## Synonyms of "Revelry" as a noun (14 Words)

- carousal** Revelry in drinking; a merry drinking party.
- carousing** Revelry in drinking; a merry drinking party.  
*A night of **carousing**.*
- celebration** A social gathering or enjoyable activity held to celebrate something.  
*A birthday **celebration**.*
- celebrations** A joyful occasion for special festivities to mark some happy event.  
*The **celebration** of marriage.*
- debauchery** Excessive indulgence in sex, alcohol, or drugs.
- festivities** Any joyous diversion.
- festivity** The celebration of something in a joyful and exuberant way.  
*A time of great rejoicing and **festivity**.*

- frolics** Gay or light-hearted recreational activity for diversion or amusement.  
*Their frolic in the surf threatened to become ugly.*
- jollification** Lively celebration with others; merrymaking.  
*He could have gone into London and enjoyed the **jollifications**.*  
A boisterous celebration; a merry festivity.
- merrymaking** *I d had my fill of **merrymaking** and decided to stay put till my headache eased.*
- parties** A band of people associated temporarily in some activity.  
*In 1992 Perot tried to organize a third party at the national level.*
- partying** A band of people associated temporarily in some activity.
- revel** Lively and noisy enjoyment, especially with drinking and dancing.  
*Late night **revels**.*
- revels** Unrestrained merrymaking.



## Usage Examples of "Revelry" as a noun

- *New Year revelries.*
- *Sounds of revelry issued into the night.*



## Associations of "Revelry" (30 Words)

- alcohol** A liquor or brew containing alcohol as the active agent.  
*It is an offence to drive if you have more than 80 mg of **alcohol** per 100 ml of blood.*
- alcoholic** Addicted to alcohol- Carl Van Doren.  
***Alcoholic** liquor.*

<b>bacchanalian</b>	Characterized by or given to drunken revelry. <i>A night of <b>bacchanalian</b> revelry.</i>
<b>beer</b>	An alcoholic drink made from yeast-fermented malt flavoured with hops. <i>He ordered a <b>beer</b>.</i>
<b>bibulous</b>	Given to or marked by the consumption of alcohol. <i>A <b>bibulous</b> fellow.</i>
<b>carousal</b>	Revelry in drinking; a merry drinking party.
<b>carouse</b>	Engage in boisterous, drunken merrymaking. <i>Corporate <b>carouses</b>.</i>
<b>celebration</b>	A social gathering or enjoyable activity held to celebrate something. <i>The birth of his son was a cause for <b>celebration</b>.</i>
<b>drink</b>	A social gathering at which alcoholic drinks are served. <i>The children like to <b>drink</b> soda.</i>
<b>drunken</b>	Caused by or showing the effects of drink. <i>Gangs of <b>drunken</b> youths roamed the streets.</i>
<b>feast</b>	Partake in a feast or banquet. <i>A <b>feast</b> day.</i>
<b>guzzle</b>	Drink greedily or as if with great thirst. <i>The boys <b>guzzled</b> the cheap vodka.</i>
<b>inebriate</b>	A drunkard. <i>He was <b>inebriated</b> by his phenomenal success.</i>
<b>inebriated</b>	Stupefied or excited by a chemical substance (especially alcohol). <i>I got mildly <b>inebriated</b>.</i>
<b>inebriety</b>	A temporary state resulting from excessive consumption of alcohol. <i>The ravages of <b>inebriety</b>.</i>
<b>intoxicate</b>	Have an intoxicating effect on, of a drug. <i>Van Gogh went to Provence where he was <b>intoxicated</b> by the Mediterranean sunlight.</i>
<b>intoxicated</b>	As if under the influence of alcohol. <i>A noisy crowd of <b>intoxicated</b> sailors.</i>
<b>liquor</b>	Steep (something, especially malt) in water. <i>Waste <b>liquors</b>.</i>
<b>oaf</b>	An awkward stupid person. <i>They are just big clumsy <b>oafs</b>.</i>
<b>plastered</b>	Covered with or made of plaster. <i>Coarsely <b>plastered</b> brickwork.</i>

<b>reveler</b>	A celebrant who shares in a noisy party. <i>The clubs attract <b>revelers</b> as young as thirteen.</i>
<b>sip</b>	Drink in sips. <i>She took a <b>sip</b> of the red wine.</i>
<b>sober</b>	Become sober after excessive alcohol consumption. <i>A <b>sober</b> grey suit.</i>
<b>spree</b>	Take part in a spree. <i>A shopping <b>spree</b>.</i>
<b>tipple</b>	Drink moderately but regularly. <i>Those who liked to <b>tipple</b> and gamble.</i>
<b>tipsy</b>	Slightly drunk. <i>A <b>tipsy</b> boat.</i>
