Definitions of "Reverent" as an adjective

- *Feeling or showing deep and solemn respect.*

- admiring** Characterized by or expressive of admiration or warm approval.
*The snowman has drawn many an **admiring** glance from villagers.*
- adoring** Feeling or expressing deep affection, love, or admiration.
*A gift from an **adoring** fan.*
- awed** Having or showing a feeling of mixed reverence and respect and wonder and dread.
*I watched her in **awed** silence.*
- devoted** (followed by `to`) dedicated exclusively to a purpose or use.
*A life **devoted** to poetry.*
- devout** Having or showing deep religious feeling or commitment.
***Devout** wishes for their success.*

- dutiful** Motivated by duty rather than desire or enthusiasm.
*A **dutiful** daughter.*
- godly** Emanating from God-Saturday Review.
*Leading a **godly** life.*
- loving** Feeling or showing love or great care.
*The cargo was described in **loving** detail.*
- respectful** Feeling or manifesting veneration.
*A **respectful** glance.*
- reverential** Feeling or manifesting veneration.
*Their names are always mentioned in **reverential** tones.*
- worshipful** Used in titles given to justices of the peace and to certain old companies or their officers.
*Her voice was full of **worshipful** admiration.*

Associations of "Reverent" (30 Words)

adoring	Showing adoration. <i>A gift from an adoring fan.</i>
<u>baptism</u>	A ceremony or occasion at which baptism takes place. <i>This event constituted his baptism as a politician.</i>
believing	The cognitive process that leads to convictions. <i>Seeing is believing.</i>
<u>credo</u>	A creed of the Christian Church in Latin. <i>He announced his credo in his first editorial.</i>
dedicated	Solemnly dedicated to or set apart for a high or sacred purpose. <i>A dedicated high speed rail link from the Channel Tunnel.</i>
<u>deference</u>	A disposition or tendency to yield to the will of others. <i>His deference to her wishes was very flattering.</i>

devout	Earnest. <i>Devout wishes for their success.</i>
esteem	An attitude of admiration or esteem. <i>I should esteem it a favour if you could speak to them.</i>
fanatically	In a passionately fanatic manner.
homage	Respectful deference. <i>Daniel s films were a homage to her.</i>
honor	Bestow honor or rewards upon. <i>A man of honor.</i>
martyrdom	A display of pretended or exaggerated suffering to obtain sympathy. <i>The martyrdom of St Anthony.</i>
obeisance	Bending the head or body or knee as a sign of reverence or submission or shame or greeting. <i>She made a deep obeisance.</i>
obey	Behave in accordance with (a general principle, natural law, etc). <i>I always obey my father.</i>
pharisaic	Excessively or hypocritically pious.
pilgrimage	Go on a pilgrimage. <i>His passion was opera and he made annual pilgrimages to Bayreuth.</i>
pious	Making or constituting a hypocritical display of virtue. <i>Pious readings.</i>
proselyte	A new convert; especially a gentile converted to Judaism.
religious	A member of a religious order who is bound by vows of poverty and chastity and obedience. <i>I have a religious aversion to reading manuals.</i>
respect	The state of being admired or respected. <i>It differs in that respect.</i>
respectful	Feeling or showing deference and respect. <i>They sit in respectful silence.</i>
reverential	Feeling or manifesting veneration. <i>Their names are always mentioned in reverential tones.</i>
sacrament	(in Roman Catholic use) the consecrated elements of the Eucharist, especially the bread or Host. <i>He heard Mass and received the sacrament.</i>
saintly	Very holy or virtuous. <i>A truly saintly woman.</i>

- sanctimonious** Excessively or hypocritically pious.
*A sickening **sanctimonious** smile.*
- shrine** Enshrine.
*Her grave has become a **shrine** for fans from all over the world.*
- synagogue** The place of worship for a Jewish congregation.
- theism** Belief in the existence of a god or gods, specifically of a creator who intervenes in the universe.
*There are many different forms of **theism**.*
- veneration** Religious zeal; the willingness to serve God.
*His respect for the law bordered on **veneration**.*
- worship** The activity of worshipping.
*She adores her sons and they **worship** her.*
