<b>reflection</b>	(mathematics) a transformation in which the direction of one axis is reversed. <i><b>Reflections</b> on human destiny and art.</i>
<b>reiteration</b>	The act of repeating over and again (or an instance thereof). <i>A simple <b>reiteration</b> of the plots of classic episodes.</i>
<b>repeat</b>	A mark indicating a passage to be repeated. <i>She goes home alone to TV dinners and <b>repeats</b> of I Love Lucy.</i>

<b>resonance</b>	The quality in a sound of being deep, full, and reverberating. <i>The concepts lose their emotional <b>resonance</b>.</i>
<b>reverberance</b>	Having the character of a loud deep sound; the quality of being resonant.
<b>reverberation</b>	Prolongation of a sound; resonance. <i>The attack has had <b>reverberations</b> around the world.</i>
<b>ring</b>	The sound of a bell ringing E A Poe. <i>A diamond <b>ring</b>.</i>
<b>sonority</b>	Having the character of a loud deep sound; the quality of being resonant. <i>Bee has greater <b>sonority</b> than pin.</i>
<b>sonorousness</b>	Having the character of a loud deep sound; the quality of being resonant.
<b>tintinnabulation</b>	The sound of a bell ringing. <i>The tiny <b>tintinnabulation</b> faint as fairy bells.</i>
<b>vibrancy</b>	The state of being full of energy and life. <i>Her eyes seemed to radiate the <b>vibrancy</b> of youth.</i>



### Usage Examples of "Ringing" as a noun

- *The tintinnabulation that so voluminously swells from the ringing and the dinging of the bells.*
- *She was woken by the ringing of the phone.*
- *The ringing of fire alarms.*
- *A ringing in her ears.*

## Synonyms of "Ringing" as an adjective (24 Words)

<b>blaring</b>	Unpleasantly loud and penetrating. <i>The <b>blaring</b> noise of trumpets.</i>
<b>blasting</b>	Unpleasantly loud and penetrating. <i>The <b>blasting</b> effects of the intense cold on the budding fruit.</i>
<b>booming</b>	(used of the voice or sound) deep and resonant. <i>A <b>booming</b> kick from the touchline.</i>
<b>clamorous</b>	Conspicuously and offensively loud; given to vehement outcry. <i>A <b>clamorous</b> uproar.</i>
<b>clear</b>	Clear and distinct to the senses easily perceptible. <i>In the morning with a <b>clear</b> head she would tackle all her problems.</i>
<b>deafening</b>	Loud enough to cause (temporary) hearing loss. <i>The music reached a <b>deafening</b> crescendo.</i>
<b>deep</b>	Relatively deep or strong affecting one deeply. <i><b>Deep</b> cuts in the budget.</i>

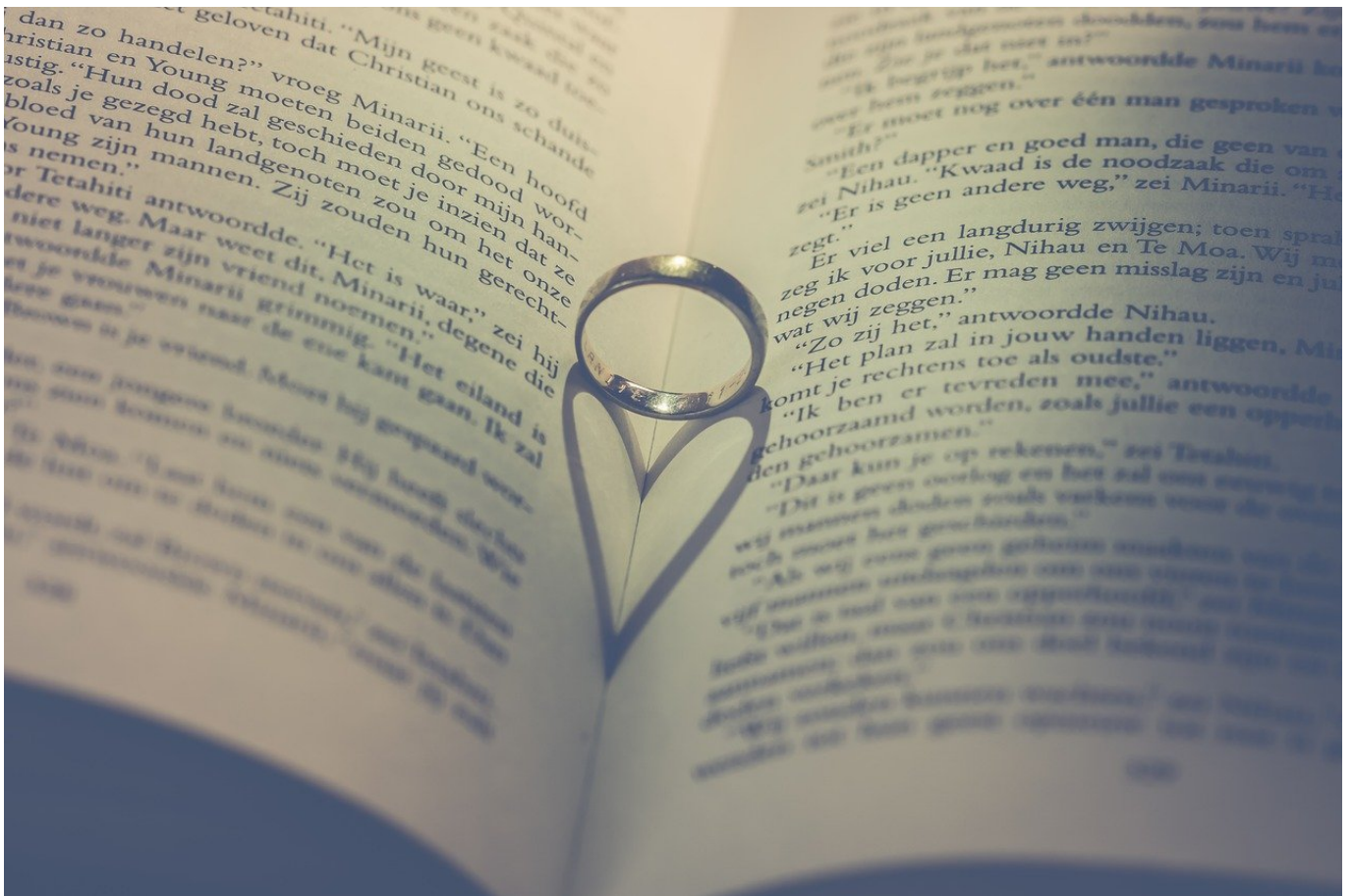
<b>echoing</b>	(of a sound) repeated or reverberating after the original sound has stopped. <i>The sound of <b>echoing</b> footsteps slowed to a stop.</i>
<b>filled</b>	Of purchase orders that have been filled. <i>Theirs was a house <b>filled</b> with laughter.</i>
<b>full</b>	Constituting the full quantity or extent complete. <i>She was <b>full</b> of confidence.</i>
<b>full-bodied</b>	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor.
<b>low</b>	Low or inferior in station or quality. <i>Training will be given <b>low</b> priority.</i>
<b>noisy</b>	Attracting attention by showiness or bright colors. <i>Diesel cars can be very <b>noisy</b>.</i>
<b>orotund</b>	(of a person's voice) resonant and imposing. <i><b>Orotund</b> tones.</i>
<b>piercing</b>	Painful as if caused by a sharp instrument. <i>The <b>piercing</b> cold of winter.</i>
<b>resounding</b>	(of a sound) loud enough to reverberate. <i>A <b>resounding</b> smack across the face.</i>
<b>reverberating</b>	Characterized by resonance.
<b>rich</b>	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>A protein <b>rich</b> diet.</i>
<b>roaring</b>	(of a period of time) characterized by prosperity, optimism, and excitement. <i>Last week s 70s night was a <b>roaring</b> success.</i>
<b>sonorous</b>	Capable of producing a deep or ringing sound. <i>The alloy is <b>sonorous</b> and useful in making bells.</i>
<b>thundering</b>	Making a resounding, loud, deep noise. <i>A <b>thundering</b> success.</i>
<b>thunderous</b>	Relating to or resembling thunder. <i>Robin s <b>thunderous</b> mood hadn t lightened.</i>
<b>tumultuous</b>	Excited, confused, or disorderly. <i>A <b>tumultuous</b> personal life.</i>
<b>vibrant</b>	(of sound) strong or resonating. <i>A <b>vibrant</b> cosmopolitan city.</i>

<a href="#">alarm</a>	Be fitted or protected with an alarm. <i>The government was <b>alarmed</b> by an outbreak of unrest.</i>
<b>bell</b>	The sound of a bell being struck. <i>At five <b>bells</b> in the forenoon of June 11.</i>
<b>call</b>	A direction in a square dance given by the caller. <i>You <b>call</b> he said Heads or tails.</i>
<b>carillon</b>	A tune played on a carillon.
<b>chime</b>	Emit a sound. <i>Bells and gongs <b>chimed</b>.</i>
<a href="#">click</a>	Produce a click. <i>He <b>clicked</b> on the light.</i>
<b>ding</b>	Go ding dong like a bell. <i>Cash registers were <b>dinging</b> softly.</i>

<b>doorbell</b>	A push button at an outer door that gives a ringing or buzzing signal when pushed. <i>Charlotte rang the <b>doorbell</b>.</i>
<b><u>echo</u></b>	Ring or echo with sound. <i>Clarendon whom they reckoned the faithful <b>echo</b> of their master's intentions.</i>
<b><u>hear</u></b>	Examine or hear evidence or a case by judicial process. <i>We must <b>hear</b> the expert before we make a decision.</i>
<b>jingle</b>	A bivalve mollusc with a fragile, slightly translucent shell. <i>The <b>jingle</b> of coins.</i>
<b>knell</b>	Proclaim something by or as if by a knell. <i>Emails and text messages are sounding the <b>knell</b> for the written word.</i>
<b><u>midnight</u></b>	12 o'clock at night; the middle of the night. <i>Young children should not be allowed to stay up until <b>midnight</b>.</i>
<b><u>phone</u></b>	Headphones or earphones. <i>A receptionist answered the <b>phone</b>.</i>
<b>resonance</b>	The power to evoke enduring images, memories, and emotions. <i>The concepts lose their emotional <b>resonance</b>.</i>
<b><u>resonant</u></b>	(of sound) deep, clear, and continuing to sound or reverberate. <i>The sound of these instruments played in a <b>resonant</b> room is unforgettable.</i>
<b>resound</b>	Sing (the praises) of. <i>Horace <b>resounds</b> the praises of Italy.</i>
<b>resounding</b>	Unmistakable; emphatic. <i>A <b>resounding</b> smack across the face.</i>
<b>reverberate</b>	Return or re-echo (a sound). <i>The hall <b>reverberated</b> with laughter.</i>
<b>reverberation</b>	The repetition of a sound resulting from reflection of the sound waves. <i>Electronic effects have been added such as echo and <b>reverberation</b>.</i>
<b>ring</b>	The sound of a bell ringing. <i>A <b>ring</b> of ships in the harbor.</i>
<b><u>siren</u></b>	A woman who is considered to be dangerously seductive. <i>Ambulance <b>sirens</b>.</i>
<b>sonority</b>	Having the character of a loud deep sound; the quality of being resonant. <i>Bee has greater <b>sonority</b> than pin.</i>
<b>sound</b>	Test the lungs or another body cavity by noting the sound they produce. <i>It <b>sounds</b> as though you really do believe that.</i>
