<u>constitution</u>	The constitution written at the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia in 1787 and subsequently ratified by the original thirteen states. <i>Pregnancy had weakened her constitution</i> .
correct	Socially right or correct. The materials used are as environmentally <b>correct</b> as possible.
disabuse	Persuade (someone) that an idea or belief is mistaken. <i>He quickly <b>disabuse</b>d me of my fanciful notions.</i>
emend	Make corrections and revisions to (a text. The text was <b>emend</b> ed in the second edition.
emendation	The process of making a revision or correction to a text. <i>Here are some suggested <b>emendation</b>s.</i>
factually	As a fact or based on fact. <i>His assertion is <b>factually</b> incorrect.</i>
fix	Decide upon or fix definitely. I ll <b>fix</b> you up with a room.
fixture	The act of putting something in working order again. The team s last away <b>fixture</b> of the season.
<u>heal</u>	Get healthy again. His concern is to <b>heal</b> sick people.
hunch	Sit or stand with one's shoulders raised and the top of one's body bent forward. I have a <b>hunch</b> that someone is telling lies.



justness	Conformity with some esthetic standard of correctness or propriety. It was performed with <b>justness</b> and beauty.
mend	Restore by replacing a part or putting together what is torn or broken. <i>Foot injuries can take months to <b>mend</b>.</i>
<u>mistaken</u>	Wrong in e.g. opinion or judgment. Don t buy a hard bed in the <b>mistaken</b> belief that it is good for you.
modify	Add a modifier to a constituent. She may be prepared to <b>modify</b> her views.
<u>overhaul</u>	Overtake (someone), especially in a sporting event. A major <b>overhaul</b> of environmental policies.
ratify	Approve and express assent, responsibility, or obligation. Both countries were due to <b>ratify</b> the treaty by the end of the year.
rectify	Set straight or right. <i>Rectify</i> a curve.
redress	Set upright again. Those seeking <b>redress</b> for an infringement of public law rights.
refit	Fit out again. The <b>refit</b> of ships damaged by enemy action.
<u>reform</u>	The action or process of reforming an institution or practice. The lazy student promised to <b>reform</b> .
<u>relevant</u>	Appropriate to the current time, period, or circumstances; of contemporary interest. What small companies need is <b>relevant</b> advice.
remedy	Act of correcting an error or a fault or an evil. Shopping became a <b>remedy</b> for personal problems.
repair	The action of repairing something. One can never fully <b>repair</b> the suffering and losses of the Jews in the Third Reich.
reschedule	Arrange a new scheme of repayments of (a debt. We had to <b>reschedule</b> the doctor s appointment.
revisal	The act of rewriting something.
revise	Revise or reorganize especially for the purpose of updating and improving. The agency <b>revise</b> d its procedures in as a result of the fire.
<u>righteous</u>	Morally right or justifiable. <i>Righteous</i> indignation.
rightness	According with conscience or morality. The <b>rightness</b> of that move for me.
