calm	(of the weather) pleasantly free from wind. <i>A dead calm sea.</i>
comfortable	(of a person) physically relaxed and free from constraint. <i>The comfortable thought that nothing could go wrong.</i>
free from disturbance	Not literal.
free from interference	Not taken up by scheduled activities.
free from interruption	Able to act at will; not hampered; not under compulsion or restraint.
leisurely	Not hurried or forced. <i>At a leisurely or easygoing pace.</i>
peaceful	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. <i>There were no violent incidents reported and it was a peaceful protest.</i>
placid	Calm and peaceful, with little movement or activity. <i>The placid waters of a small lake.</i>

quiet	(of a place, period of time, or situation) without much activity, disturbance, or excitement. <i>A quiet life.</i>
relaxed	Free from tension and anxiety. <i>Gave the impression of being quite relaxed.</i>
relaxing	Reducing tension or anxiety. <i>A relaxing massage with aromatherapy oils.</i>
reposeful	Having a calm and soothing quality; tranquil. <i>A reposeful haven.</i>
<u>soothing</u>	Having a gently calming effect. <i>Almond oil is renowned for its soothing properties.</i>
<u>tranquil</u>	Free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>The sea was tranquil.</i>
<u>undisturbed</u>	Untroubled by interference or disturbance. <i>A quiet weekend of undisturbed tranquillity.</i>
unhurried	Capable of accepting delay with equanimity. <i>The singing is unhurried.</i>
untroubled	Free from turmoil or worries. <i>Untroubled sleep.</i>

calm

Make calm or still.

*Spoke in a **calm** voice.*

calming

The act of appeasing (as by acceding to the demands of.

calmly

In a sedate manner.

*He spoke slowly and **calmly**.*

calmness

The state or condition of being free from disturbance or violent activity.

*Those who worked with him refer time and again to his **calmness** under pressure.*

composed

Serenely self-possessed and free from agitation especially in times of stress.

*I felt calm and more **composed** than I had in a long time.*

equanimity	Steadiness of mind under stress. <i>He accepted their problems with composure and she with equanimity.</i>
halcyon	A woman who was turned into a kingfisher. <i>The halcyon days of the clipper trade.</i>
<u>hush</u>	Make (someone) be quiet or stop talking. <i>Management took steps to hush up the dangers.</i>
<u>idyllic</u>	Excellent and delightful in all respects. <i>His idyllic life in Tahiti.</i>
<u>imperturbable</u>	Not easily perturbed or excited or upset; marked by extreme calm and composure. <i>An imperturbable tranquillity.</i>
noiseless	Accompanied by or introducing no random fluctuations that obscure the real signal or data. <i>The 4000 1 and 4000 2 use an adaptive noiseless data algorithm to compress data in real time.</i>
nonviolence	Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.
pacific	Promoting peace. <i>The pacific temper seeks to settle disputes on grounds of justice rather than by force.</i>
peaceable	Not disturbed by strife or turmoil or war. <i>In a peaceable and orderly manner.</i>
peaceful	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. <i>Peaceful sleep.</i>
peacetime	A period of time during which there is no war. <i>In peacetime regiments were billeted upon towns and villages.</i>
<u>placid</u>	Not easily upset or excited. <i>Remained placid despite the repeated delays.</i>
quiescent	(pathology) causing no symptoms. <i>The quiescent melancholy of the town.</i>
quietude	A state of peace and quiet. <i>A moment of quietude.</i>
relaxing	Reducing tension or anxiety. <i>The warm water was very relaxing.</i>
reticence	The trait of being uncommunicative; not volunteering anything more than necessary. <i>The traditional emotional reticence of the British.</i>

<u>serene</u>	Calm, peaceful, and untroubled; tranquil. <i>Serene skies and a bright blue sea.</i>
<u>serenity</u>	The state of being calm, peaceful, and untroubled. <i>An oasis of serenity amidst the bustling city.</i>
<u>stillness</u>	(poetic) tranquil silence. <i>An eerie stillness engulfed the camp.</i>
<u>tranquil</u>	Free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>The sea was tranquil.</i>
<u>tranquility</u>	A disposition free from stress or emotion.
tranquelize	Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to.
tranquillity	A state of peace and quiet. <i>Passing cars are the only noise that disturbs the tranquillity of rural life.</i>
unflappable	Having or showing calmness in a crisis. <i>Unflappable in a crisis.</i>
