| acknowledgement | Recognition of the importance or quality of something. <i>He received an award in acknowledgement of his work.</i> |
| applicable | Capable of being applied; having relevance. <i>Gave applicable examples to support her argument.</i> |
| apposite | Being of striking appropriateness and pertinence. <i>The successful copywriter is a master of apposite and evocative verbal images.</i> |
| appropriate | Take (something) for one's own use, typically without the owner's permission. <i>It seems that an apology is appropriate.</i> |
| apropos | At an opportune time. <i>The song feels apropos to a midnight jaunt.</i> |
| apt | Being of striking appropriateness and pertinence. <i>An apt pupil.</i> |
| barely | By a little. <i>The network has barely 5 percent of viewers.</i> |
| befitting | Appropriate to. <i>Behavior befitting a father.</i> |
| coincidentally | At the same time. <i>The three are coincidentally reunited when captured by the enemy.</i> |
| correct | Socially right or correct. <i>The Council issued a statement correcting some points in the press reports.</i> |
| corrective | Tending or intended to correct or counteract or restore to a normal condition. <i>Corrective lenses.</i> |

| desirability | Attractiveness to the opposite sex. <i>We agree on the desirability of a negotiated settlement.</i> |
| felicitous | Marked by good fortune. <i>A felicitous life.</i> |
| fitting | Being precisely fitting and right. <i>Little remains of the house's Victorian fittings.</i> |
| germane | Relevant to a subject under consideration. <i>That is not germane to our theme.</i> |
| handed | Having or involving the use of hands. <i>A four handed card game.</i> |
| just | Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>Just a scratch.</i> |
| justification | The act of defending or explaining or making excuses for by reasoning. <i>The justification of revolutionary action.</i> |
| justness | Conformity with some esthetic standard of correctness or propriety. <i>It was performed with justness and beauty.</i> |
| mistaken | Wrong in one's opinion or judgement. <i>A mistaken belief.</i> |
| opportune | (of a time) especially convenient or appropriate for a particular action or event. <i>The opportune use of humour to lower tension.</i> |
| pertinence | Relevance by virtue of being applicable to the matter at hand. |
| pertinent | Being of striking appropriateness and pertinence. <i>A list of articles pertinent to the discussion.</i> |
| proper | The part of a church service that varies with the season or feast. <i>Proper medical treatment.</i> |
| relevant | Closely connected or appropriate to what is being done or considered. <i>The candidate's experience is relevant to the job.</i> |
| righteous | Correctly so called; genuine. <i>Victory in battle was conferred on the righteous.</i> |
| rightness | The quality or state of being true or correct as a fact. <i>The rightness of that move for me.</i> |
| scarcely | Only a very short time before. <i>Her voice is so low I can scarcely hear what she is saying.</i> |
| timely | At an opportune time. <i>A timely warning.</i> |
