- A crack, split, or break in something.
- A serious break in friendly relations.
- A major fault separating blocks of the earth's surface; a rift valley.
- A gap between cloud masses.
- A narrow fissure in rock.
- A personal or social separation (as between opposing factions.





# Synonyms of "Rift" as a noun (23 Words)

aperture	An opening, hole, or gap. A refracting telescope with an <b>aperture</b> of 3 inches.
breach	An opening (especially a gap in a dike or fortification. A <b>breach</b> in the mountain wall.
break	Breaking of hard tissue such as bone. <i>He finally got his big <b>break</b>.</i>
cavity	A decayed part of a tooth. <i>The abdominal <b>cavity</b>.</i>
cleft	A long narrow opening.
cranny	A long narrow depression in a surface. Bugs and spiders conceal themselves in crannies of the bark.



<u>crevice</u>	A narrow opening or fissure, especially in a rock or wall. Many creatures hide in <b>crevice</b> s in the rock.
division	Biology a group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. A growing sense of <b>division</b> between north and south.
<u>fault</u>	A misguided action or habit. He knew his own <b>fault</b> s much better than she did.
fissure	(anatomy) a long narrow slit or groove that divides an organ into lobes. The bacteria survive around vents or <b>fissure</b> s in the deep ocean floor.
flaw	A mark, blemish, or other imperfection which mars a substance or object. A <b>flaw</b> caused the crystal to shatter.
<u>fracture</u>	A diphthong substituted by fracture. <i>Obsidian shows a conchoidal <b>fracture</b></i> .
gap	A narrow opening. There are many <b>gap</b> s in our understanding of what happened.
hole	A cavity or receptacle on a golf course, typically one of eighteen or nine, into which the ball must be hit. The dog had dug a <b>hole</b> in the ground.
interstice	An intervening space, especially a very small one. Sunshine filtered through the <b>interstice</b> s of the arching trees.
opening	The act of opening something. The <b>opening</b> of his arms was the sign I was waiting for.
<u>rupture</u>	An instance of breaking or bursting suddenly and completely. <i>The patient died after <b>rupture</b> of an aneurysm.</i>
severance	A personal or social separation (as between opposing factions. The <b>severance</b> and disestablishment of the Irish Church.
slit	A long narrow opening. Make a <b>slit</b> in the stem under a bud.
space	Each of the four gaps between the five lines of a stave. It all happened in the <b>space</b> of 10 minutes.
<u>split</u>	A thing that is divided or split. <i>He was winning until he got a <b>split</b> in the tenth frame.</i>






### Usage Examples of "Rift" as a noun

- The wind had torn open a rift in the clouds.





# Associations of "Rift" (30 Words)

<u>chasm</u>	A deep opening in the earth's surface. A <b>chasm</b> a mile long.
clamber	An awkward and laborious climb or movement. A <b>clamber</b> up the cliff path.
conflict	Be in conflict. Parents and children s interests sometimes <b>conflict</b> .
cracked	(of a person's voice) having an unusual harshness or pitch, especially through strain. <i>The captain was screaming orders in a cracked baritone.</i>
deep	A deep part of the sea. The <b>deep</b> s of her imagination.
detachment	A group of troops, aircraft, or ships sent away on a separate mission. <i>He felt a sense of <b>detachment</b> from what was going on.</i>



<u>dissolution</u>	The termination or disintegration of a relationship (between persons or nations. The <b>dissolution</b> of the flesh.
<u>diverge</u>	(of a road, route, or line) separate from another route and go in a different direction. <i>Their ways had <b>diverge</b>d at university.</i>
<u>divergence</u>	A difference in opinions, interests, etc. A fundamental <b>divergence</b> of attitude.
divergent	(of a series) increasing indefinitely as more of its terms are added. A <b>divergent</b> opinion.
<u>divide</u>	A difference or disagreement between two groups, typically producing tension. Consumer magazines can be <b>divide</b> d into a number of categories.
division	A group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. The <b>division</b> of the land into small fields.
fissure	Break into fissures or fine cracks. The dry years had cracked and <b>fissure</b> d the cliffs.
incised	Cut into with a sharp instrument. An <b>incised</b> design.
irreconcilable	Incapable of being resolved. <i>Irreconcilable</i> differences.
partition	The act of dividing or partitioning separation by the creation of a boundary that divides or keeps apart. The country s <b>partition</b> into separate states.
purification	The act of purging of sin or guilt; moral or spiritual cleansing. <b>Purification</b> of the mind through reflection and contemplation.
ravine	A deep, narrow gorge with steep sides.
<u>rupture</u>	Breach or disturb (a harmonious feeling or situation. Once trust and confidence has been <b>rupture</b> d it can be difficult to regain.
schism	The formal separation of a church into two churches or the withdrawal of one group over doctrinal differences. The widening <b>schism</b> between Church leaders and politicians.
segregation	The separation of paired alleles during meiosis so that members of each pair of alleles appear in different gametes. An official policy of racial <b>segregation</b> .
<u>separation</u>	The state of lacking unity. The damage that might arise from the <b>separation</b> of parents and children.



severance	The act of severing. Employees were offered <b>severance</b> terms.
<u>split</u>	A thing that is divided or split. My friend and I <b>split</b> up.
sunder	Split apart. A universe <b>sunder</b> ed ages ago in a divine war.
tigris	An Asian river; a tributary of the Euphrates River.
<u>vale</u>	A valley (used in place names or as a poetic term. <i>The <b>Vale</b> of Glamorgan.</i>
<u>valley</u>	A low area of land between hills or mountains, typically with a river or stream flowing through it. <i>The valley floor.</i>
