According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “respective” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

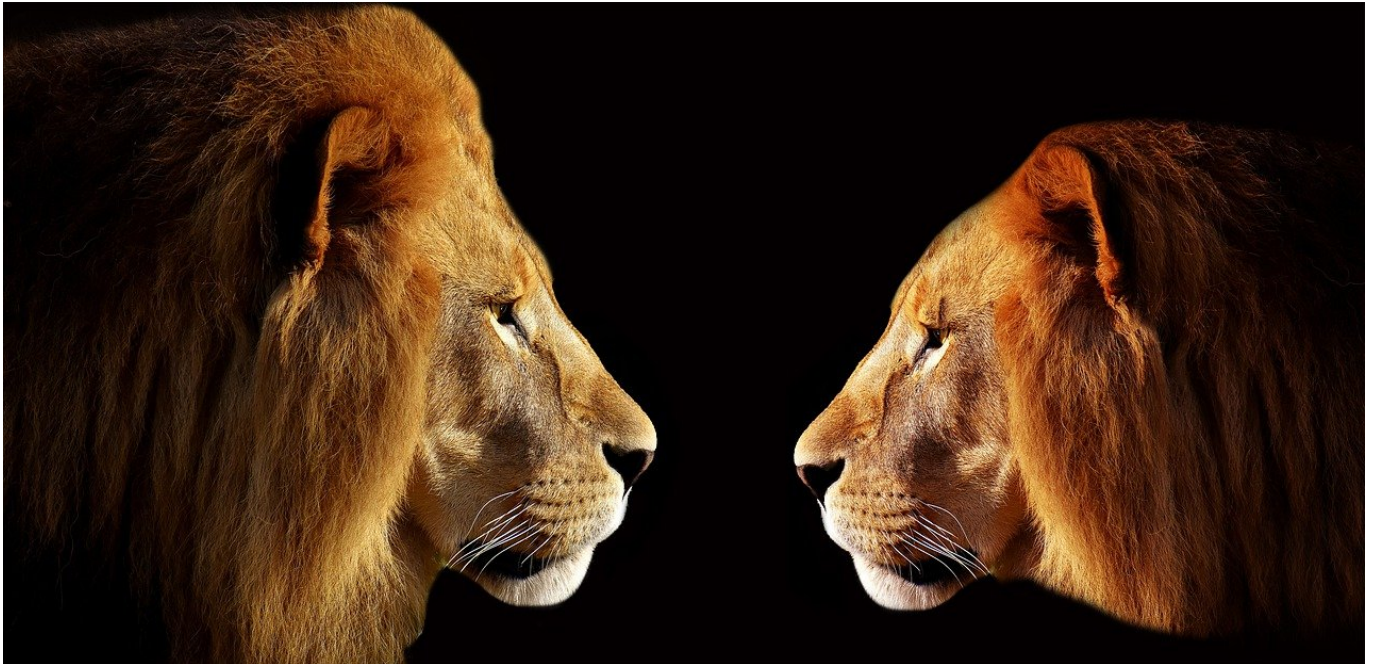
- *Considered individually.*
- *Belonging or relating separately to each of two or more people or things.*



## Synonyms of "Respective" as an adjective (13 Words)

- appropriate** Suitable or proper in the circumstances.  
*A book not **appropriate** for children.*
- corresponding** Accompanying.  
*All rights carry with them **corresponding** responsibilities.*
- different** Differing from all others; not ordinary.  
***Different** parts of the country.*
- individual** Designed for use by one person.  
***Individual** drops of rain.*
- own** Done or produced by and for the person mentioned.  
*I was an outcast among my **own** kind.*
- particular** Used to single out an individual member of a specified group or class.  
*A **particular** description of the room.*

<b>personal</b>	Existing as a self aware entity not as an abstraction or an impersonal force. <i>For your <b>personal</b> use.</i>
<b>relevant</b>	Having a bearing on or connection with the subject at issue. <i>Her films are <b>relevant</b> for feminists today.</i>
<b>separate</b>	Have the connection undone having become separate. <i>A house with a <b>separate</b> garage.</i>
<b>several</b>	Of an indefinite number more than 2 or 3 but not many. <i><b>Several</b> people were injured in the accident.</i>
<b>special</b>	Used to denote education for children with particular needs especially those with learning difficulties. <i>We want to preserve our town s <b>special</b> character.</i>
<b>specific</b>	Relating to species or a species. <i><b>Specific</b> dielectric strength.</i>
<b>various</b>	Considered individually. <i>His <b>various</b> achievements are impressive.</i>



### Usage Examples of "Respective" as an adjective

- *The respective club members.*
- *They chatted about their respective childhoods.*



## Associations of "Respective" (30 Words)

- assorted** Of various sorts put together; miscellaneous.  
*Assorted sizes.*
- corresponding** Accompanying.  
*A number of **corresponding** diagonal points.*
- diverse** Many and different.  
*Subjects as **diverse** as architecture language teaching and the physical sciences.*
- each** Every one considered individually.  
*They received 10 **each**.*
- few** A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by 'a'; a small but indefinite number.  
*An invalid's pleasures are **few** and far between.*

<b>individual</b>	A distinctive or original person. <i>The <b>individual</b> needs of the children.</i>
<b>manifold</b>	A lightweight paper used with carbon paper to make multiple copies. <i>An original and two <b>manifolds</b>.</i>
<b>mere</b>	Used to emphasize that the fact of something being present in a situation is enough to influence that situation. <i>The city is a <b>mere</b> 20 minutes from some stunning countryside.</i> (of a collection or group) composed of members or elements of different
<b>miscellaneous</b>	kinds. <i>A <b>miscellaneous</b> crowd.</i>
<b>miscellany</b>	An anthology of short literary pieces and poems and ballads etc. <i>A <b>miscellany</b> of houses.</i>
<b>mixed</b>	Involving a mixture of people from different ethnic, religious, or social groups. <i>I had <b>mixed</b> feelings about seeing Laura again.</i>
<b>motley</b>	A garment made of motley especially a court jester s costume. <i>A jester dressed in <b>motley</b>.</i>
<b>multifarious</b>	Having many aspects. <i>A vast <b>multifarious</b> organization.</i>
<b>multiple</b>	A shop with branches in many places, especially one selling a specific type of product. <i>A <b>multiple</b> pile up.</i>
<b>numerous</b>	Consisting of many members. <i>The family was <b>numerous</b>.</i>
<b>only</b>	Being the only one single and isolated from others. <i>It s simply the <b>only</b> place to be seen these days.</i>
<b>personal</b>	An advertisement or message in the personal column of a newspaper. <i>He rejected the notion of a <b>personal</b> God.</i>
<b>pluralism</b>	The doctrine that reality consists of several basic substances or elements.
<b>several</b>	Distinct and individual. <i>Specialists in their <b>several</b> fields.</i>
<b>single</b>	Hit a single. <i>The kingdom was ruled over by a <b>single</b> family.</i>
<b>some</b>	To some extent quite a lot. <i>He needs feeding up <b>some</b>.</i>

<b>specific</b>	A medicine that has a mitigating effect on a specific disease. <i>Rules with <b>specific</b> application.</i>
<b>sundry</b>	Of various kinds; several. <i><b>Sundry</b> sciences commonly known as social.</i>
<b>times</b>	A more or less definite period of time now or previously present. <i>Four <b>times</b> three equals twelve.</i>
<b>twofold</b>	So as to double; to twice the number or amount. <i>The <b>twofold</b> demands of the business and motherhood.</i>
<b>unique</b>	A unique person or thing. <i>Original and <b>unique</b> designs.</i>
<b>varied</b>	Broken away from sameness or identity or duplication. <i>His work is interesting and <b>varied</b>.</i>
<b>various</b>	Having great diversity or variety. <i>The <b>various</b> reports all agreed.</i>
<b>versatile</b>	Able to adapt or be adapted to many different functions or activities. <i>He was <b>versatile</b> enough to play on either wing.</i>
