- *A machine capable of carrying out a complex series of actions automatically, especially one programmable by a computer.*



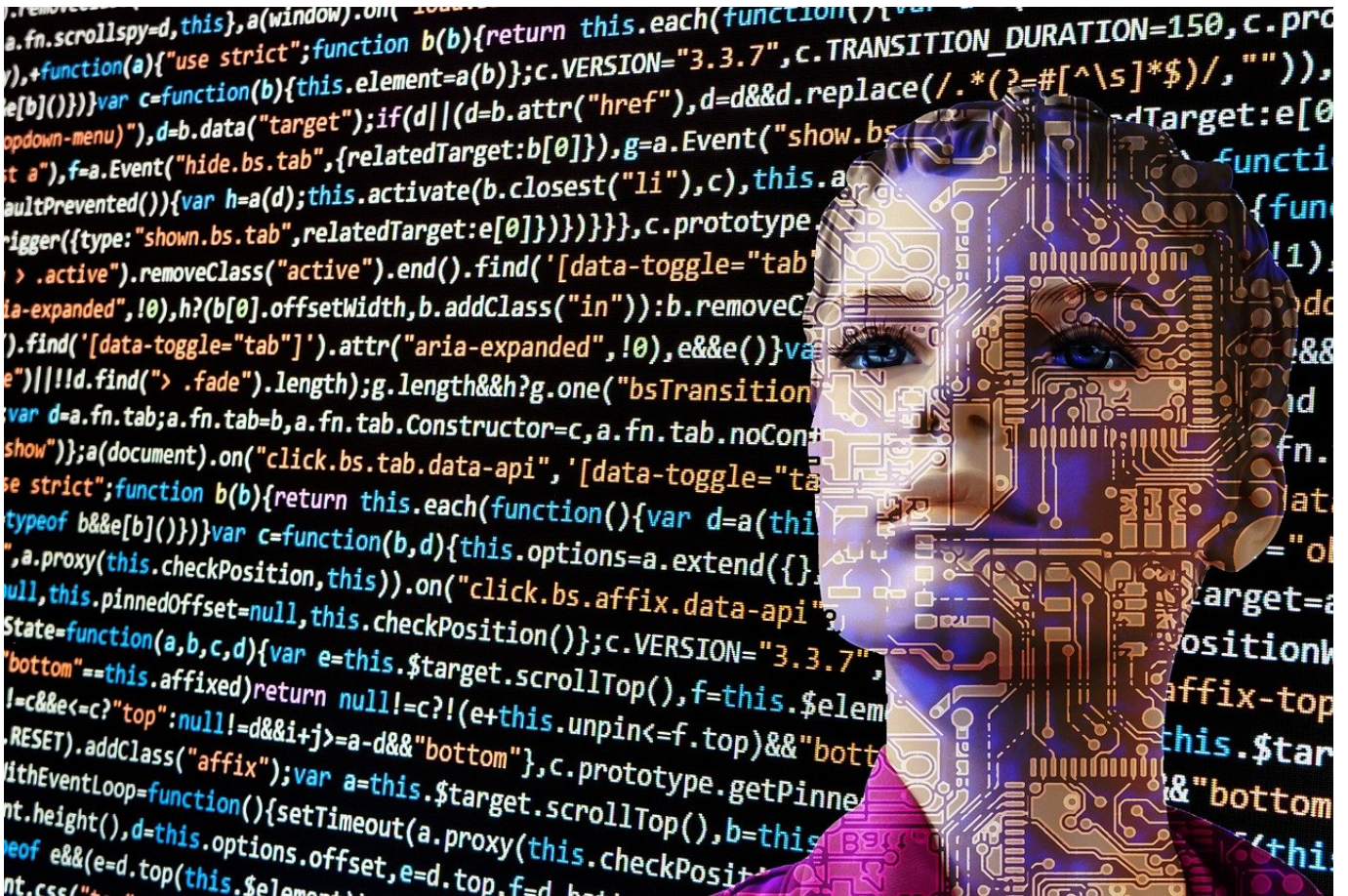
Synonyms of "Robot" as a noun (4 Words)

- machine** A person who acts with the mechanical efficiency of a machine.

| <u>automatic</u> | A mode of operation in which a particular function of a piece of equipment is performed automatically rather than manually. <i>A Mercedes 300SL five speed automatic.</i> |
| automation | The act of implementing the control of equipment with advanced technology; usually involving electronic hardware. <i>The automation of office tasks.</i> |
| automaton | Used in comparisons to refer to a person who seems to act in a mechanical or unemotional way. <i>Like an automaton she walked to the door.</i> |
| calculator | An expert at calculation (or at operating calculating machines). <i>A pocket calculator.</i> |
| commercialization | The process of managing or running something principally for financial gain. <i>The escalating commercialization of athletics.</i> |
| <u>computer</u> | A machine for performing calculations automatically. |
| cyborg | A fictional or hypothetical person whose physical abilities are extended beyond normal human limitations by mechanical elements built into the body. <i>A cyborg is a cybernetic organism.</i> |
| <u>dispenser</u> | A person who prepares medicines in a dispensary. <i>A paper towel dispenser.</i> |
| <u>engineering</u> | A field of study or activity concerned with modification or development in a particular area. <i>He had trouble deciding which branch of engineering to study.</i> |
| imitative | Formed in imitation of a natural sound- Harry Hoijer. <i>The derring do of our film heroes inspired us to imitative feats.</i> |
| inductive | Inducing or influencing; leading on- John Milton. <i>Inductive reasoning.</i> |
| industrial | Relating to or denoting a type of harsh uncompromising rock music incorporating sounds resembling those produced by industrial machinery. <i>Industrial waste.</i> |
| <u>industrialization</u> | The development of industries in a country or region on a wide scale. <i>These developing countries have undergone rapid industrialization.</i> |
| kinematics | The features or properties of motion in an object. |
| machine | Make or operate on with a machine. <i>Comedians are more than just laugh machines.</i> |

| <u>robotic</u> | Of or relating to mechanical robots. <i>His robotic voice.</i> |
| simulated | Reproduced or made to resemble; imitative in character. <i>A purse of simulated alligator hide.</i> |
| synthetic | A synthetic material or chemical especially a textile fibre. <i>Their tears are a bit synthetic.</i> |
| technology | The discipline dealing with the art or science of applying scientific knowledge to practical problems. <i>Advances in computer technology.</i> |
