Reunite as a Verb

Definitions of "Reunite" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “reunite” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Unify again, as of a country.*
- *Come together or cause to come together again after a period of separation or disunity.*
- *Have a reunion; unite again.*



Synonyms of "Reunite" as a verb (3 Words)

bringing (back) together (again) Induce or persuade.

reunify

Unify again, as of a country.
*Will Korea **reunify**.*

reuniting

Have a reunion; unite again.



Usage Examples of "Reunite" as a verb

- *Stephanie was reunited with her parents.*
- *The three friends reunited in 1959.*

Associations of "Reunite" (30 Words)

alliance	A formal agreement establishing an association or alliance between nations or other groups to achieve a particular aim. <i>Divisions within the alliance.</i>
<u>ally</u>	A state formally cooperating with another for a military or other purpose. <i>He was forced to dismiss his closest political ally.</i>
amalgamate	Joined together into a whole. <i>Numerous small British railway companies amalgamated.</i>
<u>annex</u>	Take (territory) as if by conquest. <i>The school s one storey wooden annex.</i>
associate	A person who joins with others in some activity or endeavor. <i>Associates in the law firm bill at a lower rate than do partners.</i>
association	The process of bringing ideas or events together in memory or imagination. <i>A bog association containing ericaceous plants.</i>
coalescing	Growing together, fusing.
combination	A sequence of numbers or letters used to open a combination lock. <i>These four factors work together in combination.</i>
combine	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>High tides and winds combined to bring chaos to the east coast.</i>
confederacy	A league or alliance, especially of confederate states. <i>The Yakuza is a secret confederacy of criminal fraternities.</i>
conjoin	Make contact or come together. <i>An approach which conjoins theory and method.</i>
connect	Make a logical or causal connection. <i>Employees are rewarded with bonuses connected to their firm s performance.</i>
<u>consolidate</u>	Combine (separate pieces of legislation) into a single legislative act. <i>Consolidate one s gains.</i>
converge	Come together so as to form a single product. <i>The aims of the two developments can and should converge.</i>

correlation	A statistic representing how closely two variables co vary it can vary from 1 perfect negative correlation through 0 no correlation to 1 perfect positive correlation. <i>Research showed a clear correlation between recession and levels of property crime.</i>
federate	Relating to a federated state or organization. <i>In 1901 the six colonies federated to form the Commonwealth of Australia.</i>
<u>fusion</u>	The process of causing a material or object to melt with intense heat so as to join with another. <i>A fusion reactor.</i>
integrate	Become one become integrated. <i>The protest forced the bus companies to integrate the buses.</i>
integrated	Formed into a whole or introduced into another entity- Dwight D.Eisenhower. <i>An integrated public transport system.</i>
join	Cause to become joined or linked. <i>Our paths joined.</i>
meet	A meeting at which a number of athletic contests are held. <i>Meet a violent death.</i>
<u>merge</u>	Mix together different elements. <i>He agreed to merge his broadcasting company with a multinational concern.</i>
<u>mingle</u>	Get involved or mixed-up with. <i>The sound of voices mingled with a scraping of chairs.</i>
return	A mechanism or key on a typewriter that returns the carriage to a fixed position at the start of a new line. <i>I ll be glad when things return to normal.</i>
reunify	Unify again, as of a country. <i>Will Korea reunify.</i>
<u>reunion</u>	A party of former associates who have come together again. <i>She had a tearful reunion with her parents.</i>
synthesis	The combination of components or elements to form a connected whole. <i>The synthesis of methanol from carbon monoxide and hydrogen.</i>
<u>unify</u>	Make or become united, uniform, or whole. <i>The government hoped to centralize and unify the nation.</i>
<u>union</u>	A trade union. <i>Lightning produced an unusual union of the metals.</i>

Be or become joined or united or linked.
