
# Reverent as an Adjective

devout Having or showing deep religious feeling or commitment.

**Devout** wishes for their success.



**dutiful** Motivated by duty rather than desire or enthusiasm.

A dutiful daughter.

**godly** Emanating from God-Saturday Review.

Leading a **godly** life.

**loving**Feeling or showing love or great care.

The cargo was described in **loving** detail.

respectful Feeling or manifesting veneration.

A respectful glance.

reverential Feeling or manifesting veneration.

Their names are always mentioned in **reverential** tones.

Used in titles given to justices of the peace and to certain old companies or

worshipful their officers.

Her voice was full of worshipful admiration.
