## Reuse as a Verb

### Definitions of "Reuse" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “reuse” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Use again after processing.*
- *Use again or more than once.*



## Synonyms of "Reuse" as a verb (5 Words)

**convert into something**

Complete successfully.

**reclaim**

Bring (waste land or land formerly under water) under cultivation.  
***Reclaim** falcons.*

**recover**

Get or find back recover the use of.  
*He **recovered** his balance and sped on.*

**recycle**

Use again.  
*The amino acids are **recycled** in the synthesis of other proteins.*

**reprocess**

Process (something, especially spent nuclear fuel) again or differently, typically in order to reuse it.  
*The costs of **reprocessing** radioactive waste.*





## Usage Examples of "Reuse" as a verb

- *The tape could be magnetically erased and reused.*





## Associations of "Reuse" (30 Words)

- bin** Group together data in bins.  
*A compost **bin**.*
- container** Any object that can be used to hold things (especially a large metal boxlike object of standardized dimensions that can be loaded from one form of transport to another).  
*The cakes will keep for up to two weeks if kept in an airtight **container**.*
- deniable** Able to be denied.  
*The government did agree to play a limited and **deniable** role in the rebellion.*
- detritus** Gravel, sand, silt, or other material produced by erosion.  
*The streets were foul with **detritus**.*
- discard** Anything that is cast aside or discarded.  
*West led a heart and East was able to **discard** his club loser.*

<b>discarded</b>	Thrown away. An article designed to be thrown away after use.
<b>disposable</b>	<i>The poor performer is motivated by the fear that he or she is highly <b>disposable</b>.</i>
<b>disposal</b>	The sale of shares, property, or other assets. <i><b>Disposals</b> of fixed and non current assets.</i>
<b>dispose</b>	Make receptive or willing towards an action or attitude or belief. <i>The dots are unevenly <b>disposed</b>.</i>
<b>dump</b>	A piece of land where waste materials are dumped. <i>Trucks <b>dumped</b> 1 900 tons of refuse here.</i>
<b>dumping</b>	Selling goods abroad at a price below that charged in the domestic market.
<b>filth</b>	Obscene and offensive language or printed material. <i>You and all the others like you are <b>filth</b>.</i>
<b>garbage</b>	Unwanted data in a computer's memory. <i>She tossed the moldy bread into the <b>garbage</b>.</i>
<b>incinerator</b>	An apparatus for burning waste material, especially industrial waste, at high temperatures until it is reduced to ash.
<b>jettison</b>	The action of jettisoning something. <i>The scheme was <b>jettisoned</b>.</i>
<b>junk</b>	Junk bonds. <i>I only have an hour to get all my <b>junk</b> together.</i>
<b>landfill</b>	Waste material used in landfill sites. <i>Many tons of edible food are <b>landfilled</b>.</i>
<b>litter</b>	Give birth to a litter of animals. <i>The spiders live in leaf <b>litter</b>.</i>
<b>prodigality</b>	The trait of spending extravagantly.
<b>receptacle</b>	An electrical (or electronic) fitting that is connected to a source of power and equipped to receive an insert. <i>Fast food <b>receptacles</b>.</i>
<b>recycle</b>	Use again after processing. <i>We must <b>recycle</b> the cardboard boxes.</i>
<b>recycling</b>	Used or abandoned materials for use in creating new products. <i>I forgot to take out the <b>recycling</b>.</i>
<b>refuse</b>	Refuse to let have. <i>Again the horse <b>refused</b> his nostrils flaring with fear.</i>



**rubble** Waste or rough fragments of stone, brick, concrete, etc., especially as the debris from the demolition of buildings.  
*The tower is built of stone **rubble** faced with ashlar.*

**scavenge** Clean refuse from.  
*People sell junk **scavenged** from the garbage.*

**squander** Allow (an opportunity) to pass or be lost.  
*You **squandered** the opportunity to get an advanced degree.*

**trash** Strip (sugar canes) of their outer leaves to ripen them faster.  
*Trade associations **trashed** the legislation as deficient.*

**waste** Run off as waste.  
*Hazardous industrial **wastes**.*

**wastebasket** A container with an open top; for discarded paper and other rubbish.
