look back Give a certain impression or have a certain outward aspect.

review Hold a review of troops.

Associations of "Retrospect" (30 Words)

ago	Gone by; or in the past. <i>Agone is an archaic word for ago.</i>
<u>anachronism</u>	The action of attributing something to a period to which it does not belong. <i>The town is a throwback to medieval times an anachronism that has survived the passing years.</i>
atavism	A reappearance of an earlier characteristic. <i>The more civilized a society seems to be the more susceptible it is to its buried atavism.</i>
<u>back</u>	At or to or toward the back or rear. <i>The back of a postcard.</i>
backslide	Drop to a lower level, as in one's morals or standards. <i>There are many things that can cause slimmers to backslide.</i>
backward	(of a fielding position) behind an imaginary line passing through the stumps at the batsman's end at right angles to the wicket. <i>Tripped when he stepped backward.</i>
backwards	At or to or toward the back or rear. <i>A step backwards for the economy.</i>
confess	Confess to God in the presence of a priest as in the Catholic faith. <i>150 people confessed faith in Christ.</i>
<u>converse</u>	Of words so related that one reverses the relation denoted by the other. <i>She was withdrawn and preoccupied hardly able to converse with her mother.</i>
<u>counterproductive</u>	Tending to hinder the achievement of a goal. <i>Child experts fear the Executive's plans may prove counterproductive.</i>
degeneration	The process of declining from a higher to a lower level of effective power or vitality or essential quality. <i>Overgrazing has caused serious degeneration of grassland.</i>
inverse	A reciprocal quantity, mathematical expression, geometric figure, etc. which is the result of inversion. <i>When the direct approach failed he tried the inverse.</i>

inversion	<p>A transformation in which each point of a given figure is replaced by another point on the same straight line from a fixed point especially in such a way that the product of the distances of the two points from the centre of inversion is constant.</p> <p><i>Administration officials admit that their new effort to deter corporate inversions won't actually stop the practice.</i></p>
memory	<p>The area of cognitive psychology that studies memory processes.</p> <p><i>Search as he would the memory was lost.</i></p>
past	<p>A past tense or form of a verb.</p> <p><i>The monuments act as guidelines through the country's colourful past.</i></p>
posthumous	<p>Occurring or coming into existence after a person's death.</p> <p><i>Newton was the posthumous son of an illiterate yeoman.</i></p>
recall	<p>Recall knowledge from memory have a recollection.</p> <p><i>The company recalled the product when it was found to be faulty.</i></p>
regress	<p>Calculate the coefficient or coefficients of regression of a variable against or on another variable.</p> <p><i>They would not regress to pre technological tribalism.</i></p>
regression	<p>A return to an earlier stage of life or a supposed previous life, especially through hypnosis.</p> <p><i>Regression therapy.</i></p>
regressive	<p>Adjusted so that the rate decreases as the amount of income increases.</p> <p><i>Indirect taxes are as a group regressive.</i></p>
relapse	<p>Go back to bad behavior.</p> <p><i>He relapsed into silence.</i></p>
retreat	<p>Make a retreat from an earlier commitment or activity.</p> <p><i>The army was in retreat.</i></p>
retroactive	<p>Descriptive of any event or stimulus or process that has an effect on the effects of events or stimuli or process that occurred previously.</p> <p><i>Retroactive tax increase.</i></p>
retrograde	<p>Show retrograde motion.</p> <p><i>All the planets will at some time appear to retrograde.</i></p>
retrogression	<p>Passing from a more complex to a simpler biological form.</p> <p><i>A retrogression to 19th century attitudes.</i></p>
retrospective	<p>Concerned with or related to the past.</p> <p><i>Retrospective self justification.</i></p>

return	Make a return. <i>His gross income was enough that he had to file a tax return.</i>
reversion	A property to which someone has the right of reversion. <i>The reversion of property.</i>
<u>revert</u>	Reply or respond to someone. <i>We texted both Farah and Shirish but neither of them reverted.</i>
<u>throwback</u>	A reversion to an earlier ancestral characteristic. <i>The eyes could be an ancestral throwback.</i>
