ring	The sound of a bell ringing E A Poe. <i>A diamond ring.</i>
sonority	Having the character of a loud deep sound; the quality of being resonant. <i>Bee has greater sonority than pin.</i>
sonorousness	Having the character of a loud deep sound; the quality of being resonant.
tintinnabulation	The sound of a bell ringing. <i>The tiny tintinnabulation faint as fairy bells.</i>
vibrancy	The state of being full of energy and life. <i>Her eyes seemed to radiate the vibrancy of youth.</i>

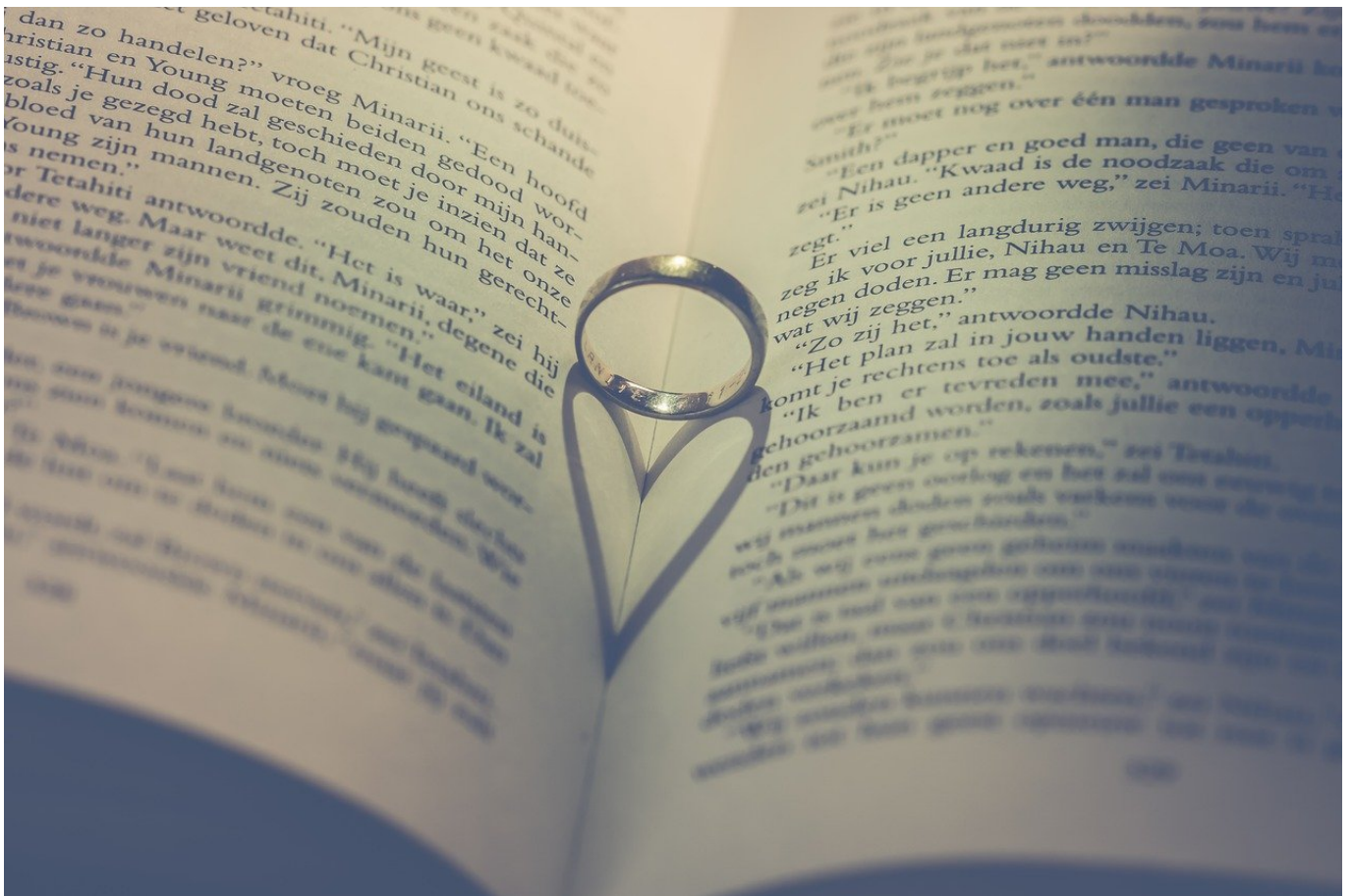
blaring	Unpleasantly loud and penetrating. <i>The blaring noise of trumpets.</i>
blasting	Unpleasantly loud and penetrating. <i>The blasting effects of the intense cold on the budding fruit.</i>
booming	(used of the voice or sound) deep and resonant. <i>A booming kick from the touchline.</i>
clamorous	Conspicuously and offensively loud; given to vehement outcry. <i>A clamorous uproar.</i>
clear	Clear and distinct to the senses easily perceptible. <i>In the morning with a clear head she would tackle all her problems.</i>
deafening	Loud enough to cause (temporary) hearing loss. <i>The music reached a deafening crescendo.</i>
deep	Relatively deep or strong affecting one deeply. <i>Deep cuts in the budget.</i>

echoing	(of a sound) repeated or reverberating after the original sound has stopped. <i>The sound of echoing footsteps slowed to a stop.</i>
filled	Of purchase orders that have been filled. <i>Theirs was a house filled with laughter.</i>
full	Constituting the full quantity or extent complete. <i>She was full of confidence.</i>
full-bodied	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor.
low	Low or inferior in station or quality. <i>Training will be given low priority.</i>
noisy	Attracting attention by showiness or bright colors. <i>Diesel cars can be very noisy.</i>
orotund	(of a person's voice) resonant and imposing. <i>Orotund tones.</i>
piercing	Painful as if caused by a sharp instrument. <i>The piercing cold of winter.</i>
resounding	(of a sound) loud enough to reverberate. <i>A resounding smack across the face.</i>
reverberating	Characterized by resonance.
rich	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>A protein rich diet.</i>
roaring	(of a period of time) characterized by prosperity, optimism, and excitement. <i>Last week s 70s night was a roaring success.</i>
sonorous	Capable of producing a deep or ringing sound. <i>The alloy is sonorous and useful in making bells.</i>
thundering	Making a resounding, loud, deep noise. <i>A thundering success.</i>
thunderous	Relating to or resembling thunder. <i>Robin s thunderous mood hadn t lightened.</i>
tumultuous	Excited, confused, or disorderly. <i>A tumultuous personal life.</i>
vibrant	(of sound) strong or resonating. <i>A vibrant cosmopolitan city.</i>

alarm	Be fitted or protected with an alarm. <i>The government was alarmed by an outbreak of unrest.</i>
bell	The sound of a bell being struck. <i>At five bells in the forenoon of June 11.</i>
call	A direction in a square dance given by the caller. <i>You call he said Heads or tails.</i>
carillon	A tune played on a carillon.
chime	Emit a sound. <i>Bells and gongs chimed.</i>
click	Produce a click. <i>He clicked on the light.</i>
ding	Go ding dong like a bell. <i>Cash registers were dinging softly.</i>

doorbell	A push button at an outer door that gives a ringing or buzzing signal when pushed. <i>Charlotte rang the doorbell.</i>
<u>echo</u>	Ring or echo with sound. <i>Clarendon whom they reckoned the faithful echo of their master's intentions.</i>
<u>hear</u>	Examine or hear evidence or a case by judicial process. <i>We must hear the expert before we make a decision.</i>
jingle	A bivalve mollusc with a fragile, slightly translucent shell. <i>The jingle of coins.</i>
knell	Proclaim something by or as if by a knell. <i>Emails and text messages are sounding the knell for the written word.</i>
<u>midnight</u>	12 o'clock at night; the middle of the night. <i>Young children should not be allowed to stay up until midnight.</i>
<u>phone</u>	Headphones or earphones. <i>A receptionist answered the phone.</i>
resonance	The power to evoke enduring images, memories, and emotions. <i>The concepts lose their emotional resonance.</i>
<u>resonant</u>	(of sound) deep, clear, and continuing to sound or reverberate. <i>The sound of these instruments played in a resonant room is unforgettable.</i>
resound	Sing (the praises) of. <i>Horace resounds the praises of Italy.</i>
resounding	Unmistakable; emphatic. <i>A resounding smack across the face.</i>
reverberate	Return or re-echo (a sound). <i>The hall reverberated with laughter.</i>
reverberation	The repetition of a sound resulting from reflection of the sound waves. <i>Electronic effects have been added such as echo and reverberation.</i>
ring	The sound of a bell ringing. <i>A ring of ships in the harbor.</i>
<u>siren</u>	A woman who is considered to be dangerously seductive. <i>Ambulance sirens.</i>
sonority	Having the character of a loud deep sound; the quality of being resonant. <i>Bee has greater sonority than pin.</i>
sound	Test the lungs or another body cavity by noting the sound they produce. <i>It sounds as though you really do believe that.</i>
