
Ridiculousness as a Noun

Broadly or extravagantly humorous; resembling farce. farcical

A **farcical** situation.

Fool or hoax. fool

She had been **fool**ing herself in thinking she could remain indifferent.

Lacking good sense or judgement; unwise. foolish

Foolish remarks.

Not as expected. funny

The **funny** thing is I can t remember much about it.

Having or displaying protruding or crooked front teeth. goofy

A **goofy** grin.

Having a mental age of three to seven years. idiotic

An **idiotic** idea.

Lacking in correct logical relation. illogical An **illogical** fear of the supernatural.

Not prudent or wise; not recommended. inadvisable

It would be **inadvisable** to involve more than one architect.

The quality of disagreeing; being unsuitable and inappropriate. incongruity

The **incongruity** of his fleshy face and skinny body disturbed her.

Lacking in harmony or compatibility or appropriateness. **incongruous**

Incongruous behavior.

An irrational number or quantity a surd. irrational

Irrational feelings of hostility. Arousing or provoking laughter.

<u>laughable</u> A contribution so small as to be **laughable**.

Broadly or extravagantly humorous; resembling farce. **ludicrous**

It is **ludicrous** to call a cottage a mansion.

Abusing vocally; expressing contempt or ridicule.

mocking He got jeers and **mocking** laughter as he addressed the marchers.

Spoken or written words that have no meaning or make no sense.

nonsense She s a strong woman who stands no **nonsense**.

A person who is gullible and easy to take advantage of. patsy

There is a mischievous sparkle in his eyes that suggests he is no **patsy**.

So unreasonable as to invite derision.

preposterous A **preposterous** attempt to turn back the pages of history.



risible Provoking laughter through being ludicrous.

A risible scene of lovemaking in a tent.

satiric Exposing human folly to ridicule.

A persistent campaign of mockery by the **satiric**al fortnightly magazine.

A foolish person (often used as a form of address.

He would brood about **silly** things.

skit A short theatrical episode.

A **skit** on daytime magazine programmes.

unreasonable Shakmay shawas hai

She knew she was being **unreasonable** but she resented his domesticity.

Showing or resulting from lack of judgment or wisdom.

unwise It is unwise to rely on hearsay evidence.
