| <b>deactivation</b> | Breaking up a military unit (by transfers or discharges).   |
| <b>defraud</b>      | Illegally obtain money from (someone) by deception.<br><i>She <b>defrauded</b> the customers who trusted her.</i>   |
| <b>disorganized</b> | Not properly planned and controlled.<br><i>She s very muddled and <b>disorganized</b>.</i>  |
| <b>echelon</b>      | Arrange in an echelon formation.<br><i>The rear <b>echelon</b>.</i>   |
| <b>equip</b>        | Supply with the necessary items for a particular purpose.<br><i>She was never <b>equipped</b> to be a dancer.</i>   |
| <b>furnish</b>      | Be a source of; provide.<br><i>Fish <b>furnish</b> an important source of protein.</i>  |
| <b>intercom</b>     | An electrical device allowing one-way or two-way communication.<br><i>The pilot s voice comes over the <b>intercom</b>.</i>                                       |

| <b>logistics</b>          | Handling an operation that involves providing labor and materials be supplied as needed.<br><i>The <b>logistics</b> of a large scale rock show demand certain necessities.</i> |
| <b>ordered</b>            | Marked by an orderly, logical, and aesthetically consistent relation of parts.<br><i>An <b>ordered</b> sequence.</i>   |
| <b>ordering</b>           | Logical or comprehensible arrangement of separate elements.<br><i>There were mistakes in the <b>ordering</b> of items on the list.</i>   |
| <b><u>perpetrate</u></b>  | Perform an act, usually with a negative connotation.<br><i>A crime has been <b>perpetrated</b> against a sovereign state.</i>  |
| <b>preparation</b>        | A note that produces a dissonant chord is first heard in a consonant chord.<br><i>A microscope <b>preparation</b>.</i>   |
| <b><u>prepare</u></b>     | Prepare for eating by applying heat.<br><i><b>Prepare</b> a brief summary of the article.</i>  |
| <b>prepared</b>           | Equipped or prepared with necessary intellectual resources.<br><i>He paints over the <b>prepared</b> canvas with brown acrylic to bring out the cracks.</i>                    |
| <b><u>procurement</u></b> | The action of obtaining or procuring something.<br><i>The company s <b>procurements</b> from foreign firms.</i>  |
| <b>provide</b>            | Make a possibility or provide opportunity for permit to be attainable or cause to remain.<br><i><b>Provide</b> for the proper care of the passengers on the cruise ship.</i>   |
| <b>purposely</b>          | With intention; in an intentional manner.<br><i>She had <b>purposely</b> made it difficult.</i>  |
| <b>scam</b>               | A dishonest scheme; a fraud.<br><i>An insurance <b>scam</b>.</i>   |
| <b>scheme</b>             | Devise a system or form a scheme for.<br><i>He <b>schemed</b> to bring about the collapse of the government.</i>   |
| <b>setup</b>              | Equipment designed to serve a specific function.<br><i>It takes time to learn the <b>setup</b> around here.</i>  |
| <b>standby</b>            | Something that can be relied on when needed.<br><i>Passengers were obliged to go on <b>standby</b>.</i>  |
| <b>swindle</b>            | Obtain (money) fraudulently.<br><i>A businessman <b>swindled</b> investors out of millions of pounds.</i>  |
| <b>trick</b>              | A cunning or deceitful action or device.<br><i>I thought I saw a flicker of emotion but it was probably a <b>trick</b> of the light.</i>                                       |
