gamey	Willing to face danger.
gamy	Suggestive of sexual impropriety. A gamy stew of various meats.
juicy	Temporarily appealing. The promise of juicy returns.
naughty	Mildly rude or indecent, typically because related to sex. A naughty wink.
spicy	Flavoured with or fragrant with spice. Spicy jokes and suggestive songs.

dilettante	A person who cultivates an area of interest, such as the arts, without real commitment or knowledge. <i>A wealthy literary dilettante.</i>
flamboyant	Showy tropical tree or shrub native to Madagascar; widely planted in tropical regions for its immense racemes of scarlet and orange flowers; sometimes placed in genus Poinciana. <i>The band s flamboyant lead singer.</i>
frisky	Playful like a lively kitten. <i>He bounds about like a frisky pup.</i>
fun	A source of fun. <i>He became a figure of fun.</i>
grin	Smile broadly. <i>The skull grinned back at him its eye sockets dark and hollow.</i>
incomprehensible	Incapable of being explained or accounted for. <i>The most incomprehensible thing about the universe is that it is comprehensible.</i>
irreverent	Showing a lack of respect for people or things that are generally taken seriously. <i>Irreverent scholars mocking sacred things.</i>
kicking	Lively and exciting. <i>They gave him a good kicking.</i>
lively	Difficult or challenging. <i>A lively tennis ball.</i>
meretricious	Relating to or characteristic of a prostitute. <i>Meretricious souvenirs for the tourist trade.</i>
mischievous	(of an action or statement) causing or intended to cause harm or trouble. <i>Mischievous rumors and falsehoods.</i>

<u>nasty</u>	Damaging or harmful. <i>A nasty trick to pull.</i>
<u>naughty</u>	Wicked. <i>A naughty wink.</i>
<u>playful</u>	Giving or expressing pleasure and amusement. <i>He gave me a playful punch on the arm.</i>
prankster	Someone who plays practical jokes on others.
pretentious	Tawdry or vulgar. <i>The pretentious jargon of wine experts.</i>
puckish	Playful, especially in a mischievous way. <i>A puckish sense of humour.</i>
punishment	The infliction or imposition of a penalty as retribution for an offence. <i>He approved of stiff punishments for criminals.</i>
raffish	Marked by a carefree unconventionality or disreputableness- Crary Moore. <i>A cocktail party given by some raffish bachelors.</i>
<u>rampant</u>	(of a plant) lush in growth; luxuriant. <i>A rich soil soon becomes home to rampant weeds.</i>
ribald	A ribald person someone who uses vulgar and offensive language. <i>Ribald language.</i>
robust	Uncompromising and forceful. <i>The country's political system has continued to be robust in spite of its economic problems.</i>
showy	Marked by ostentation but often tasteless. <i>A cheap showy rhinestone bracelet.</i>
smiling	Smiling with happiness or optimism. <i>It's nice to see everyone's smiling faces.</i>
spank	Give a spanking to subject to a spanking. <i>She was spanked for spilling ink on the carpet.</i>
<u>spirited</u>	Made lively or spirited. <i>A warm hearted generous spirited man.</i>
<u>whimsical</u>	Acting or behaving in a capricious manner. <i>The victim of whimsical persecutions.</i>
