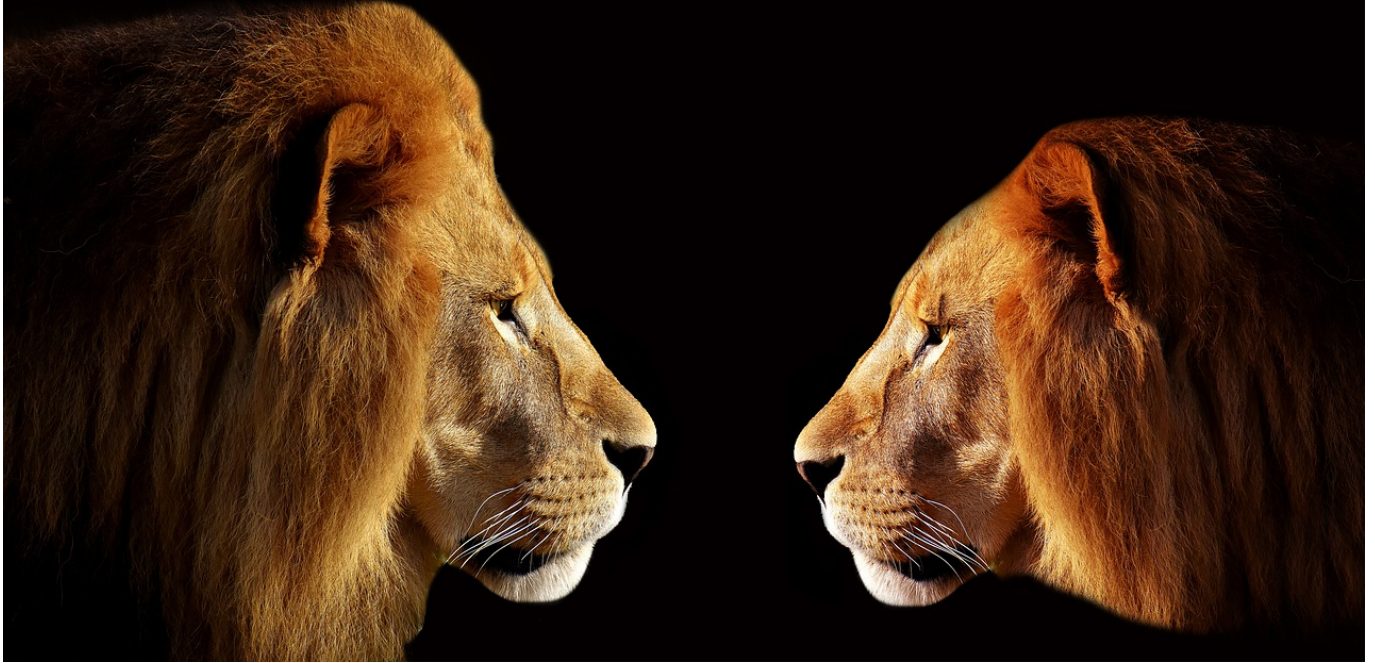
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “respected” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- admirable** Deserving of the highest esteem or admiration.
*Trains ran with **admirable** precision.*
- admired** Regarded with admiration.
- award** Grant or assign (a contract or commission) to (a person or organization).
*An **award** of damages.*
- compliment** A polite expression of praise or admiration.
*He **complimented** her on her last physics paper.*
- creditable** (of a performance, effort, or action) deserving public acknowledgement and praise but not necessarily outstanding or successful.
*A very **creditable** 2 4 defeat.*
- dignity** High office or rank or station.
*He respected the **dignity** of the emissaries.*

emeritus	Honorably retired from assigned duties and retaining your title along with the additional title emeritus as in professor emeritus. <i>Emeritus professor of microbiology.</i>
eminence	High status importance owing to marked superiority. <i>An eminence commanding the River Emme.</i>
esteem	The condition of being honored esteemed or respected or well regarded. <i>He was held in high esteem by colleagues.</i>
estimable	Worthy of great respect. <i>She was shown into that estimable woman s presence.</i>
excellent	Very good; of the highest quality. <i>Their results are excellent.</i>
fame	The state or quality of being widely honored and acclaimed. <i>The song s success rocketed him to stardom and fame.</i>
homage	Special honour or respect shown publicly. <i>A man doing homage to his personal lord.</i>
honor	Bestow honor or rewards upon. <i>A man of honor.</i>
honorable	Adhering to ethical and moral principles. <i>An honorable man.</i>
honored	Having an illustrious reputation; respected.
influential	An influential person. <i>Young influentials.</i>
laudable	Worthy of high praise. <i>Laudable motives of improving housing conditions.</i>
prestigious	Exerting influence by reason of high status or prestige. <i>A prestigious professor at a prestigious university.</i>
prominence	Something that bulges out or is protuberant or projects from its surroundings. <i>Radiographs showed enlargement of the right heart with prominence of the pulmonary outflow tract.</i>
renown	The state or quality of being widely honored and acclaimed. <i>Authors of great renown.</i>
renowned	Known or talked about by many people; famous. <i>Britain is renowned for its love of animals.</i>
reputable	Having a good reputation. <i>A reputable wine.</i>

- reputation** Notoriety for some particular characteristic.
*He acquired a **reputation** as an actor before he started writing.*
- repute** Look on as or consider.
*He is **reputed** to be intelligent.*
- respect** The state of being admired or respected.
*He inspires **respect**.*
- respectable** Characterized by socially or conventionally acceptable morals.
*A **respectable** woman.*
- respectful** Feeling or showing deference and respect.
*They sit in **respectful** silence.*
- stature** High level of respect gained by impressive development or achievement.
*A man of great **stature**.*
- worthy** Worthy of being chosen especially as a spouse.
*A **worthy** cause.*
