**look back** Give a certain impression or have a certain outward aspect.

**review**      Hold a review of troops.  
*All slides were then **reviewed** by one pathologist.*



## Associations of "Retrospect" (30 Words)

<b>ago</b>	Gone by; or in the past. <i>Agone is an archaic word for ago.</i>
<b><u>anachronism</u></b>	The action of attributing something to a period to which it does not belong. <i>The town is a throwback to medieval times an <b>anachronism</b> that has survived the passing years.</i>
<b>atavism</b>	A reappearance of an earlier characteristic. <i>The more civilized a society seems to be the more susceptible it is to its buried <b>atavism</b>.</i>
<b><u>back</u></b>	At or to or toward the back or rear. <i>The <b>back</b> of a postcard.</i>
<b>backslide</b>	Drop to a lower level, as in one's morals or standards. <i>There are many things that can cause slimmers to <b>backslide</b>.</i>
<b>backward</b>	(of a fielding position) behind an imaginary line passing through the stumps at the batsman's end at right angles to the wicket. <i>Tripped when he stepped <b>backward</b>.</i>
<b>backwards</b>	At or to or toward the back or rear. <i>A step <b>backwards</b> for the economy.</i>
<b>confess</b>	Confess to God in the presence of a priest as in the Catholic faith. <i>150 people <b>confessed</b> faith in Christ.</i>
<b><u>converse</u></b>	Of words so related that one reverses the relation denoted by the other. <i>She was withdrawn and preoccupied hardly able to <b>converse</b> with her mother.</i>
<b><u>counterproductive</u></b>	Tending to hinder the achievement of a goal. <i>Child experts fear the Executive's plans may prove <b>counterproductive</b>.</i>
<b>degeneration</b>	The process of declining from a higher to a lower level of effective power or vitality or essential quality. <i>Overgrazing has caused serious <b>degeneration</b> of grassland.</i>
<b>inverse</b>	A reciprocal quantity, mathematical expression, geometric figure, etc. which is the result of inversion. <i>When the direct approach failed he tried the <b>inverse</b>.</i>

<b>inversion</b>	<p>A transformation in which each point of a given figure is replaced by another point on the same straight line from a fixed point especially in such a way that the product of the distances of the two points from the centre of inversion is constant.</p> <p><i>Administration officials admit that their new effort to deter corporate <b>inversions</b> won't actually stop the practice.</i></p>
<b>memory</b>	<p>The area of cognitive psychology that studies memory processes.</p> <p><i>Search as he would the <b>memory</b> was lost.</i></p>
<b>past</b>	<p>A past tense or form of a verb.</p> <p><i>The monuments act as guidelines through the country's colourful <b>past</b>.</i></p>
<b>posthumous</b>	<p>Occurring or coming into existence after a person's death.</p> <p><i>Newton was the <b>posthumous</b> son of an illiterate yeoman.</i></p>
<b>recall</b>	<p>Recall knowledge from memory have a recollection.</p> <p><i>The company <b>recalled</b> the product when it was found to be faulty.</i></p>
<b>regress</b>	<p>Calculate the coefficient or coefficients of regression of a variable against or on another variable.</p> <p><i>They would not <b>regress</b> to pre technological tribalism.</i></p>
<b>regression</b>	<p>A return to an earlier stage of life or a supposed previous life, especially through hypnosis.</p> <p><i><b>Regression</b> therapy.</i></p>
<b>regressive</b>	<p>Adjusted so that the rate decreases as the amount of income increases.</p> <p><i>Indirect taxes are as a group <b>regressive</b>.</i></p>
<b>relapse</b>	<p>Go back to bad behavior.</p> <p><i>He <b>relapsed</b> into silence.</i></p>
<b>retreat</b>	<p>Make a retreat from an earlier commitment or activity.</p> <p><i>The army was in <b>retreat</b>.</i></p>
<b>retroactive</b>	<p>Descriptive of any event or stimulus or process that has an effect on the effects of events or stimuli or process that occurred previously.</p> <p><i><b>Retroactive</b> tax increase.</i></p>
<b>retrograde</b>	<p>Show retrograde motion.</p> <p><i>All the planets will at some time appear to <b>retrograde</b>.</i></p>
<b>retrogression</b>	<p>Passing from a more complex to a simpler biological form.</p> <p><i>A <b>retrogression</b> to 19th century attitudes.</i></p>
<b>retrospective</b>	<p>Concerned with or related to the past.</p> <p><i><b>Retrospective</b> self justification.</i></p>

<b>return</b>	Make a return. <i>His gross income was enough that he had to file a tax <b>return</b>.</i>
<b>reversion</b>	A property to which someone has the right of reversion. <i>The <b>reversion</b> of property.</i>
<u><a href="#">revert</a></u>	Reply or respond to someone. <i>We texted both Farah and Shirish but neither of them <b>reverted</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">throwback</a></u>	A reversion to an earlier ancestral characteristic. <i>The eyes could be an ancestral <b>throwback</b>.</i>
