Synonyms of "Reunion" as a noun (14 Words)

celebration	The public performance of a sacrament or solemn ceremony with all appropriate ritual. <i>The birth of his son was a cause for celebration.</i>
conciliation	Any of various forms of mediation whereby disputes may be settled short of arbitration. <i>He held his hands up in a gesture of conciliation.</i>
festivity	Any joyous diversion. <i>A time of great rejoicing and festivity.</i>
function	A mathematical relation such that each element of a given set the domain of the function is associated with an element of another set the range of the function. <i>Bridges perform the function of providing access across water.</i>
gathering	The act of gathering something. <i>A family gathering.</i>

jamboree	A gay festivity. <i>The film industry's annual jamboree in Cannes.</i>
reception	A formal party of people; as after a wedding. <i>A microchip that will allow parents to block reception of violent programmes.</i>
reunification	Restoration of political unity to a place or group, especially a divided territory. <i>Monetary unification precipitated the reunification of the German state in October 1990.</i>
social	An informal social gathering especially one organized by the members of a particular club or group. <i>A church social.</i>
social event	A party of people assembled to promote sociability and communal activity.
social function	A party of people assembled to promote sociability and communal activity.
social gathering	A party of people assembled to promote sociability and communal activity.
social occasion	A party of people assembled to promote sociability and communal activity.
soirée	A party of people assembled in the evening (usually at a private house).

Associations of "Reunion" (30 Words)

- affiliate** A subsidiary or subordinate organization that is affiliated with another organization.
*She **affiliates** with her colleagues.*
- alliance** A formal agreement establishing an association or alliance between nations or other groups to achieve a particular aim.
*Divisions within the **alliance**.*
- ally** A state formally cooperating with another for a military or other purpose.
*He was forced to dismiss his closest political **ally**.*
- alumnus** A graduate or former student of a particular school, college, or university.
*The Pop Idol **alumnus** revealed a hitherto hidden falsetto.*

associate	Having partial rights and privileges or subordinate status. <i>Associates in the law firm bill at a lower rate than do partners.</i>
association	The act of consorting with or joining with others. <i>An association agreement between Bulgaria and the EU.</i>
club	Go out to nightclubs. <i>Friends and colleagues clubbed together to buy him a present.</i>
collegian	A member of a college, especially within a university.
combination	A sequence of numbers or letters used to open a combination lock. <i>Underneath the picture is a safe the combination is 210319.</i>
confederacy	A group of conspirators banded together to achieve some harmful or illegal purpose. <i>The Italian confederacy known as the Lombard League.</i>
confederation	The act of forming an alliance or confederation. <i>Canada became a confederation in 1867.</i>
conjoin	Join; combine. <i>An approach which conjoins theory and method.</i>
consolidation	The action or process of combining a number of things into a single more effective or coherent whole. <i>He dropped the consolidation into the acid bath.</i>
consort	Keep company with; hang out with. <i>You chose to consort with the enemy.</i>
federate	Relating to a federated state or organization. <i>The country was federated after the civil war.</i>
friend	Add someone to a list of friends or contacts on a social networking website. <i>They are friends of the library.</i>
fusion	The merging of adjacent sounds or syllables or words. <i>Fusion cuisine.</i>
grad	A person who has received a degree from a school (high school or college or university).
graduate	A person who has successfully completed a course of study or training especially a person who has been awarded an undergraduate or first academic degree. <i>He graduated in the summer with a 2 2 degree.</i>
guild	A group of species that have similar requirements and play a similar role within a community.
integrate	Become one become integrated. <i>Cities efforts to integrate.</i>

integrated	(of an institution, body, etc.) desegregated, especially racially. <i>Society as an integrated whole.</i>
join	Cause to become joined or linked. <i>Join the paragraphs together.</i>
league	The contest for the championship of a league. <i>The leading goalscorer in the league.</i>
reunify	Restore political unity to (a place or group, especially a divided territory). <i>Will Korea reunify.</i>
reunite	Come together or cause to come together again after a period of separation or disunity. <i>Stephanie was reunited with her parents.</i>
synthesis	The process of making compound and derivative words. <i>The synthesis of methanol from carbon monoxide and hydrogen.</i>
unify	Become one. <i>Opposition groups struggling to unify around the goal of replacing the regime.</i>
union	A part of a flag with an emblem symbolizing national union typically occupying the upper corner next to the staff. <i>They live in perfect union.</i>
unite	Be or become joined or united or linked. <i>His work unites theory and practice.</i>
