Associations of "Revamped" (30 Words)

adjustment	The act of adjusting something to match a standard. <i>Only slight adjustments to the boat are necessary.</i>
amend	Make amendments to. <i>Amend your soil with peat moss or compost.</i>
constitution	The constitution written at the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia in 1787 and subsequently ratified by the original thirteen states. <i>Pregnancy had weakened her constitution.</i>
correct	Socially right or correct. <i>The materials used are as environmentally correct as possible.</i>
disabuse	Persuade (someone) that an idea or belief is mistaken. <i>He quickly disabused me of my fanciful notions.</i>
emend	Make corrections and revisions to (a text). <i>The text was emended in the second edition.</i>
emendation	The process of making a revision or correction to a text. <i>Here are some suggested emendations.</i>
factually	As a fact or based on fact. <i>His assertion is factually incorrect.</i>
fix	Decide upon or fix definitely. <i>I ll fix you up with a room.</i>
fixture	The act of putting something in working order again. <i>The team s last away fixture of the season.</i>
heal	Get healthy again. <i>His concern is to heal sick people.</i>
hunch	Sit or stand with one’s shoulders raised and the top of one’s body bent forward. <i>I have a hunch that someone is telling lies.</i>

justness	Conformity with some esthetic standard of correctness or propriety. <i>It was performed with justness and beauty.</i>
mend	Restore by replacing a part or putting together what is torn or broken. <i>Foot injuries can take months to mend.</i>
<u>mistaken</u>	Wrong in e.g. opinion or judgment. <i>Don t buy a hard bed in the mistaken belief that it is good for you.</i>
modify	Add a modifier to a constituent. <i>She may be prepared to modify her views.</i>
<u>overhaul</u>	Overtake (someone), especially in a sporting event. <i>A major overhaul of environmental policies.</i>
ratify	Approve and express assent, responsibility, or obligation. <i>Both countries were due to ratify the treaty by the end of the year.</i>
rectify	Set straight or right. <i>Rectify a curve.</i>
redress	Set upright again. <i>Those seeking redress for an infringement of public law rights.</i>
refit	Fit out again. <i>The refit of ships damaged by enemy action.</i>
<u>reform</u>	The action or process of reforming an institution or practice. <i>The lazy student promised to reform.</i>
<u>relevant</u>	Appropriate to the current time, period, or circumstances; of contemporary interest. <i>What small companies need is relevant advice.</i>
remedy	Act of correcting an error or a fault or an evil. <i>Shopping became a remedy for personal problems.</i>
repair	The action of repairing something. <i>One can never fully repair the suffering and losses of the Jews in the Third Reich.</i>
reschedule	Arrange a new scheme of repayments of (a debt). <i>We had to reschedule the doctor s appointment.</i>
revisal	The act of rewriting something.
revise	Revise or reorganize especially for the purpose of updating and improving. <i>The agency revised its procedures in as a result of the fire.</i>
<u>righteous</u>	Morally right or justifiable. <i>Righteous indignation.</i>
rightness	According with conscience or morality. <i>The rightness of that move for me.</i>
