*The renewing* warmth of the sunshine.
- revitalising** Tending to impart new life and vigor to.
- revitalizing** Tending to impart new life and vigor to.
- reviving** Tending to impart new life and vigor to.
- rousing** Rousing to activity or heightened action as by spurring or goading.  
*A rousing* sermon.
- salubrious** (of a place) pleasant; not run-down.  
*The salubrious* mountain air and water.
- salutary** Tending to promote physical well-being; beneficial to health.

<b>healthful</b>	Having or conducive to good health. <i><b>Healthful</b> methods of cooking vegetables.</i>
<b>inspiring</b>	Having the effect of inspiring someone. <i>The scenery is not very <b>inspiring</b>.</i>
<b>invigorating</b>	Making one feel strong, healthy, and full of energy. <i>The <b>invigorating</b> mountain air.</i>
<b>medicinal</b>	A medicinal substance. <i><b>Medicinal</b> herbs.</i>
<b>organic</b>	A food produced by organic farming. <i>Hydrocarbons are <b>organic</b> compounds.</i>
<b>pertinence</b>	Relevance by virtue of being applicable to the matter at hand.
<b>pop</b>	Heat popcorn or another foodstuff until it bursts open. <i>The man charged with murder <b>popped</b> a valium to calm his nerves.</i>
<b>proper</b>	(of a psalm, lesson, prayer, etc.) appointed for a particular day, occasion, or season. <i>A <b>proper</b> little do gooder aren't I.</i>
<b>recuperative</b>	Promoting recuperation. <i>Strongly <b>recuperative</b> remedies.</i>
<b>refreshing</b>	Imparting vitality and energy. <i>Common sense of a most <b>refreshing</b> sort.</i>

<b>salutary</b>	(especially with reference to something unwelcome or unpleasant) producing good effects; beneficial. <i>The <b>salutary</b> influence of pure air.</i>
<b>stimulating</b>	Encouraging or arousing interest or enthusiasm. <i>A rich and <b>stimulating</b> working environment.</i>
<b>strength</b>	The amount of energy transmitted (as by acoustic or electromagnetic radiation). <i>The <b>strength</b> of the drinks.</i>
<b>sturdy</b>	Showing confidence and determination. <i>The bike is <b>sturdy</b> enough to cope with bumpy tracks.</i>
<b>tonic</b>	Music the first note of a diatonic scale. <i>A <b>tonic</b> reflex.</i>
