## Synonyms of "Reunion" as a noun (14 Words)

<b>celebration</b>	The public performance of a sacrament or solemn ceremony with all appropriate ritual. <i>The birth of his son was a cause for <b>celebration</b>.</i>
<b>conciliation</b>	Any of various forms of mediation whereby disputes may be settled short of arbitration. <i>He held his hands up in a gesture of <b>conciliation</b>.</i>
<b>festivity</b>	Any joyous diversion. <i>A time of great rejoicing and <b>festivity</b>.</i>
<b>function</b>	A mathematical relation such that each element of a given set the domain of the function is associated with an element of another set the range of the function. <i>Bridges perform the <b>function</b> of providing access across water.</i>
<b>gathering</b>	The act of gathering something. <i>A family <b>gathering</b>.</i>

<b>jamboree</b>	A gay festivity. <i>The film industry's annual <b>jamboree</b> in Cannes.</i>
<b>reception</b>	A formal party of people; as after a wedding. <i>A microchip that will allow parents to block <b>reception</b> of violent programmes.</i>
<b>reunification</b>	Restoration of political unity to a place or group, especially a divided territory. <i>Monetary unification precipitated the <b>reunification</b> of the German state in October 1990.</i>
<b>social</b>	An informal social gathering especially one organized by the members of a particular club or group. <i>A church <b>social</b>.</i>
<b>social event</b>	A party of people assembled to promote sociability and communal activity.
<b>social function</b>	A party of people assembled to promote sociability and communal activity.
<b>social gathering</b>	A party of people assembled to promote sociability and communal activity.
<b>social occasion</b>	A party of people assembled to promote sociability and communal activity.
<b>soirée</b>	A party of people assembled in the evening (usually at a private house).

## Associations of "Reunion" (30 Words)

- affiliate** A subsidiary or subordinate organization that is affiliated with another organization.  
*She **affiliates** with her colleagues.*
- alliance** A formal agreement establishing an association or alliance between nations or other groups to achieve a particular aim.  
*Divisions within the **alliance**.*
- ally** A state formally cooperating with another for a military or other purpose.  
*He was forced to dismiss his closest political **ally**.*
- alumnus** A graduate or former student of a particular school, college, or university.  
*The Pop Idol **alumnus** revealed a hitherto hidden falsetto.*

<b>associate</b>	Having partial rights and privileges or subordinate status. <i>Associates in the law firm bill at a lower rate than do partners.</i>
<b>association</b>	The act of consorting with or joining with others. <i>An <b>association</b> agreement between Bulgaria and the EU.</i>
<b>club</b>	Go out to nightclubs. <i>Friends and colleagues <b>clubbed</b> together to buy him a present.</i>
<b>collegian</b>	A member of a college, especially within a university.
<b>combination</b>	A sequence of numbers or letters used to open a combination lock. <i>Underneath the picture is a safe the <b>combination</b> is 210319.</i>
<b>confederacy</b>	A group of conspirators banded together to achieve some harmful or illegal purpose. <i>The Italian <b>confederacy</b> known as the Lombard League.</i>
<b>confederation</b>	The act of forming an alliance or confederation. <i>Canada became a <b>confederation</b> in 1867.</i>
<b>conjoin</b>	Join; combine. <i>An approach which <b>conjoins</b> theory and method.</i>
<b>consolidation</b>	The action or process of combining a number of things into a single more effective or coherent whole. <i>He dropped the <b>consolidation</b> into the acid bath.</i>
<b>consort</b>	Keep company with; hang out with. <i>You chose to <b>consort</b> with the enemy.</i>
<b>federate</b>	Relating to a federated state or organization. <i>The country was <b>federated</b> after the civil war.</i>
<b>friend</b>	Add someone to a list of friends or contacts on a social networking website. <i>They are <b>friends</b> of the library.</i>
<b>fusion</b>	The merging of adjacent sounds or syllables or words. <i><b>Fusion</b> cuisine.</i>
<b>grad</b>	A person who has received a degree from a school (high school or college or university).
<b>graduate</b>	A person who has successfully completed a course of study or training especially a person who has been awarded an undergraduate or first academic degree. <i>He <b>graduated</b> in the summer with a 2 2 degree.</i>
<b>guild</b>	A group of species that have similar requirements and play a similar role within a community.
<b>integrate</b>	Become one become integrated. <i>Cities efforts to <b>integrate</b>.</i>

<b>integrated</b>	(of an institution, body, etc.) desegregated, especially racially. <i>Society as an <b>integrated</b> whole.</i>
<b>join</b>	Cause to become joined or linked. <i><b>Join</b> the paragraphs together.</i>
<b>league</b>	The contest for the championship of a league. <i>The leading goalscorer in the <b>league</b>.</i>
<b>reunify</b>	Restore political unity to (a place or group, especially a divided territory). <i>Will Korea <b>reunify</b>.</i>
<b>reunite</b>	Come together or cause to come together again after a period of separation or disunity. <i>Stephanie was <b>reunited</b> with her parents.</i>
<b>synthesis</b>	The process of making compound and derivative words. <i>The <b>synthesis</b> of methanol from carbon monoxide and hydrogen.</i>
<b>unify</b>	Become one. <i>Opposition groups struggling to <b>unify</b> around the goal of replacing the regime.</i>
<b>union</b>	A part of a flag with an emblem symbolizing national union typically occupying the upper corner next to the staff. <i>They live in perfect <b>union</b>.</i>
<b>unite</b>	Be or become joined or united or linked. <i>His work <b>unites</b> theory and practice.</i>
