admiring	Characterized by or expressive of admiration or warm approval. <i>The snowman has drawn many an admiring glance from villagers.</i>
adoring	Extravagantly or foolishly loving and indulgent. <i>A gift from an adoring fan.</i>
awed	Having or showing a feeling of mixed reverence and respect and wonder and dread. <i>Awed by the silence.</i>
devoted	Zealous in devotion or affection. <i>A devoted husband and father.</i>
devout	Earnest. <i>Devout wishes for their success.</i>

dutiful	Conscientiously or obediently fulfilling one's duty. <i>A dutiful daughter.</i>
loving	Feeling or showing love or great care. <i>A loving father.</i>
respectful	Feeling or showing deference and respect. <i>They sit in respectful silence.</i>
venerating	Feeling or manifesting veneration.
<u>worshipful</u>	Showing adoration. <i>Her voice was full of worshipful admiration.</i>

adoring	Feeling or expressing deep affection, love, or admiration. <i>Adoring grandparents.</i>
atheistic	Related to or characterized by or given to atheism. <i>Some were preoccupied with God others were atheistic to the core.</i>
believing	The cognitive process that leads to convictions. <i>Seeing is believing.</i>
buddhist	Of or relating to or supporting Buddhism.
<u>credo</u>	A creed of the Christian Church in Latin. <i>He announced his credo in his first editorial.</i>
<u>creed</u>	The written body of teachings of a religious group that are generally accepted by that group. <i>People of many creeds and cultures.</i>
dedicated	Solemnly dedicated to or set apart for a high or sacred purpose. <i>Dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal.</i>
deist	A person who believes that God created the universe and then abandoned it.
<u>denomination</u>	The face value of a banknote, coin, or postage stamp. <i>High denomination banknotes.</i>
<u>devout</u>	Deeply religious H.L.Mencken. <i>The most devout environmentalist.</i>

godly	Emanating from God. <i>How to live the godly life.</i>
holy	Belonging to or derived from or associated with a divine power. <i>The holy month of Ramadan.</i>
homage	Respectful deference. <i>Many villagers come here to pay homage to the Virgin.</i>
martyrdom	The death or suffering of a martyr. <i>You know martyrdom isn't my style.</i>
obey	Submit to the authority of (someone) or comply with (a law). <i>The officer was convicted for refusing to obey orders.</i>
pharisaic	Excessively or hypocritically pious.
pilgrim	Travel or wander like a pilgrim. <i>Thousands of pilgrims converged in Memphis for the 16th anniversary of Presley's death.</i>
pilgrimage	Go on a pilgrimage. <i>Thousands pilgrimage there every year.</i>
pious	Devoutly religious. <i>A deeply pious woman.</i>
religious	A member of a religious order who is bound by vows of poverty and chastity and obedience. <i>Religious attitude.</i>
respectful	Feeling or showing deference and respect. <i>They sit in respectful silence.</i>
reverent	Feeling or showing deep and solemn respect. <i>A reverent silence.</i>
sacrament	(in Roman Catholic use) the consecrated elements of the Eucharist, especially the bread or Host. <i>They used peyote as a sacrament.</i>
saintly	Very holy or virtuous. <i>A saintly concern for his fellow men.</i>
sanctimonious	Excessively or hypocritically pious. <i>What happened to all the sanctimonious talk about putting his family first.</i>
shrine	Enclose in a shrine. <i>A goddess shrined in every tree.</i>
spirit	Infuse with spirit. <i>As I sat alone in that corridor my spirits were low.</i>

synagogue

The building where a Jewish assembly or congregation meets for religious worship and instruction.

theism

The doctrine or belief in the existence of a God or gods.

*There are many different forms of **theism**.*

worship

The activity of worshipping.

*She adores her sons and they **worship** her.*
