Definitions of "Revenue" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “revenue” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Government income due to taxation.*
- *A state's annual income from which public expenses are met.*
- *Income, especially when of an organization and of a substantial nature.*
- *The department of the civil service collecting state revenue.*
- *The entire amount of income before any deductions are made.*



Synonyms of "Revenue" as a noun (9 Words)

earnings	The excess of revenues over outlays in a given period of time (including depreciation and other non-cash expenses). <i>He claimed damages for loss of earnings.</i>
gross	A gross profit or income. <i>The box office grosses mounted.</i>
<u>income</u>	Money received, especially on a regular basis, for work or through investments. <i>He has a nice home and an adequate income.</i>
proceeds	Money obtained from an event or activity. <i>Proceeds from the event will go to aid the work of the charity.</i>
receipts	The act of receiving.
takings	The act of someone who picks up or takes something.
tax income	Charge against a citizen's person or property or activity for the support of government.
tax revenue	Charge against a citizen's person or property or activity for the support of government.
taxation	Government income due to taxation. <i>Direct taxation was low.</i>



Usage Examples of "Revenue" as a noun

- *The government's tax revenues.*
- *His priority was to raise government revenue and to lower expenditure.*
- *Traders have lost £10,000 in revenue since the traffic scheme was implemented.*
- *When the revenue makes a demand for tax, that demand is implicitly backed by the powers of the state.*

acquire	Come to have or undergo a change of (physical features and attributes). <i>I've acquired a taste for whisky.</i>
bonus	An extra dividend or issue paid to the shareholders of a company. <i>Good weather is an added bonus but the real appeal is the landscape.</i>
boom	Hit hard. <i>Thunder boomed in the sky.</i>
buyer	A person who buys.
cash	Exchange for cash. <i>The bank cashed her cheque.</i>
customs	Money collected under a tariff. <i>From 1374 Chaucer worked as controller of customs on wool in the port of London.</i>
dividend	An individual's share of a dividend. <i>Buying a rail pass may still pay dividends.</i>

duty	The measure of an engine's effectiveness in units of work done per unit of fuel. <i>A 6 per cent duty on imports.</i>
earn	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>The dollars can be placed on deposit and earn interest.</i>
earnings	Money obtained in return for labour or services. <i>Export earnings.</i>
gain	The advantageous quality of being beneficial. <i>The pursuit of personal gain.</i>
gross	A gross profit or income. <i>The gross details of the structure appear reasonable.</i>
income	Money received, especially on a regular basis, for work or through investments. <i>Figures showed an overall increase in income this year.</i>
overpayment	The act of paying too much. <i>He received 20 000 in benefit overpayments.</i>
paycheck	A check issued in payment of wages or salary.
payroll	The total amount of wages paid by a company. <i>The company had a large payroll.</i>
procure	Arrange for sexual partners for others. <i>He persuaded a friend to procure him a ticket.</i>
profitability	The degree to which a business or activity yields profit or financial gain. <i>Profitability may not improve until well into next year.</i>
purchaser	A person who buys something; a buyer. <i>One of the club s prospective purchasers.</i>
rates	A local tax on property (usually used in the plural).
redistribute	Distribute anew. <i>Their primary concern was to redistribute income from rich to poor.</i>
redistribution	Distributing again. <i>The revolution resulted in a redistribution of wealth.</i>
sales	Income (at invoice values) received for goods and services over some given period of time.
spending	The act of spending or disbursing money.
tariff	A list of import or export tariffs. <i>The reduction of trade barriers and import tariffs.</i>
tax	Pay tax on something especially a vehicle. <i>Why are you taxing me with these preposterous allegations.</i>

- taxation** Government income due to taxation.
*It should be financed out of **taxation**.*
- turnover** The act of upsetting something.
*The team were sitting on their lead and taking care to avoid **turnovers**.*
- vat** Place or treat in a vat.
*A **vat** of hot tar.*
- wage** Carry on (a war or campaign).
*Napoleon and Hitler **waged** war against all of Europe.*
