jollification Lively celebration with others; merrymaking.

partiesA band of people associated temporarily in some activity.

In 1992 Perot tried to organize a third party at the national level.

partying A band of people associated temporarily in some activity.

Lively and noisy enjoyment, especially with drinking and dancing.

Late night **revel**s.


revels Unrestrained merrymaking.

of blood.

alcoholic Addicted to alcohol- Carl Van Doren.

Alcoholic liquor.



bacchanalian Characterized by or given to drunken revelry.

A night of **bacchanalian** revelry.

beer An alcoholic drink made from yeast-fermented malt flavoured with hops.

He ordered a **beer**.

bibulous Given to or marked by the consumption of alcohol.

A **bibulous** fellow.

carousal Revelry in drinking; a merry drinking party.

carouse Engage in boisterous, drunken merrymaking.

Corporate carouses.

celebration A social gathering or enjoyable activity held to celebrate something.

The birth of his son was a cause for **celebration**.

drink

A social gathering at which alcoholic drinks are served.

The children like to **drink** soda.

drunken Caused by or showing the effects of drink.

Gangs of **drunken** youths roamed the streets.

Partake in a feast or banquet.

A feast day.

guzzle Drink greedily or as if with great thirst.

The boys **quzzle**d the cheap vodka.

inebriate A drunkard.

He was **inebriate**d by his phenomenal success.

inebriated Stupefied or excited by a chemical substance (especially alcohol.

I got mildly **inebriated**.

inebriety A temporary state resulting from excessive consumption of alcohol.

The ravages of **inebriety**.

Have an intoxicating effect on, of a drug.

intoxicate Van Gogh went to Provence where he was **intoxicate**d by the

Mediterranean sunlight.

intoxicated As if under the influence of alcohol.

A noisy crowd of **intoxicated** sailors.

liquor Steep (something, especially malt) in water.

Waste **liquor**s.

oaf An awkward stupid person.

They are just big clumsy **oaf**s.

plastered Covered with or made of plaster.

Coarsely **plastered** brickwork.



reveler A celebrant who shares in a noisy party.

The clubs attract **reveler**s as young as thirteen.

Drink in sips.

She took a **sip** of the red wine.

sober Become sober after excessive alcohol consumption.

A **sober** grey suit.

spree Take part in a spree.

A shopping **spree**.

tipple Drink moderately but regularly.

Those who liked to **tipple** and gamble.

Slightly drunk. *A tipsy boat.*
