avalanche	Engulf or carry off by an avalanche. <i>We have had an avalanche of applications for the post.</i>
averse	(usually followed by `to') strongly opposed. <i>As a former CIA director he is not averse to secrecy.</i>
challenge	Issue a challenge to. <i>Human challenge studies occur in tightly controlled settings.</i>
danger	A dangerous place. <i>He moved out of danger.</i>
dangerous	Causing fear or anxiety by threatening great harm. <i>Insecticides which are dangerous to the environment.</i>
dare	To be courageous enough to try or do something. <i>She ran across a main road for a dare.</i>
dicey	Unpredictable and potentially dangerous. <i>An extremely dicey future on a brave new world of liquid nitrogen tar and smog.</i>
flammability	The quality of being easily ignited and burning rapidly.
foreseeable	Able to be foreseen or predicted. <i>The situation is unlikely to change in the foreseeable future.</i>
gamble	A risky act or venture. <i>Dad likes a bit of a gamble.</i>
hazard	An unknown and unpredictable phenomenon that causes an event to result one way rather than another. <i>Drinking alcohol is a health hazard.</i>
hazardous	Involving risk or danger. <i>It is hazardous to personal safety.</i>
imminence	The state or fact of being about to happen. <i>The populace was largely unaware of the imminence of war.</i>

<u>insecure</u>	Not firm or fixed; liable to give way or break. <i>Badly paid and insecure jobs.</i>
jeopardy	Danger of loss, harm, or failure. <i>The whole peace process is in jeopardy.</i>
landslide	An overwhelming majority of votes for one party or candidate in an election. <i>Businessmen have been buried under a landslide of paperwork.</i>
neurotoxin	A poison which acts on the nervous system.
parlous	Full of danger or uncertainty; precarious. <i>The General's position was parlous.</i>
peril	Serious and immediate danger. <i>Jonathon perilled his life for love of David.</i>
<u>perilous</u>	Full of danger or risk. <i>A perilous journey south.</i>
perilously	In a dangerous manner. <i>Houses perched perilously on craggy outposts.</i>
<u>pitfall</u>	A trap in the form of a concealed hole. <i>The pitfalls of buying goods at public auctions.</i>
<u>precarious</u>	Fraught with danger. <i>He made a precarious living as a painter.</i>
<u>risky</u>	Not financially safe or secure. <i>Anything that promises to pay too much can't help being risky.</i>
<u>shaky</u>	Unstable because of poor construction or heavy use. <i>A shaky marriage.</i>
threatened	Likely in the near future to become endangered. <i>The spotted owl is a threatened species not yet an endangered one.</i>
<u>toxicity</u>	Grave harmfulness or deadliness. <i>That was how I protected my partner from my family's toxicity.</i>
unsafe	Not safe; dangerous. <i>Drinking water in some areas may be unsafe.</i>
venture	Any venturesome undertaking especially one with an uncertain outcome. <i>May I venture to add a few comments.</i>
volatility	Tendency of a substance to evaporate at normal temperatures. <i>The volatility of the market drove many investors away.</i>
